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1. BACKGROUND

The Tshwane Automotive Special Economic Zone (TASEZ) is co-owned by the Department of Trade, Industry and Competition (the DTIC), the Gauteng Provincial Government (GPG) and the City of Tshwane Municipality (CoT).

TASEZ is registered in terms of the Companies Act No 71 of 2008 and it is the Operator of the Tshwane Automotive Special Economic Zone in terms of the Special Economic Zones Act 16 of 2014. TASEZ is situated in the east of Pretoria City in Silverton. It aims to offer a diversity of appropriate land uses and other economic activities.

This request seeks approval to initiate the procurement process for seeking a prospective bidder to manage waste collection services within the Tshwane Automotive Special Economic Zone (TASEZ) for a period of twelve months (12), with the objective of ensuring consistent, efficient, and environmentally compliant waste management throughout the duration of the contract.

2. INIVITATION TO SUBMIT A QUOTATION

Provision of waste management services for a period of twelve months to Tshwane Automotive Special Economic Zone (TASEZ).

3. SCOPE OF WORK

3.1. General Requirements

- 3.1.1. Zone operations seeks to appoint a suitable service provider for Placing, collection, transportation, and disposal of general (non-hazardous) waste from designated facilities. The objective is to ensure efficient, clean, and compliant waste management in accordance with applicable environmental regulations and operational standards.
 - 3.1.1.1. Management of non-recyclable waste material, general(non-hazardous) waste on site.
 - 3.1.1.2. Provide and Position skip bins at designated waste collection points throughout the TASEZ facilities.
 - 3.1.1.3. Provision of personnel necessary to execute the services required under this contract.

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3.1.1.4. Conduct training and awareness to TASEZ employees and other relevant stakeholders on waste management, as and when required.

- 3.1.1.5. Provide adequate vehicles and equipment to fulfil the requirements of this service.
- 3.1.1.6. Provide a total of **fifteen (15) 6m3 skip bins** marked as "General Waste" that will be permanently placed on site during the contract period at TASEZ waste sorting stations.
- 3.1.1.7. Collection of full skip bins according to the agreed schedule, transport and offload the waste at an approved disposal site and return the empty skip bins to the original location within 24 hours of collection.

3.2. Reporting and Documentation

3.2.1.1. The bidder shall be expected to provide monthly Waste Reports: Include total waste collected.

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- 3.2.1.2. The bidder shall be expected to provide monthly Incident Reports: Submit reports for any spills, safety incidents, or complaints.
- 3.2.1.3. The bidder shall be expected to provide the Manifest Logs from dumping site after every collection: For hazardous waste (if applicable), maintain proper documentation and tracking.

3.3. Communication and Supervision

- 3.3.1.1. Contractor must designate a site supervisor as the point of contact.
- 3.3.1.2. Attend quarterly performance review meetings with TASEZ.
- 3.3.1.3. Respond to service requests or complaints within 24 hours.

3.4. Transportation and Disposal

- 3.4.1.1. Waste must be transported in covered, leakproof vehicles.
- 3.4.1.2. Disposal must be conducted at licensed landfills or waste transfer stations in compliance with all applicable laws and regulations.
- 3.4.1.3. All vehicles to be utilised under this contract must be licensed accordingly.

4. CONTACT AND COMMUNICATION

- 4.1. All communication and enquiries shall be **in writing** (via email), to the following email address, <u>rfqs-rfps@tasez.co.za</u>. TASEZ will communicate with all Bidders where clarity regarding this RFQ is sought.
- 4.2. Clarification questions from bidders will be closed two (2) days before date of closure on the RFQ.
- 4.3. Any communication to an official in respect of the RFQ between the closing date and the award of the contract by the Bidders is prohibited.
- 4.4. If a Bidders finds or reasonably believes it has found any discrepancy, ambiguity, error or inconsistency in this RFQ or any other information provided by TASEZ (other than minor clerical matters), the Bidders must promptly notify TASEZ in writing of such discrepancy, ambiguity, error or inconsistency in order to afford TASEZ an opportunity to consider what corrective action is necessary (if any).

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4.5. Any actual discrepancy, ambiguity, error, or inconsistency in the RFQ or any other information provided by TASEZ will, if possible, be corrected and provided to all Bidders without attribution to the Bidders who provided the written notice.

4.6. All persons (including Bidders) obtaining or receiving the RFQ and any other information in connection with the RFQ must keep the contents of the RFQ and other such information confidential and not disclose or use the information except as required for the purpose of developing a response to the RFQ.

5. LATE SUBMISSION

5.1. Late responses to the RFQ will not be accepted.

5.2. All dates and times in this RFQs are in accordance to the South African standard calendar and time.

- 5.3. Any time or date in this RFQ is subject to change at TASEZ's discretion. The establishment of a time or date in this RFQ does not create an obligation on the part of TASEZ to take any action or create any right in any way for any Bidders to demand that any action be taken on the date established.
- 5.4. The Bidders accepts that, if TASEZ extends the deadline for the RFQ submission (the closing date) for any reason, the requirements of this RFQ otherwise apply equally to the extended deadline

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allocation that will be used for the evaluation of the bids. Bidder are required to achieve a minimum of **70 points** out of **100 points** to proceed to **Stage 4** (Price and B-BBEE).

This Standard Bidding Document (SBD) must form part of all bids invited. It contains general information and serves as a declaration form for local content (local production and local content are used interchangeably).
