### **T1.1.3: NOTES TO TENDERERS**

These “**Notes to Tenderers**” are intended to provide guidance to Tenderers regarding tendering obligations and requirements. Compliance requirements are stated in the relevant parts of the **Tender Data (T1.2)**.

#### **eThekwini Supply Chain Management Policy (SCMP)**

The requirements as stated in the Employer’s SCM Policy include, but are not limited to, the following:

##### **1) Clause 14(4): ETM Supplier Database**

The eThekwini Supply Chain Management Policy requires suppliers/ service providers/ contractors to be registered on the eThekwini Municipality’s Supplier Database (Vendor Portal).

In the event of the Tenderer not being registered on the eThekwini Municipality’s Supplier Portal, the Tenderer must register on the internet at [www.durban.gov.za](http://www.durban.gov.za) by following these links:

- Accredited Supplier and Contractor’s Database.

The following is to be noted:

- The information for registration as in the possession of the eThekwini Municipality will apply.

##### **2) Clause 20(1)(d)(i): Audited Financial Statements**

Audited Financial Statements (prepared for auditing) are required to be submitted if the value of the tender offer exceeds R10 million (incl VAT).

##### **3) Clause 20(1)(d)(iii): Contracts Awarded during the past 5 Years**

Tenderers are to include with their submission a listing of any contracts awarded to the Tenderer during the past 5 years, including particulars of any material non-compliance or dispute concerning the execution of the contracts. Tenderers are referred to **Returnable Form T2.2.3**.

##### **4) Clause 20(1)(d)(ii), Clause 28(1)(c) and Clause 29(10): Municipal Fees**

Tenderers are to refer to **Returnable Form T2.2.12: “Declaration of Municipal Fees”**, to certify that they have no undisputed commitments for municipal services towards any municipality. Prior to an award, a Tenderer’s municipal rates and taxes cannot be in arrears. Should a Tenderer be in arrears with respect to municipal services and has formalised an agreement with the respective municipality to offset the arrears, the agreement must be in place at time of tender closing.

##### **5) Clause 28(2)(d), Clause 28(2)(h) and Clause 29(12): Certifications and Registrations**

CIDB Registration and Status, B-BBEE Certificates, and Tax Compliance Status PINs must be valid at tender closing, and before final award.

The Tenderer’s Tax Compliance Status, CIDB Registration and Status (if required), and B-BBEE Level Status (if required), will be verified using the National Treasury Central Supplier Database (CSD). Tenderers are referred to **Returnable Form T2.2.1**.

It is the Tenderer’s responsibility to ensure that their data on the CSD is kept updated and correctly reflects the status of the tendering entity.

**6) Clause 28(1)(e): Joint Ventures (JV)**

Each party of a JV must submit separate Tax Compliance Status PINs.

Also, and unless otherwise stated, the requirements for a single entity submission in terms of documentation requirements, will apply to each member of a JV making a submission.

## F.2: TENDERER'S OBLIGATIONS

#### F.2.1 Eligibility:

Entities may only submit one (1) tender offer, either as a single tendering entity or as a partner of a joint venture. Should a tendering entity submit more than one (1) tender, **all** submissions by that tendering entity, including submissions where the entity is a partner of a joint venture, will be deemed not to be eligible.

##### F.2.1.1 Eligibility: General

A Tenderer will not be eligible to submit a tender if:

- (a) the Tenderer submitting the tender is under restrictions or has principles who are under restriction to participate in the Employer's procurement due to corrupt or fraudulent practices.
- (b) the Tenderer does not have the legal capacity to enter into the contract.
- (c) the Tenderer cannot provide proof that he is in good standing with respect to duties, taxes, levies and contributions required in terms of legislation applicable to the work in the contract.
- (d) In the event of a Compulsory Clarification Meeting:
  - i) the Tenderer fails to attend the Compulsory Clarification Meeting.
  - ii) the Tenderer fails to have form "Certificate of Attendance at Clarification Meeting / Site Inspection" (in T2.2) signed by the Employer's Agent or his representative.
- (e) in the case of JV submissions, two or more JV entities have common directors / shareholders or common entities tendering for the same works.
- (f) at the time of closing of tenders, the Tenderer is not registered on the **National Treasury Central Supplier Database (CSD)** as a service provider. In the case of a Joint Venture, this requirement will apply individually to each party in the Joint Venture.

SCM Policy (CI.14(4)) requires suppliers/ service providers/ contractors to be registered on the **eThekwini Municipality Central Supplier Database**.

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## **PART C3 : SCOPE OF WORK**

### **C3.1 BACKGROUND**

The Infrastructure Asset Management Branch has commenced with the Asset Management Improvement Plan (AMIP) implementation to establish a baseline Asset Management System (AMS) throughout the city that will be aligned to the best practice guidelines of the National Treasury's Cities Infrastructure Delivery Management System (CIDMS).

In terms of information technology architecture, the city-wide ISO 55000 accredited Asset Management Maturity Assessment diagnostic, that delivered the AMIP, concluded that there are several important linkages between business processes, workflows and information systems that the city needs to address to ensure that its investment in the Computerised Maintenance Management system (CMMS), Asset Performance Management (APM) system and Demand Management system result in overall efficiencies and improvement in productivity.

In terms of data, systems and workflows the city, has low levels of Asset Management understanding, silo mentality decision making and planning and low levels of integration regarding workflows for project management, budgeting, data management, data strategy and scenario planning.

### **C3.2 EMPLOYER'S OBJECTIVES**

The implementation of a functional Asset Management information system architecture within the city's AMS is a requirement of the National Treasury and is in accordance with international best practice.

To effectively manage and oversee its R471 billion infrastructure asset base the eThekweni Metropolitan Municipality must establish a seamless **automated integrated information** and data landscape whose architecture enables short, medium and long-term sustainable planning, effective decision making and managerial control and oversight using a single source of truth.

The Asset Management Specific Projects therefore creates this automation for the city's AMS data inventory creation and management system. This will activate the data learning behaviour across the city at a unit, branch and sector level.

The Asset Management Specific Projects would enable all units irrespective of their specialization to be able to individually revise and adjust how they compile and arrange their data sets, their capturing methodology and sources of information without impacting on the primary Asset Management systems (CMMS, APMs and Demand Management) configuration. This aligns with the City's strategic aim of ensuring the primary Asset Management systems that have high value and high long-term liability have minimal customization and are closest to the "vanilla option" (off the shelf option) as possible.

Furthermore, creation of automated sub systems, the identification of data required, determining data standards, determining data management rules, determining data quality levels and the mapping of EMM's critical business processes and internal workflows is critical to improving efficiencies and enables performance monitoring and tracking

Over time, various units and departments in the Municipality have invested in and implemented information systems to meet their respective business requirements, with varying levels of success. The city is therefore in need of a thorough evaluation of these processes to determine the most appropriate system to standardise on, across the city. These systems have played a pivotal role in the progress towards achieving asset management best practices, including alignment with ISO55000.

**The EMM is preparing a separate tender that will address the data specifications, data rules, data standards and data management aspects for the CMMS system and APM system. The data management and data standards for these two systems would therefore not form part of this appointment.**

### C3.3 SCOPE OF SERVICES

**Due to funding constraints, it may result that funds are not available to undertake all or a portion of the works outlined below. At the onset of the appointment the successful tenderer with the Project Owner shall prepare a schedule for the execution of the works together with resourcing plans. The Project Owner shall decide and execute the works in any order based on the availability of funds over the three-year period. The Client (eThekweni Municipality) reserves that right not to execute any or all items shown below even after an appointment has been made.**

Project 31123ZE shall be joint undertaking between the city's Chief Strategy Officer (CSO), the Information Management Unit (IMU) and possibly the Cooperative Governance and Traditional Leaders (CoGTA) Ministry.

The roles of the CSO, the IMU and the CoGTA Ministry in Project 31123ZE are as follows:

1. the City's' CSO's office  
The CSO's office through its Infrastructure Asset Management Branch and Senior Manager Asset Management shall be accountable for oversight of the entire Project 31123ZE in terms of Scope, Schedule and Costs and shall be the Project Owner. The Senior Manager Asset Management shall ensure that the scope of work is reflective off the overall city needs
2. The City's IMU Office  
The city's IMU office through Deputy Head Applications and Projects shall provide software Developer services through its existing Panel of Developers to undertake the detail design of the selected option including dropdowns and graphical design of the Asset Management Specific Projects. The Project Owner must provide the DH Applications and Projects with the prototype, fields, routing, reporting dashboards and reporting templates.
3. the CoGTA Ministry  
The CoGTA Ministry shall were possible over the three year contract period, or any eThekweni Bid Adjudication Committee (BAC) approved extension thereto, provide support to the Project Owner in terms of providing Capital Funds through the Municipal Support Infrastructure Grant (MSIG). Such funds are not guaranteed, and the conditionality of the grant need to be endorsed by the BAC.

It must be understood that the requirements for the development of the Asset Management Specific Projects to support the role of the city wide Asset Management Improvement Plan (AMIP) is an Engineering and Infrastructure intensive process. The Project Owner and the Professional Service Provider must therefore apply the following knowledge characteristics to this project:

- advanced knowledge of widely applied engineering principles underpinning good practice and knowledge specific to their jurisdiction.
- in-depth fundamental and specialist knowledge in practice area that allows a fundamentals-based, first-principles analytical approach,
- a selection of: law of contract, Health and Safety, Environmental, contract administration, quality management, risk management maintenance management, regulation, project & construction management
- have a working knowledge of interacting disciplines (engineering of the city and other support and enabling units of eThekweni)

It is for the reasons above that the Project Owner shall be the Senior Manager Asset Management within the office of Strategic Management and the PSP must be comprised of professionally registered Engineers / Technologist.

To create an enabling Information Technology ecosystem to support and sustain the primary Asset Management systems (CMMS, APMs and Demand Management), the city has identified the need to:

1. Map and optimize key Asset Management processes and workflows in units.
2. Identify the Asset Management databases and data sources used in the city (excel format, proprietary software, external sources and service providers etc.).
3. Undertake cleaning of data sets
4. Prepare suitable automation options that will assist units at a micro level in preparing inputs to the primary Asset Management System and to aid in automating key business processes and workflows that contribute to Asset Management
5. Develop high level Asset Management data standards, data management workflows and data quality standards for these automation processes.

In accordance with the AMIP implementation process, the city requires the services of a Professional Service Provider (PSP) to:

**Standard Conditions of Tender**

**F.1 General**

**F.1.1 Actions**

**F.1.1.1** The employer and each tenderer submitting a tender offer shall comply with these conditions of tender. In their dealings with each other, they shall discharge their duties and obligations as set out in F.2 and F.3, timeously and with integrity, and behave equitably, honestly and transparently, comply with all legal obligations and not engage in anticompetitive practices.

**F.1.1.2** The employer and the tenderer and all their agents and employees involved in the tender process shall avoid conflicts of interest and where a conflict of interest is perceived or known, declare any such conflict of interest, indicating the nature of such conflict. Tenderers shall declare any potential conflict of interest in their tender submissions. Employees, agents and advisors of the employer shall declare any conflict of interest to whoever is responsible for overseeing the procurement process at the start of any deliberations relating to the procurement process or as soon as they become aware of such conflict, and abstain from any decisions where such conflict exists or recuse themselves from the procurement process, as appropriate.

*Note:*

- 1) *A conflict of interest may arise due to a conflict of roles which might provide an incentive for improper acts in some circumstances. A conflict of interest can create an appearance of inequity that can undermine confidence in the ability of that person to act properly in his or her position even if no improper acts result.*
- 2) *Conflicts of interest in respect of those engaged in the procurement process include those, interest or family interests in the tender or outcome of the procurement process and any personal bias, inclination, obligation, allegiance or loyalty which would or may affect any decisions taken.*

**F.1.1.3** The employer shall not seek and a tenderer shall not submit a tender without having a firm intention and the capacity to proceed with the contract.

**F.1.2 Tender Documents**

The documents issued by the employer for the purpose of a tender offer are listed in the tender data.

**F.1.3 Interpretation**

**F.1.3.1** The tender data and additional requirements contained in the tender schedules that are included in the returnable documents are deemed to be part of these conditions of tender.

**F.1.3.2** These conditions of tender, the tender data and tender schedules which are only required for tender evaluation purposes, shall not form part of any contract arising from the invitation to tender.

**F.1.3.3** For the purposes of these conditions of tender, the following definitions apply:

- a) **conflict of interest** means any situation in which:
  - i) someone in a position of trust has competing professional or personal interests which make it difficult to fulfil his or her duties impartially;
  - ii) an individual or organisation is in a position to exploit a professional or official capacity in some way for their personal or corporate benefit; or
