Z1 Cession delegation and assignment

- Z1.1 The *Supplier* does not cede, delegate or assign any of its rights or obligations to any person without the written consent of the *Purchaser*.
- Z1.2 Notwithstanding the above, the *Purchaser* may on written notice to the *Supplier* cede and delegate its rights and obligations under this contract to any of its subsidiaries or any of its present divisions or operations which may be converted into separate legal entities as a result of the restructuring of the Electricity Supply Industry.

Z2 Joint ventures

- Z2.1 If the *Supplier* constitutes a joint venture, consortium or other unincorporated grouping of two or more persons or organisations then these persons or organisations are deemed to be jointly and severally liable to the *Purchaser* for the performance of this contract.
- Z2.2 Unless already notified to the *Purchaser*, the persons or organisations notify the *Supply Manager* within two weeks of the Contract Date of the key person who has the authority to bind the *Supplier* on their behalf.
- Z2.3 The *Supplier* does not alter the composition of the joint venture, consortium or other unincorporated grouping of two or more persons without the consent of the *Purchaser* having been given to the *Supplier* in writing.

Z3 Change of Broad Based Black Economic Empowerment (B-BBEE) status

- Z3.1 Where a change in the Supplier's legal status, ownership or any other change to his business composition or business dealings results in a change to the Supplier's B-BBEE status, the Supplier notifies the Purchaser within seven days of the change.
- Z3.2 The Supplier is required to submit an updated verification certificate and necessary supporting documentation confirming the change in his B-BBEE status to the Supply Manager within thirty days of the notification or as otherwise instructed by the Supply Manager.
- Z3.3 Where, as a result, the Supplier's B-BBEE status has decreased since the Contract Date the Purchaser may either re-negotiate this contract or alternatively, terminate the Supplier's obligation to Provide the Goods and Services.

Z3.4 Failure by the *Supplier* to notify the *Purchaser* of a change in its B-BBEE status may constitute a reason for termination. If the *Purchaser* terminates in terms of this clause, the procedures on termination are P1, P2 and P3 as stated in clause 92, and the amount due is A1 and A3 as stated in clause 93.

Z4 Confidentiality

- Z4.1 The Supplier does not disclose or make any information arising from or in connection with this contract available to Others. This undertaking does not, however, apply to information which at the time of disclosure or thereafter, without default on the part of the Supplier, enters the public domain or to information which was already in the possession of the Supplier at the time of disclosure (evidenced by written records in existence at that time). Should the Supplier disclose information to Others in terms of clause 23.1, the Supplier ensures that the provisions of this clause are complied with by the recipient.
- Z4.2 If the Supplier is uncertain about whether any such information is confidential, it is to be regarded as such until notified otherwise by the Supply Manager.
- Z4.3 In the event that the Supplier is, at any time, required by law to disclose any such information which is required to be kept confidential, the Supplier, to the extent permitted by law prior to disclosure, notifies the Purchaser so that an appropriate protection order and/or any other action can be taken if possible, prior to any disclosure. In the event that such protective order is not, or cannot, be obtained, then the Supplier may disclose that portion of the information which it is required to be disclosed by law and uses reasonable efforts to obtain assurances that confidential treatment will be afforded to the information so disclosed.
- Z4.4 The taking of images (whether photographs, video footage or otherwise) of the *goods* or any portion thereof, in the course of Providing the Goods and Services and after Delivery, requires the prior written consent of the *Supply Manager*. All rights in and to all such images vests exclusively in the *Purchaser*.
- Z4.5 The Supplier ensures that all his subcontractors abide by the undertakings in this clause.

Z5 Waiver and estoppel: Add to core clause 12.3:

Z5.1 Any extension, concession, waiver or relaxation of any action stated in this contract by the Parties, the *Supply Manager* or the *Adjudicator* does not constitute a waiver of rights, and does not give rise to an estoppel unless the Parties agree otherwise and confirm such agreement in writing.

Z6 Health, safety and the environment: Add to core clause 25.4

Z6.1 The Supplier undertakes to take all reasonable precautions to maintain the health and safety of persons in and about the provision of the goods and execution of the services.

Without limitation the Supplier.

- warrants that the total of the Prices as at the Contract Date includes a sufficient amount for
 proper compliance with all applicable health & safety laws and regulations and the health
 and safety rules, guidelines and procedures provided for in this contract and generally for
 the proper maintenance of health & safety in and about the execution of supply and

- Z6.2 The Supplier, in and about the execution of the supply, complies with all applicable

environmental laws and regulations and rules, guidelines and procedures otherwise provided for under this contract and ensures that his Subcontractors, employees and others under the *Supplier's* direction and control, likewise observe and comply with the foregoing.

Z7 Provision of a Tax Invoice and interest. Add to core clause 51

- Z7.1 Within one week of receiving a payment certificate from the *Supply Manager* in terms of core clause 51.1, the *Supplier* provides the *Purchaser* with a tax invoice in accordance with the *Purchaser*'s procedures stated in the Goods Information, showing the amount due for payment equal to that stated in the payment certificate.
- Z7.2 If the Supplier does not provide a tax invoice in the form and by the time required by this contract, the time by when the Purchaser is to make a payment is extended by a period equal in time to the delayed submission of the correct tax invoice. Interest due by the Purchaser in terms of core clause 51.2 is then calculated from the delayed date by when payment is to be made.
- Z7.3 The Supplier (if registered in South Africa in terms of the companies Act) is required to comply with the requirements of the Value Added Tax Act, no 89 of 1991 (as amended) and to include the Purchaser's VAT number 4740101508 on each invoice he submits for payment.

Z8 Notifying compensation events

Z8.1 Delete from the last sentence in core clause 61.3 the words, "unless the event arises from the Supply Manager giving an instruction, changing an earlier decision or correcting an assumption".

Z9 Purchaser's limitation of liability

- Z9.1 The *Purchaser's* liability to the *Supplier* for the *Supplier's* indirect or consequential loss is limited to R0.00 (zero Rand)
- Z9.2 The Supplier's entitlement under the indemnity in 83.1 is provided for in 60.1(12) and the Purchaser's liability under the indemnity is limited.

Z10 Termination: Add to core clause 91.1, at the second main bullet point, fourth sub-bullet point, after the words "against it":

Z10.1 or had a business rescue order granted against it.

Z11 Addition to secondary Option X7 Delay damages (if applicable in this contract)

Z11.1 If the amount due for the Supplier's payment of delay damages reaches the limits stated in this Contract Data for Option X7, the Purchaser may terminate the Supplier's obligation to Provide the Goods and Services using the same procedures and payment on termination as those applied for reasons R1 to R15 or R18 stated in the Termination Table.

Z12 Ethics

For the purposes of this Z-clause, the following definitions apply:

Affected Party means, as the context requires, any party, irrespective of whether it is the *Supplier* or a third party, such party's employees, agents, or Subcontractors or Subcontractor's

employees, or any one or more of all of these parties' relatives or friends,

Coercive Action means to harm or threaten to harm, directly or indirectly, an Affected Party or the property of an Affected Party, or to otherwise influence or attempt to influence an Affected Party to act unlawfully or illegally,

Collusive Action means where two or more parties co-operate to achieve an unlawful or illegal purpose, including to influence an Affected Party to act unlawfully or illegally,

Committing Party means, as the context requires, the *Supplier*, or any member thereof in the case of a joint venture, or its employees, agents, or Subcontractors or the Subcontractor's employees,

Corrupt Action

means the offering, giving, taking, or soliciting, directly or indirectly, of a good or service to unlawfully or illegally influence the actions of an Affected Party,

Fraudulent Action means any unlawfully or illegally intentional act or omission that misleads, or attempts to mislead, an Affected Party, in order to obtain a financial or other benefit or to avoid an obligation or incurring an obligation,

Obstructive Action

means a Committing Party unlawfully or illegally destroying, falsifying, altering or concealing information or making false statements to materially impede an investigation into allegations of Prohibited Action, and

Prohibited Action

means any one or more of a Coercive Action, Collusive Action Corrupt Action, Fraudulent Action or Obstructive Action.

- Z12.1 A Committing Party may not take any Prohibited Action during the course of the procurement of this contract or in execution thereof.
- Z12.2 The *Purchaser* may terminate the *Supplier*'s obligation to Provide the Services if a Committing Party has taken such Prohibited Action and the *Supplier* did not take timely and appropriate action to prevent or remedy the situation, without limiting any other rights or remedies the *Purchaser* has. It is not required that the Committing Party had to have been found guilty, in court or in any other similar process, of such Prohibited Action before the *Purchaser* can terminate the *Supplier*'s obligation to Provide the Services for this reason.
- Z12.3 If the *Purchaser* terminates the *Supplier's* obligation to Provide the Services for this reason, the amounts due on termination are those intended in core clauses 92.1 and 92.2.
- Z12.4 A Committing Party co-operates fully with any investigation pursuant to alleged Prohibited Action. Where the *Purchaser* does not have a contractual bond with the Committing Party, the *Supplier* ensures that the Committing Party co-operates fully with an investigation.

Z14 Nuclear Liability

- Z14.3 Subject to clause Z14.4 below, the *Purchaser* waives all rights of recourse, arising from the aforesaid, save to the extent that any claims arise or liability is incurred due or attributable to the unlawful intent of the *Supplier* or any other person, or the presence of the *Supplier* or that person or any property of the *Supplier* or such person at or in the KNPS or on the KNPS site, without the permission of the *Purchaser* or of a person acting on behalf of the *Purchaser*.
- Z14.4 The *Purchaser* does not waive its rights provided for in section 30 (7) of Act 44 of 1999, or any replacement section dealing with the same subject matter.
- Z14.5 The protection afforded by the provisions hereof shall be in effect until the KNPS is decommissioned.

Specification and description of the goods

1. Introduction

The Essential Power Supplies Plant provides critical supply to the protection equipment and other plant essentials to ensure plant supply availability, reliability, integrity and personnel safety. AC and DC Essential power supplies are required to be available at all times. AC backup is provided by Uninterruptible Power Supplies while DC backup is provided by batteries through battery Chargers and/or AC/DC converters supplied from the UPS. Batteries connected to the UPS and Chargers are designed to provide power storage for the required back-up period. The Essential Power supply design allows for power supply redundancy, supply failure backup, automatic changeover of AC Supplies as well as local and remote indication of alarms.

If normal power supply is lost, the supplies must be designed to allow safe shutdown of the plant, maintain communication, plant control and instrumentation, and protection systems. Provide emergency lighting and keep the plant in a suitable state of readiness for a period of time in accordance to the Generation standard 240-56176852. Furthermore, the essential supplies prevent critical instrumentation from tripping for short breaks or voltage dips in normal power supplies.

For the plant to operate effectively and efficiently, maintenance must be performed at intervals specified as per plant maintenance strategies. Correct plant spares must be available. The identification of which specific components to be kept as spares as well as the quantities has been done according to the information available at the time of the compilation of this document.

The required information for spares holding has not been adequately detailed enough to enable the full cataloguing of the identified spares into the SAP computer data base. This creates challenges to the current and future procurement processes and may lead to costly delivery of wrongly specified equipment. The works information processes outlined in this document are intended to eliminate or minimize the risk of such occurrences.

Some of the equipment supplied requires specialist skills to troubleshoot or repair once failure has occurred. Therefore there is a need for a service contract with competent supplier who will assist with condition monitoring, repairs and commissioning of these systems. These services will only be utilized on ad hoc basis and only for those instances where the skills are not available within the organization (Eskom).

2. Supporting Clauses

2.1 Scope

The Works Information specifies the required spares, DCF's information and the expected minimum and maximum quantities of spares to be supplied by the contractor during the contract period. The scope also includes technical support services (condition monitoring, repairs and commissioning) required and conditions for acceptance. The scope included here does not substitute nor supersede Eskom's procurement procedures that will be followed during the procurement process.
