**REQUEST FOR QUOTATIONS FOR
BBBEE COMMITTEE TRAINING**

1. Purpose

- 1.1. The Railway Safety Regulator (RSR) requires the services of a suitable service provider to provide BBEE committee training.

2. Considerations/background

- 2.1. The RSR is committed to driving meaningful transformation and maintaining compliance with the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment (B-BBEE) Act and its associated Codes of Good Practice.
- 2.2. In support of this objective, we have established a dedicated B-BBEE Committee tasked with overseeing, guiding, and monitoring the implementation of B-BBEE strategies across the organization.
- 2.3. To ensure that Committee Members are fully equipped to carry out their responsibilities effectively, we require specialized training that provides in-depth knowledge of the B-BBEE framework, sector-specific requirements, and practical implementation mechanisms
- 2.4. This training should enable members to interpret and apply B-BBEE principles strategically, monitor compliance, and contribute to informed decision-making that supports our transformation goals.

3. Scope of work / Specification

Specifications are as follows:-

- The appointed service provider will be expected to design and deliver a customized B-BBEE training program specifically for members of the B-BBEE Committee. The

training must provide both strategic and operational insights, enabling members to effectively guide and oversee B-BBEE implementation within the organization. The program should address:

1. A comprehensive overview of the B-BBEE Act, Codes of Good Practice, and sector-specific codes
2. The strategic role and responsibilities of a B-BBEE Committee
3. Governance and oversight best practices related to transformation
4. Interpretation and application of B-BBEE scorecard elements:
 - Ownership
 - Management Control
 - Skills Development
 - Enterprise and Supplier Development
 - Socio-Economic Development
5. Drafting of the implementation strategies (An annual implementation/action plan)
6. Monitoring, evaluation, and reporting mechanisms
7. Understanding verification requirements and audit processes
8. Training should be delivered to 15 members of the RSR, and will in-person, with an emphasis on interactivity, applied learning, and strategic decision-making

DELIVERABLES

The selected provider will be required to deliver the following:

1. A tailored training agenda and content aligned to committee functions
2. Facilitation of the full training workshop
3. Pre-reading material and/or preparatory documents
4. Copies of all training materials used (slides, handouts, etc.)
5. Attendance register
6. Final report with key takeaways and recommendations for ongoing capacity-building
7. Certificates of attendance

SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Service providers must submit the following:

1. A detailed quotation including:
 - Professional fees
 - Materials and preparation costs
 - Travel (if applicable)
 - VAT (if registered)

2. Proof of registration with a recognised training or professional body

4. Administrative / Compliance Requirements

- 4.1. Registration on National Treasury CSD report
- 4.2. Comprehensive quotation (prices must be VAT Inclusive)
- 4.3. Tax Pin & Tax clearance certificate
- 4.4. Fully Completed and signed Standard Bidding Documents (SBD) forms documents
- 4.5. A valid BBBEE certificate or sworn affidavit (on sworn affidavit indicate the day, month and year of the financial year period ie, 31 March 2022)
- 4.6. Valid company registration documentation that are issued by Companies & Intellectual Property Commission (CIPC)
- 4.7. A Copy of the identity document of the company owner(s)
- 4.8. Valid Medical Certificate
- 4.9. Valid South African Social Security Agency (SASSA) registration **(Where applicable)**
- 4.10. Valid National Council for Persons with Physical Disability in South Africa registration (NCPDOSA)

Failure to submit valid documents listed above (No - 4.5, 4.6, 4.7, 4.8, 4.9, 4.10) for proof of claim specific goals as stipulated in Section 6 below will lead to the service provider not being awarded points for specific goal.

5. Evaluation 80/20 Preference Point System

- 5.1. The price quotations will be evaluated in accordance with the pre-scripts of the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act (PPPFA) and its regulations, in particular Preference Procurement Regulation 2022 which stipulate **80/20 preference point system for acquisition of goods or services with Rand value equal to or below R50 million (inclusive of all applicable tax).**
- 5.2. **A maximum of 80 points for price and 20 points for the specific goal specified on the request for quotation may be awarded to a Service Provider.**
- 5.3. **Points for the specific goal will be awarded as specified on the table below:**
