2. BACKGROUND

SABC Limited is a public organization and State Owned Entity (SOE). It is a national broadcaster and delivers via four television channels as well as eighteen radio stations. The SABC head office is based in Auckland Park, Johannesburg, with provincial offices in South Africa.

#issaVibe is SABC1's pre-party offering for Friday pre-prime slot, this entry to the weekend for this platform is a critical mandate delivery and drives high demand for quality aesthetic for its loyal viewers. #issaVibe Season 1 premiered in the top 10 most watched shows throughout its first season, while its repeats continue to enjoy a slot in the top 20 shows in the country across the broadcast landscape. It is this high performing content replica that is required for season 2.

Purpose

The purpose of this RFQ is to only procure the services of a Facilities Provider to provide facilities, equipment, operators, technicians and engineers, including post production and packaging for broadcast of a 23' x 26 eps series. The editorial and creative scripting and production execution will rest with SABC internally.

3. REQUIREMENTS AND SCOPE OF SERVICES

SABC is seeking a service provider who will provide the following facilities for the production of 26 X 23 minute episodes for a music entertainment show. #issavibe S2

STUDIO:

- Fully equipped studio with a 360 degree set (made up of a wall to wall screen , DJ set and props.
- Props may be required from time to time, to encapsulate elements for performances related to themed days i.e. Festive season / holidays and a New Year's Eve mega party bash.
- Studio cameras x6 (including jib & gimbals)
- Sound recording (for DJ sets and Performances)
- Lighting (including stage lighting and Intelligent lighting as per treatment requirement)

- In studio full surround screen to make up the core treatment of the performance, as all performers will incorporate the music video to play on the screen as performance is filmed on set.
- Comms equipment for studio crew (10 people x 15 shoot days)
- Live DJ musical performance the DJ set is a critical part of the treatment as the format concludes with a DJ set playing out the show.
- Note "BTS" will be filmed around the studio space e.g. arrivals, rehearsals, and diary cam shoots. Therefore, we require spaces around the studio that is both functional and aesthetically pleasing, with ease of access to artists who are arriving for the shoot.

Studio geared with technical equipment capable of delivering 1920 x 1080i HD Standard in a 16:9 aspect ratio at 25 frames per second with a Digital Audio Reference level as 18dB below the maximum coding value (-18dBFS) as per EBU recommended practice R128.

Location / BTS

- Single cam shoot (note additional to the 6 cameras requested). Fully equipped Sony A7 ENG camera and audio kit (or similar). Including sound and camera operators.
- Studio shoots BTS (behind the scenes) with visually appealing locations in and around the studio to compliment the actual performances in studio.

TECHNICIANS/OPERATORS

Camera Operators:

- must live to tape performances as required by the treatment.
- must demonstrate an agility to capture the nuance of music genre performances and youthful culture, as stipulated in the treatment and editorial of a youthful brand concept.
- Studio & BTS shoots camera operator must capture interview on-the-fly / VOXPOPS style in keeping with the treatment, capturing elements that provide the viewer the "fly-on-the wall experience, as the viewer is immersed in the BTS world.

Sound Technician/Operators:

- Sound operators must have experience to capture the live-to-tape performances as required by the treatment.
- Sound operators must also have an agility to capture the nuance of music genre performances and youthful culture, as stipulated in the treatment and editorial of a youthful brand concept, as music is the fundamental treatment, the sound recordist must enhance this element.
- Studio & BTS sound recording must provide the required support to ensure the footage captured is enhanced by a matching audio recording.
- Final mix operator to ensure the audio is mixed according to the treatment of the concept and ensuring that M&E tracks are provided on delivery of packaged episodes.

Lighting Technician/Operators:

- Lighting operators must have experience in enhance the look & feel of the show
- Intelligent lighting operators to ensure that the music performances are synchronised to enhance the performances as required by the treatment.
- Lighting operators must have an agility to capture the nuance of music genre performances and youthful culture, as stipulated in the treatment and editorial of a youthful brand concept.
- Studio & BTS shoots, lighting operator must have an ability to capture and set the tone for the interview, in keeping with the treatment, and ensuring the right tempo is maintained as the viewer is immersed in the BTS world.

POST PRODUCTION FACILITIES

- Editing (online and offline suites & operators): for 26 episodes of 23 minutes
- Final Cut Pro X ver. 10.3.4 or similar, capable of delivering 1920 x 1080i HD Standard in a 16:9 aspect ratio at 25 frames per second with a Digital Audio Reference level as 18dB below the maximum coding value (-18dBFS) as per EBU recommended practice R128.

Editors:

- Off-line Editor –must have experience in capturing live to tape music shows for a youthful music culture show. The fundamental elements for editing a timeline of this show must incorporate the pace and aesthetic of this culture and music genre.
- Online Editor must have experience in online editing and be familiar with the style
 and genre of a youthful music show, and the specific requirements for grading and
 packaging to enhance the studio recording.

10.3 ADJUDICATION USING A POINT SYSTEM

> The bidder obtaining the highest number of total points will be awarded the contract.

- ➤ Preference points shall be calculated after process has been brought to a comparative basis taking into account all factors of non-firm prices.
- > Should two or more bids be equal in all respects, the award shall be decided by the drawing of lots.

10.4 Objective Criteria

- The SABC reserves the right not to award this tender to any bidder based on the proven poor record of accomplishment of the bidder in previous projects within the SABC.
- > The SABC will not award contract/s to the bidders who are blacklisted or have committed other acts of fraud and misrepresentation of facts e.g., tax compliance, company financials, etc. will be eliminated from the bid process.
- > The SABC reserve the right not to award this tender to any bidder who fails the financial stability assessment.
- ➤ No SABC former employees shall be awarded contracts with the SABC within 24 months after termination of employment with the SABC.
- > Should employees resign or retire from the employment of the SABC and become directors of other businesses tendering with the SABC, such tender shall not be considered until the cooling off period of 24 (twenty-four) months has expired.
- > Should the employee be dismissed from the SABC employment, such employee shall be prohibited from conducting business with SABC for a period of 5 (five) years from the date of dismissal.
- > Should the employee be found guilty in a court of law due to criminal conduct/act, such employee will not be considered to do/conduct business with SABC, until the criminal record has been legally expunged.

- > Should the Board member be found guilty in a court of law due to criminal conduct/act, such Board member will not be considered to do/conduct business with SABC, until the criminal record has been legally expunged.
- ➤ The SABC shall not procure any goods, services, works or Content from any independent contractor or independent contractor owned business, to ensure that suppliers competing for the SABC's business have confidence in the integrity of SABC's selection process.
- ➤ Should the Independent Contractor no longer be contracted to the SABC but become directors of other companies, the SABC shall not conduct business with those companies until the cooling-off period of 24 (twenty-four) months has expired.
- > Should the Independent Contract be found guilty in a court of law due to criminal conduct/act, such employee will not be considered to do/conduct business with SABC, until the criminal record has been legally expunged.

11. COMMUNICATION

Respondents are warned that a response will be disqualified should any attempt be made by a tenderer either directly or indirectly to canvass any officer(s) or employees of SABC in respect of a tender, between the closing date and the date of the award of the business.

All enquiries relating to this RFQ should be emailed three days before the closing date.

12. CONDITIONS TO BE OBSERVED WHEN TENDERING

- The Corporation does not bind itself to accept the lowest or any tender, nor shall it be responsible for or pay any expenses or losses which may be incurred by the Tenderer in the preparation and delivery of his tender. The Corporation reserves the right to accept a separate tender or separate tenders for any one or more of the sections of a specification. The corporation also reserves the right to withdraw the tender at any stage.
- No tender shall be deemed to have been accepted unless or until a formal contract / letter of award is signed by both parties.

The Corporation reserves the right to:

- Not evaluate and award submissions that do not comply with this tender document.
- Make a selection solely on the information received in the submissions
- ➤ Enter into negotiations with any one or more of preferred bidder(s) based on the criteria specified in the evaluation of this tender.
- Contact any bidder during the evaluation process, in order to clarify any information, without informing any other bidders. During the evaluation process, no change in the content of the RFQ shall be sought, offered or permitted.
- Award a contract to one or more bidder(s).
- Accept any tender in part or full at its own discretion.
- Cancel this RFQ or any part thereof at any time.
- Should a bidder(s) be selected for further negotiations, they will be chosen on the basis of the
 greatest benefit to the Corporation and not necessarily on the basis of the lowest costs, aligned
 to the BEE & Price.

13. Cost of Bidding

The Tenderer shall bear all costs and expenses associated with preparation and submission of its tender or RFQ, and the Corporation shall under any circumstances be responsible or liable for any

such costs, regardless of, without limitation, the outcome of the bidding, evaluation, and selection process.

14. PAYMENT TERMS

SABC will effect payment sixty (60) days after the service provider has rendered the service and submitted an invoice / statement.

 - iii) In the event of a contract being awarded as a result of points claimed as shown in paragraphs 1.4 and 4.2, the contractor may be required to furnish documentary proof to the satisfaction of the organ of state that the claims are correct;
 - iv) If the specific goals have been claimed or obtained on a fraudulent basis or any of the conditions of contract have not been fulfilled, the organ of state may, in addition to any other remedy it may have
 - (a) disqualify the person from the tendering process;
 - (b) recover costs, losses, or damages it has incurred or suffered as a result of that person's conduct;
 - (c) cancel the contract and claim any damages which it has suffered as a result of having to make less favourable arrangements due to such cancellation.
 - (d) recommend that the tenderer or contractor, its shareholders, and directors, or only the shareholders and directors who acted on a fraudulent basis, be

restricted from obtaining business from any organ of state for a period not exceeding 10 years, after the *audi alteram partem* (hear the other side) rule has been applied; and

(e) forward the matter for criminal prosecution, if deemed necessary.

- 1.2 A trust, consortium or joint venture will qualify for points for their B-BBEE status level as an unincorporated entity, provided that the entity submits their consolidated B-BBEE scorecard as if they were a group structure and that such a consolidated B-BBEE scorecard is prepared for every separate tender.

3.3 SUB-CONTRACTING

- 2.1 A person awarded a contract may only enter into a subcontracting arrangement with the approval of the organ of state.
- 2.2 A person awarded a contract in relation to a designated sector, may not subcontract in such a manner that the local production and content of the overall value of the contract is reduced to below the stipulated minimum threshold.
