



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1. THE PURPOSE

The purpose of this tender is to appoint service provider/s for the supply, delivery, installation, commissioning, and maintenance of orthopaedic surgical equipment and accessories for the Gauteng Department of Health Institutions for the period of three (3) years.

2. THE BACKGROUND

The Gauteng Department of Health has four Academic hospitals, three Tertiary hospitals and District hospitals that are currently in need of the Orthopaedic equipment, fracture treatment and arthroscopy items. These tender covers all the orthopaedic surgical care in hospitals and orthopaedic surgical sites for the Gauteng Department of Health. The Gauteng Department of Health's Orthopaedic departments have the mandate to provide therapeutic services to all patients referred to Orthopaedic Departments.

The Department of Orthopaedic deals with large numbers of the trauma and cold Orthopaedic patients. Most of the patients require emergency treatment which requires stabilization of the bone, by way of open reduction and internal fixation. This surgery cannot be performed without the help of special equipment. Without the correct equipment and instruments, orthopedic surgery becomes difficult and requires a prolonged period, and this can lead to dissatisfaction of the patient and further suffering of the patients. The aim of this tender is to ensure that the equipment is readily available and in addition, the aim of the tender is to continuously supply so that the patient does not have to wait as it may cause serious damage to the fractures.



3. LEGISLATIVE AND REGULATORY FRAMEWORK

- 5.4 Each response to the line item will be verified in the brochures or technical data sheets, user and technical manuals submitted by the suppliers. Should the information required not stated in the brochures or technical data sheets, the vendor should then supply valid letter from the manufacturer to verify the response.

STAGE 1C: TECHNICAL EVALUATION

Only bidders who have complied with the Mandatory Administrative Responsiveness Evaluation, (Stage 1A) and Functionality Evaluation Responsiveness, (Stage 1B) will be evaluated for the Technical Evaluation.

Bidders must observe and refer to the tender specifications for the supply, delivery, installation, commissioning, and maintenance of orthopaedic surgical equipment and accessories for the Gauteng Department of Health for the period of three (3) years. **See attached Annexure A.**

7. CESSION

Neither party shall have the right to cede any of its rights or delegate any of its obligations in terms of this contract to another person or organisation without the prior written approval of the other party.

8. GENERAL AND SAFETY REQUIREMENTS

8.1 Technology

- a. No product or part thereof shall be second hand or refurbished.
- b. The equipment offered must be of the latest model, top of range and with the latest software version and package where applicable - the model,



range and version as well as the date of initial manufacture must be stated on the brochure or data sheets.

- c. The end-user must be informed if there is a newer model of the same equipment that will be launched within the stipulated time frame of 12-24 weeks. If so, then the newer model to be launched must replace the current model in this tender at the same tendered price.
- d. The bidder must be able to upgrade the software at no cost during the life span of the equipment.
- e. The bidder must guarantee that no additional equipment, parts, or software, excluding consumables, will be required for the successful operation of the equipment quoted on in this bid. A starter pack of all essential accessories must be supplied so that the unit can be put into immediate operation.

8.2 Manuals and documentation

- a. The bidders must submit an original hard copy as well as an electronic copy of all the brochures as follows:
 - The original brochure/s; as printouts and or pdf format; and in English. Or The marketing brochure as well as the technical product data sheets in English.
 - The technical product data sheets must be comprehensive with the technical specifications of the equipment and all the accessories, including the details of the brand, model, and clear technical specifications.
- b. An electronic copy or memory stick of the manuals and documentation in English must be supplied.
- c. The following must be submitted in English (where applicable):
 - Complete operator /user manuals
 - DICOM conformance statements

- d. The vendor shall provide updates and revisions of the manuals at no extra charge for the lifetime of the equipment.

8.3 Quality Standards Certifications:

Products supplied to the Gauteng Department of Health must conform to the quality standards and international device regulations. The equipment must comply with the acceptable safety standard:

- a. The acceptable international electrical safety standard IEC-601-1, IEC-601-1-2 and IEC-60601 / IS-13450 for medical equipment.
- b. The ISO 9000 and ISO 13485 installation standards or equivalent.
- c. Compliance with CE/ SABS/ TUV or alternative certification.
- d. The South African National Accreditation System (SANAS) to the Inspection Body affiliated with the bidders for the Acceptance Quality Assurance Test and commissioning of the equipment offered.

8.4 Tender Price

a. The tender price must be clearly broken down into all the items that are included and the prices per item. All bidders must indicate whether an optional item in a brochure is required to meet the specification and if it is included in the tender price. The breakdown of the prices also assists if part payments must be made.



- b. The following prices must be submitted and indicated as per the attached annexure B1 and B2:
 - A detailed quotation that indicates what items are included and showing the breakdown of prices.
 - ii. The three-year warranty must be included in the unit price of the equipment from the delivery of the equipment. The purchase pricing schedule must be completed in full.
 - iii. The tender price must specify the standard items included in the equipment offered as well as the optional items not included. The bidder must clearly distinguish the cost of the standard and the optional items in the pricing schedule.
 - The price of the unit.
 - Optional items separately.
 - The warranty of three years.
 - The maintenance plan of five years.
 - The training requirements.
 - o The required consumables to operate the equipment.

8.5 Warranty, Maintenance and Services Specifications

- a. The three-year warranty will commence after formal acceptance and handover of the equipment.
- b. The warranty must include services performed on all the equipment in the tender document.
- c. Scheduled Services by Technical Staff and Annual QC tests by Inspection Bodies, must be performed during normal working hours, from 08h00 to 17h00 during weekdays.
- d. Bidders must supply a three-year warranty against poor workmanship and latent defects and parts, as follows:
- e. The warranty must include all materials used and all workmanship.
- f. All software updates must be included in the warranty at no extra costs. Page ${f 17}$ of ${f 24}$



- g. Spares and traveling time cost to be included in the warranty. Spares should be available within three to five working days.
- h. A callout and backup service for urgent and emergency service requests must be available daily for 24 hours and be included in the warranty. The response time must be within two hours for urgent and an hour for emergency. Bidder must provide an after sales 24 hours / 7 days a week support and service (including weekends and public holidays). Bidder to provide a letter head with an emergency contacts details in case of a break down.
- The successful bidder must arrange with both the respective Hospital / Institution and the Health Technology Services – Head of Clinical department before commissioning the equipment at the respective hospital / institution.
- j. The equipment will only be accepted after the commissioning and approval for use by the responsible unit in the hospital (Head of clinical department) of the equipment to be ready for the first patient.
- k. Software changes to the equipment that are corrective in nature and initiated due to software errors, regulatory requirements or safety reasons, shall be delivered and installed at no charge for the life of the equipment.
- I. If movable equipment is taken away to the service and repair facility for repair and maintenance during the warranty and maintenance periods, a loan set must be supplied for use by the institution.
- m. If the equipment bided for is irreparable during the warranty period, it must be replaced, and the institution be furnished with new equipment.
- n. Up-Time is defined as follows: 24/7; i.e., 365 days times 24 hours = 8760 Hours. A down time of 2% relates to 175 hours per annum.
- o. The up time of the unit must comply as follows:
 - The up time of the unit must be better than 98%, excluding scheduled preventative maintenance and software upgrades, measured on a



quarterly basis. State up-time. The percentage lower than 98% will be added to the warranty period.

- A sliding scale penalty clause will form part of the service contract.
 This will result in the maintenance payment being reduced by a pro rata amount that the up time is less than 98%.
- The five year all inclusive, fully comprehensive preventative maintenance, service and repair contract will commence after the three-year warranty period has expired.
- p. Bidders must supply an all-inclusive, fully comprehensive five-year preventative maintenance, service and repair contract on all equipment, as follows:
 - This contract would cover, but not be limited to the following: labour, travelling, accommodation, service and maintenance.
 - Specify the total cost per year and the cumulative cost for the five-year all-inclusive service contract.
 - The contract must cover but not be limited to the following: All parts (including, where appropriate, Consumables and other glassware, labour, travelling, accommodation, service and maintenance.
 - The five-year maintenance plan must also include all quality checks and quality assurance requirements (including Annual QA-tests by SANAS accredited inspection bodies) and also all required calibrations.
 - All software updates must be included in the five-year maintenance plan at no extra costs.
- q. A Technical Report outlining the functional status of each unit must be submitted to the Head of the Department on an annual basis. (Not to be confused with Annual QC Test Results issued by the Inspection Bodies)
- r. All required calibrations must be done after every service.
- s. For each and every repair, service and maintenance and all other services (upgrades, updates, etcetera) a job card must be furnished.



- t. Bidders to state lifespan and end of support date of the equipment offered.
- u. The equipment software must be upgradable for the lifespan period of the equipment.
- v. Spare parts must be guaranteed available for the specified life of the equipment, with a minimum of ten years.
- w. Spare part kits should specify all spare parts that will be included and stored on bidder site.
- x. The successful bidder must notify the Hospital in advance of any service calls to be made on site, and relevant staff may choose to be present while the service work is performed.

8.6 Commissioning of the equipment

The equipment and accessories ordered shall be delivered, installed, tested and commissioned at bidder's expense prior to acceptance.

8.7 User and Technical Training

- a. Upon commissioning the system, the application specialist must be immediately available to provide the training of staff on the bidders cost.
- b. On-site training on all new equipment to be included in the price.
- c. Orthopaedic equipment's training for three working days per week for the first four weeks. The training sessions must be provided on site on the operation of the equipment at no additional cost to the final bid price to ensure the correct application of the unit. State the training that will be provided and by whom.
- d. The application specialist must provide repetitive and refresher training for one day every six months for the duration of the warranty and maintenance, as requested by the users in order to demonstrate and train all staff on all aspects of the equipment. State details.



- e. Quality Control training for two days must be provided by the supplier's technician / Inspection Body is mandatory within the first year and must be included in the tender price. (Not included in other training)
- f. All other further training must be available on request. State details.
- g. Bidders must note that dedicated test equipment, spare parts and any special tooling required for the upkeep and maintenance of equipment quoted on must be made available and a dedicated workshop must be arranged. The Department has the right to visit and validate the workshop.

9. USE OF FLUID CORRECTING SUBSTANCES

The use of any corrective fluid/tape is strictly prohibited and will result in the disqualification of the bidder from the evaluation process.

10. PAYMENT TERMS

Section 38(1)(f) of the PFMA and Treasury Regulation 8.2.3 regulates the payment to suppliers within 30 days of invoice receipt. In support of this it is compulsory for the successful bidder/s to register for GPT Electronic Invoice Submission and Tracking.

11. LINES OF COMMUNICATION AND REPORTING

The appointed Service Provider will be required to report to the designated GDoH official located at the Facilities Unit, who will be introduced to the successful Service Provider on appointment.

12. THE CONDITIONS OF THE BID AWARD

a. The Gauteng Department of Health reserves the right not to award or cancel the bid.



- b. The Gauteng Department reserves the right to award line item or same equipment to more that one bidder to ensure continuity of the service.

- 3.2.9 remove the equipment from location of the End-user on termination of this Agreement at no additional charge;
- 3.2.10 perform all the services in terms of this contract with due care skill, efficiency and diligence in accordance with the best professional practice.

3.3 **PRODUCT SUPPORT**

- 3.1 The Supplier will from time to time and to the extent that is reasonably necessary or required by the End-user for the proper utilisation of the equipment, provide advice and assistance to the End-user and to provide such reports and data relevant to the usage of the equipment as may reasonably be required by the End-user.
- 3.3.2 Without limiting the generality of its obligations under clause
- 3.3.1 The Supplier hereby authorises the End-user to install access key control devices on the relevant equipment and will provide all necessary assistance to ensure the proper integration of the access key control devices with the equipment. The Supplier shall also assist the End-user in the installation of any copy control devices and copy management devices on the equipment as may be reasonably required by the End-user.
- 3.3.3 Where The Supplier or any of its employees, agents or independent contractors ("Representatives") accesses the premises of the End-

user, under or pursuant to, the terms of this Agreement, The Supplier and its representatives shall abide by and comply with the safety, health and environmental policies and procedures and other lawful directions of the End-user.

3.4 TRAINING

- 3.4.1 On installation of the equipment, The Supplier shall provide adequate training to the personnel of the End-user at no additional charge.
- 3.4.2 Instruction manuals shall also be provided by the Supplier free of charge for all equipment rented in terms of this agreement. The instruction manuals shall contain, but not be limited to, the following information:
- 3.4.2.1 Defining the capabilities of the equipment (specification)
- 3.4.2.2 Describing the technical operations of the equipment.
- 3.4.2.3 Describing the use criteria of the equipment.
- 3.4.3 The Supplier shall also provide such further training may be required by the End User from time to time.

3.5 **INDEMNITY AND INSURANCE**

The Supplier hereby:

- 3.5.1 Undertakes, at its own expense, to indemnify, protect and defend the End User from and against all actions, claims, losses or damages arising from any negligent act or omission by the Supplier including but not limited to all damages or loss which may be payable or arise as a result of any claim or proceedings in respect of the death, injury to any person and the loss or damage to any property which may arise out of or in consequence of the execution of any obligations in terms of this agreement;
 - 5.2 at its expense take out and keep in force in respect of the indemnity given by it in terms of this agreement a public liability insurance policy providing cover with a limit of not less than R 3 000 000-00 (three million rand) for any one occurrence of an insured peril in any year and unlimited as to cumulative amount in respect of more than one such occurrence in any year;

3.6 **SUBCONTRACTING**

It is recorded that:

3.6.1 The Supplier will be entitled to appoint suitably qualified subcontractors who satisfy the eligibility criteria applicable to the award of the contract to perform all or any of its obligations arising from this Agreement;

- 3.6.2 No sub-contract can create contractual relations between any subcontractor and End- User;
- 3.6.3 The Supplier shall be responsible for all the acts, defaults and negligence of its subcontractors and their experts, agents or employees as if they were acts, defaults or negligence of the Supplier shall not be absolved from its responsibility from under this clause on the basis that such person was acting outside the scope of its engagement by The Supplier.
- 3.6.4 The Supplier will provide the End user with a list (regularly updated for the duration of this agreement) of all the subcontractors that it intends using to perform all or any of its functions in terms of this agreement.

3.7 **CONFIDENTIALITY**

3.7.1 The Supplier shall treat all documents and information received in connection with this agreement as private and confidential, and shall not, save in so far as may be necessary for the purposes of performance thereof, publish or disclose any particulars without the prior written consent of the End user.

4. OBLIGATIONS OF THE END - USER

- 4.1 The End user undertakes to:
 - 4.1.1 Use the equipment for the purpose that it is intended and in accordance with any reasonable manufacturers' instructions and user manual as to the use thereof;
 - 4.1.2 Keep the equipment in its possession and custody and control at its premises in accordance with the same policies and procedures that the End user applies in respect of its own assets and equipment;
 - 4.1.3 Advise the supplier prior to relocation equipment.
 - 4.1.4 Allow the supplier or its representatives reasonable access to the inspection of the equipment on prior written notice;
 - 4.1.5 Undertakes to ensure that the installation area, access ways, electrical supply and where relevant, the IT configuration of its premises and other equipment or any network are suitable for the installation, passage and electrical/or electronic connection of the equipment when it is delivered for installation and thereafter.

5. BREACH

- 5.1 Either party commits a breach of contract where it fails to discharge any of its obligations in terms of this agreement;
- 5.2 Should either party commit a material breach of this agreement ("the defaulting party") and fail to remedy such breach within ten (10) days of written demand from the other party ("the aggrieved party") then the aggrieved party may, in addition to any other rights and remedies that it may have, including the right to claim damages:-
- 5.2.1 Claim specific performance;

- or Terminate this agreement, such termination to be effective immediately upon receipt by the defaulting party of written notice to that effect
- 5.3 In any case where the End – User is entitled to damages, then the End -user may claim such damages from the Supplier;
- 5.4 This agreement shall automatically and without notice terminate upon occurrence of the following events:
 - a receiver, liquidator or administrator is appointed over any of the property or assets of that the Supplier:
 - the Supplier makes any voluntary arrangement with its creditors reason of financial difficulty or becomes subject to an administration order, or provisional or final liquidation or insolvency order;
 - 5.4.3 the Supplier goes into liquidation or is declared insolvent;
 - 5.4.4 that the Supplier ceases, or threatens to cease, to carry on business.

6. **PAYMENT**

The End – User shall pay the Supplier:

- the rental applicable to the contract at the time of signing this agreement 6.1 which rental shall be fixed for the entire initial rental period of 36 months. In the event of the extension of the contract, the rental shall reduce by 75% of the original rental The first Rental Charge shall be paid after the Commencement Date of the Agreement, within 30 days of the date of the original copy of statement or tax invoice to the Enduser and shall thereafter be payable monthly in arrear within 30 days of the last day of the month in which The Supplier delivers an original copy of statement and tax invoice to the End-user.
- Copy Charges, applicable on the contract at the time of signing this 6.2 Agreement will apply and would thereafter be adjusted on the thirteenth month and twenty-fifth month of the contract period.
- The first of the Copy Charges shall be paid within thirty (30) days in which the original copy of statement and tax invoice in respect thereof is rendered, and shall thereafter be payable monthly in arrears on the first day of the month following the month in respect whereof the Copy Charge has arisen or within 30 days of the last day of the month in which the original copy of statement and tax invoice is delivered to the End-user, whichever is the later.
- 6.4 Payment shall be paid by electronic means into bank account:

- 7.2 Any notice addressed to a party at its physical or postal address shall be sent by prepaid registered post or delivered by hand or sent by telefax.
- 7.3 Any notice shall be deemed to have been given:
- 7.3.1 if posted 14 calendar days after the date of posting;
- 7.3.2 if hand delivered, on the day of the delivery; The parties may communicate by electronic means.
- 7.4.3 if sent by telefax, on the date and time of sending, which telefax, is evidenced by a fax confirmation print out.

8. **GENERAL**

- **Whole Agreement**. This Agreement constitutes the entire Agreement between the Parties in respect of the subject matter hereof and neither Party shall be bound by any undertakings, representations, warranties or promises not recorded in this Agreement.
- 8.2 **No Variation.** This agreement together with General Conditions of Contract, Special Conditions of the contract and all Standard Bidding Documents constitutes the entire agreement between the parties. No variation or consensual cancellation of this Agreement and no addition to this Agreement shall be of any force or effect unless reduced to writing and signed by the Parties or their duly authorised representatives.
- 8.3 **Waiver.** No waiver of any of the terms and conditions of this Agreement will be binding or effectual for any purpose unless expressed in writing and signed by the Party hereto giving the same, and any such waiver will be

effective only in the specific instance and for the purpose given. No failure or delay on the part of either Party hereto in exercising any right, power or privilege hereunder will operate as a waiver thereof, nor will any single or partial exercise of any right, power or privilege preclude any other or further exercise thereof or the exercise of any other right, power or privilege.

- 8.4 **Severability.** Should any of the terms and conditions of this Agreement be held to be invalid, unlawful or unenforceable, such terms and conditions will be severable from the remaining terms and conditions which will continue to be valid and enforceable. If any term or condition held to be invalid is capable of amendment to render it valid, the Parties agree to negotiate an amendment to remove the invalidity.
- 8.5 **Applicable Law.** This Agreement will be governed by and construed in accordance with the law of the Republic of South Africa and all disputes, actions and other matters relating thereto will be determined in accordance with such law.
- 8.6 Jurisdiction. The Parties hereto hereby consent and submit to the jurisdiction of such High Court of South Africa, in any dispute arising from or in connection with this Agreement.
- 8.7 **Survival.** Notwithstanding termination of this Agreement, any clause which, from the context, contemplates ongoing rights and obligations of the parties, shall survive such termination and continue to be of full force and effect.

FIGHTING CORRUPTION, PROMOTING INTEGRITY

1. INTRODUCTION

This agreement is part of the tender document, which shall be signed and submitted along with the tender document. The Chief Executive Officer of the bidding company or his/her authorised representative shall sign the integrity pact. If the winning bidder has not signed this integrity pact during the submission of the bid, the tender/proposal shall be disqualified.

2. OBJECTIVES

Now, therefore, the Gauteng Provincial Government and the Bidder agree to enter into this pre-contract agreement, hereinafter referred to as an integrity pact, to avoid all forms of corruption by following a system that is fair, transparent, and free from any influence/unprejudiced dealings before, during and after the currency of the contract to be entered, with a view to:

- 2.1 Enable the Gauteng Provincial Government to obtain the desired contract at a reasonable and competitive price in conformity to the defined specifications of the works, goods and services; and
- 2.2 Enable bidders to abstain from bribing or any corrupt practice to secure the contract by assuring them that their competitors will refrain from bribing and other corrupt practices and the Gauteng Provincial Government will commit to preventing corruption, in any form by their officials by following transparent procedures.

3. GOVERNANCE

3.1 The integrity pact seeks to ensure that both parties comply with all applicable provincial, national, continental, and international laws and regulations regarding fair competition and anti-corruption.

4. ENVIRONMENT

4.1 The integrity pact requires that both parties comply with all applicable environmental, health, and safety regulations.

5. PROTECTION OF INFORMATION

5.1 The integrity pact seeks to ensure that both parties undertake to protect the confidentiality of information. Each party, when given access to confidential information as part of the business relationship should not share this information with anyone unless authorised.





6. REPUTATION

- 6.1 The Gauteng Provincial Government wants to work with bidders who are proud of their reputation for fair dealing and quality delivery.
- 6.2 The Gauteng Provincial Government wants to ensure that working with government is reputation enhancing for the supplier.
- 6.3 The Gauteng Provincial Government expects bidders/suppliers to be protective of government's reputation, and ensure that neither they, nor any of their partners or subcontractors, bring government to disrepute by engaging in any act or omission which is reasonably likely to diminish the trust that the public places in government.
- 6.4 The Gauteng Provincial Government further requires its bidders/suppliers to always adhere to ethical conduct even outside their contractual obligation with the Gauteng Provincial Government.

7. VALUES OF THE GAUTENG PROVINCIAL GOVERNMENT

7.1 The value system of the Gauteng City Region is shown below:

7.2 The Gauteng Provincial Government commits to ensure that the values system is embedded into the day-to-day operations of its institutions.

8. COMMITMENTS OF THE GAUTENG PROVINCIAL GOVERNMENT

The Gauteng Provincial Government commits itself to the following:

- 8.1 The GPG commits that its officials will at all times conduct themselves in accordance with Treasury Regulations 16A.8¹, copy of which is attached marked Annexure A, and that:
- 8.1.1 The GPG is committed to doing business with integrity and proper regard for ethical business practices.
- 8.1.2 The GPG hereby undertakes that no official of the GPG, connected directly or indirectly with the contract will demand, take a promise for or accept, directly or through

intermediaries, any bribe, consideration, gift, reward, favour, or any material or immaterial benefit or any other advantage from the bidder, either for themselves or for any person, organisation or third party related to the contract in exchange for an advantage in the bidding process, bid evaluation, contracting or implementation process related to the contract.

- 8.1.3 The GPG further confirms that its officials have not favoured any prospective bidder in any form that could afford an undue advantage to that bidder during the tendering stage and will further treat all bidders alike.
- 8.1.4 The GPG will during the tender process treat all Bidder(s) with equity.
- 8.1.5 All officials of the GPG shall report any attempted or completed violation of clauses to the following details:

- 8.1.6 Following the report on the violation of the above clauses by the official(s), through any source, the GPG shall investigate allegations of such violations against the official or other role players and when justified:
 - a) Take steps against such official and other role players (necessary disciplinary proceedings, and/or any other action as deemed fit, bar such officials from further dealings related to the contract process). In such a case, while an enquiry is being conducted by the Gauteng Provincial Government the proceedings under the contract would not be stalled.
 - b) Inform the relevant Treasury of steps taken in 8.1.5(a) against such officials; and
 - c) Report any conduct by such official and other role players that may constitute an offence to the South African Police Service.

9. COMMITMENTS OF THE BIDDERS

The bidder commits himself/herself to take all measures necessary to prevent corrupt practices, unfair means and illegal activities during any stage of his/her bid or during any precontract or post contract stage to secure the contract or in furtherance to secure it and commits himself/herself to the following:

- 9.1 The bidder is committed to doing business with integrity and proper regard for ethical business practices.
- 9.2 The bidder will not offer, directly or through intermediaries, any bribe, gift, consideration, reward, favour, any material or immaterial benefit or other advantage, commission, fees, brokerage or inducements to any official of the Gauteng Provincial Government, connected directly or indirectly with the bidding process, or to any person, organisation or third party related to the contract in exchange for any advantage in the bidding, evaluation, contracting and implementation of the contract.
- 9.3 The bidder further undertakes that he/she has not given, offered or promised to give, directly or indirectly any bribe, gift, consideration, reward, favour, any material or immaterial benefit or other advantage, commission, fees, brokerage or inducements to an official of the Gauteng Provincial Government or otherwise in procuring the contract or forbearing to do or having done any act in relation to the obtaining or execution of the contract or any other contract with the Gauteng Provincial Government for showing or forbearing to show favour or disfavor to any person in relation to the contract or any other contract with the Gauteng Provincial Government.
- 9.4 The bidder will not collude with other parties interested in the contract to preclude the competitive bid price, impair the transparency, fairness and progress of the bidding process, bid evaluation, contracting and implementation of the contract.
- 9.5 The Bidder(s)/Contractor(s) will not enter with other Bidders into any undisclosed agreement or understanding, whether formal or informal. This applies in particular to prices, specifications, certifications, subsidiary contracts, submission or non-submission of bids or any other actions to restrict competitiveness or to introduce cartelization in the bidding process.







- 9.6 The Bidder(s)/Contractor(s) will, when presenting his / her bid, disclose any and all payments he /she has made, is committed to or intends to make to agents, brokers or any other intermediaries in connection with the award of the contract.
- 9.7 In case of sub-contracting, the Principal Contractor shall take the responsibility of adoption of Integrity Pact by the Sub-Contractor.
- 9.8 The bidder shall report any attempted or completed violation of clauses 9.1 to 9.7 including any alleged unethical conduct to the Gauteng Ethics Hotline (details are provided at clause 8.1.4).
- 9.9 The bidder (or anyone acting on its behalf) warrants that:
- 9.9.1 It has not been convicted by a court of law for fraud and/or corruption with respect to the procurement/tendering processes; and/or
- 9.9.2 It has not been convicted by a court of law for theft or extortion; and/or
- 9.9.3 It is not listed on the National Treasury's database of Restricted Suppliers or Register of Tender Defaulters.

10. SANCTIONS FOR VIOLATION

- 10.1 The breach of any aforesaid provisions or providing false information by employers, including manipulation of information by evaluators, shall face administrative charges and penal actions as per the existing relevant rules and laws.
- 10.2 The breach of the Pact or providing false information by the Bidder, or anyone employed by him, or acting on his behalf (whether without the knowledge of the Bidder), or acting on his/her behalf, shall be dealt with as per the provisions of the Prevention and Combating of Corrupt Activities Act (12 of 2004).
- 10.3 The Gauteng Provincial Government shall also take all or any one of the following actions, wherever required:
 - 10.3.1 To immediately call off the pre-contract negotiations without giving any compensation to the bidder. However, the proceedings with the other bidder(s) would continue.
 - 10.3.2 To immediately cancel the contract, if already awarded/signed, without giving any compensation to the bidder.
 - 10.3.3 To recover all sums already paid by the Gauteng Provincial Government.
 - 10.3.4 To cancel all or any other contracts with the bidders and GPG shall be entitled to demand and recover from the Contractor liquidated damages of the Contract value.
 - 10.3.5 To submit the details of the bidder to the National Treasury to register on the database for tender defaulters.





11 CONFLICT OF INTEREST

- A conflict of interest involves a conflict between the public duty and private interest (for favor or vengeance) of a public official, in which the public official has private interest which could improperly influence the performance of their official duties and responsibilities. Conflicts of interest would arise in a situation when any concerned members of both parties are related either directly or indirectly or has any association or had any confrontation. Thus, conflict of interest of any tender committee must be declared in a prescribed form.
- 11.2 The bidder shall not lend or borrow any money from or enter any monetary dealings or transactions, directly or indirectly, with any member of the tender committee or officials of the Gauteng Provincial Government, and if he/she does so, the Gauteng Provincial Government shall be entitled forthwith to rescind the contract and all other contracts with the bidder.

12 LEGAL ACTIONS

12.1 The actions stipulated in this Integrity Pact are without prejudice to any other legal action that may follow in accordance with the provisions of the extant law in force relating to any civil or criminal proceedings.

13 VALIDITY

- 13.1 The validity of this Integrity Pact shall cover the tender process and extend until the completion of the contract to the satisfaction of both the Gauteng Provincial Government and the bidder (service provider).
- 13.2 Should one or several provisions of the Pact turn out to be invalid; the remainder of this Pact remains valid. In this case, the parties will strive to come to an agreement to their original intentions.

GENERAL CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT July 2010

NOTES

The purpose of this document is to:

- (i) Draw special attention to certain general conditions applicable to government bids, contracts and orders; and
- (ii) To ensure that clients be familiar with regard to the rights and obligations of all parties involved in doing business with government.

In this document words in the singular also mean in the plural and vice versa and words in the masculine also mean in the feminine and neuter.

- The General Conditions of Contract will form part of all bid documents and may not be amended.
- Special Conditions of Contract (SCC) relevant to a specific bid, should be compiled separately for every bid (if (applicable) and will supplement the General Conditions of Contract. Whenever there is a conflict, the provisions in the SCC shall prevail.

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General Conditions of Contract

1. Definitions

- 1. The following terms shall be interpreted as indicated:
- 1.1 "Closing time" means the date and hour specified in the bidding documents for the receipt of bids.
- 1.2 "Contract" means the written agreement entered into between the purchaser and the supplier, as recorded in the contract form signed by the parties, including all attachments and appendices thereto and all documents incorporated by reference therein.
- 1.3 "Contract price" means the price payable to the supplier under the contract for the full and proper performance of his contractual obligations.
- 1.4 "Corrupt practice" means the offering, giving, receiving, or soliciting of any thing of value to influence the action of a public official in the procurement process or in contract execution.
- 1.5 "Countervailing duties" are imposed in cases where an enterprise abroad is subsidized by its government and encouraged to market its products internationally.
- 1.6 "Country of origin" means the place where the goods were mined, grown or produced or from which the services are supplied. Goods are produced when, through manufacturing, processing or substantial and major assembly of components, a commercially recognized new product results that is substantially different in basic characteristics or in purpose or utility from its components.
- 1.7 "Day" means calendar day.
- 1.8 "Delivery" means delivery in compliance of the conditions of the contract or order.
- 1.9 "Delivery ex stock" means immediate delivery directly from stock actually on hand.
- 1.10 "Delivery into consignees store or to his site" means delivered and unloaded in the specified store or depot or on the specified site in compliance with the conditions of the contract or order, the supplier bearing all risks and charges involved until the supplies are so delivered and a valid receipt is obtained.
- 1.11 "Dumping" occurs when a private enterprise abroad market its goods on own initiative in the RSA at lower prices than that of the country of origin and which have the potential to harm the local industries in the RSA.

- 1.12 "Force majeure" means an event beyond the control of the supplier and not involving the supplier's fault or negligence and not foreseeable. Such events may include, but is not restricted to, acts of the purchaser in its sovereign capacity, wars or revolutions, fires, floods, epidemics, quarantine restrictions and freight embargoes.
- 1.13 "Fraudulent practice" means a misrepresentation of facts in order to influence a procurement process or the execution of a contract to the detriment of any bidder, and includes collusive practice among bidders (prior to or after bid submission) designed to establish bid prices at artificial non-competitive levels and to deprive the bidder of the benefits of free and open competition.
- 1.14 "GCC" means the General Conditions of Contract.
- 1.15 "Goods" means all of the equipment, machinery, and/or other materials that the supplier is required to supply to the purchaser under the contract.
- 1.16 "Imported content" means that portion of the bidding price represented by the cost of components, parts or materials which have been or are still to be imported (whether by the supplier or his subcontractors) and which costs are inclusive of the costs abroad, plus freight and other direct importation costs such as landing costs, dock dues, import duty, sales duty or other similar tax or duty at the South African place of entry as well as transportation and handling charges to the factory in the Republic where the supplies covered by the bid will be manufactured.
- 1.17 "Local content" means that portion of the bidding price which is not included in the imported content provided that local manufacture does take place.
- 1.18 "Manufacture" means the production of products in a factory using labour, materials, components and machinery and includes other related value-adding activities.
- 1.19 "Order" means an official written order issued for the supply of goods or works or the rendering of a service.
- 1.20 "Project site," where applicable, means the place indicated in bidding documents.
- 1.21 "Purchaser" means the organization purchasing the goods.
- 1.22 "Republic" means the Republic of South Africa.
- 1.23 "SCC" means the Special Conditions of Contract.
- 1.24 "Services" means those functional services ancillary to the supply of the goods, such as transportation and any other incidental services, such as installation, commissioning, provision of technical assistance, training, catering, gardening, security, maintenance and other such obligations of the supplier covered under the contract.

1.25 "Written" or "in writing" means handwritten in ink or any form of electronic or mechanical writing.

2. Application

- 2.1 These general conditions are applicable to all bids, contracts and orders including bids for functional and professional services, sales, hiring, letting and the granting or acquiring of rights, but excluding immovable property, unless otherwise indicated in the bidding documents.
- 2.2 Where applicable, special conditions of contract are also laid down to cover specific supplies, services or works.
- 2.3 Where such special conditions of contract are in conflict with these general conditions, the special conditions shall apply.

3. General

- 3.1 Unless otherwise indicated in the bidding documents, the purchaser shall not be liable for any expense incurred in the preparation and submission of a bid. Where applicable a non-refundable fee for documents may be charged.
- 3.2 With certain exceptions, invitations to bid are only published in the Government Tender Bulletin. The Government Tender Bulletin may be obtained directly from the Government Printer, Private Bag X85, Pretoria 0001, or accessed electronically from www.treasury.gov.za

4. Standards

- 4.1 The goods supplied shall conform to the standards mentioned in the bidding documents and specifications.
- 5. Use of contract documents and information; inspection.
- 5.1 The supplier shall not, without the purchaser's prior written consent, disclose the contract, or any provision thereof, or any specification, plan, drawing, pattern, sample, or information furnished by or on behalf of the purchaser in connection therewith, to any person other than a person employed by the supplier in the performance of the contract. Disclosure to any such employed person shall be made in confidence and shall extend only so far as may be necessary for purposes of such performance.
- 5.2 The supplier shall not, without the purchaser's prior written consent, make use of any document or information mentioned in GCC clause 5.1 except for purposes of performing the contract.
- 5.3 Any document, other than the contract itself mentioned in GCC clause 5.1 shall remain the property of the purchaser and shall be returned (all copies) to the purchaser on completion of the supplier's performance under the contract if so required by the purchaser.
- 5.4 The supplier shall permit the purchaser to inspect the supplier's records relating to the performance of the supplier and to have them audited by auditors appointed by the purchaser, if so required by the purchaser.

6. Patent rights

6.1 The supplier shall indemnify the purchaser against all third-party claims of infringement of patent, trademark, or industrial design rights arising from use of the goods or any part thereof by the purchaser.

7. Performance

7.1 Within thirty (30) days of receipt of the notification of contract award,

security

- the successful bidder shall furnish to the purchaser the performance security of the amount specified in SCC.
- 7.2 The proceeds of the performance security shall be payable to the purchaser as compensation for any loss resulting from the supplier's failure to complete his obligations under the contract.
- 7.3 The performance security shall be denominated in the currency of the contract, or in a freely convertible currency acceptable to the purchaser and shall be in one of the following forms:
 - (a) a bank guarantee or an irrevocable letter of credit issued by a reputable bank located in the purchaser's country or abroad, acceptable to the purchaser, in the form provided in the bidding documents or another form acceptable to the purchaser; or
 - (b) a cashier's or certified cheque
- 7.4 The performance security will be discharged by the purchaser and returned to the supplier not later than thirty (30) days following the date of completion of the supplier's performance obligations under the contract, including any warranty obligations, unless otherwise specified in SCC.

8. Inspections, tests and analyses

- 8.1 All pre-bidding testing will be for the account of the bidder.
- 8.2 If it is a bid condition that supplies to be produced or services to be rendered should at any stage during production or execution or on completion be subject to inspection, the premises of the bidder or contractor shall be open, at all reasonable hours, for inspection by a representative of the Department or an organization acting on behalf of the Department.
- 8.3 If there are no inspection requirements indicated in the bidding documents and no mention is made in the contract, but during the contract period it is decided that inspections shall be carried out, the purchaser shall itself make the necessary arrangements, including payment arrangements with the testing authority concerned.
- 8.4 If the inspections, tests and analyses referred to in clauses 8.2 and 8.3 show the supplies to be in accordance with the contract requirements, the cost of the inspections, tests and analyses shall be defrayed by the purchaser.
- 8.5 Where the supplies or services referred to in clauses 8.2 and 8.3 do not comply with the contract requirements, irrespective of whether such supplies or services are accepted or not, the cost in connection with these inspections, tests or analyses shall be defrayed by the supplier.
- 8.6 Supplies and services which are referred to in clauses 8.2 and 8.3 and which do not comply with the contract requirements may be rejected.
- 8.7 Any contract supplies may on or after delivery be inspected, tested or analyzed and may be rejected if found not to comply with the requirements of the contract. Such rejected supplies shall be held at the

cost and risk of the supplier who shall, when called upon, remove them immediately at his own cost and forthwith substitute them with supplies which do comply with the requirements of the contract. Failing such removal the rejected supplies shall be returned at the suppliers cost and risk. Should the supplier fail to provide the substitute supplies forthwith, the purchaser may, without giving the supplier further opportunity to substitute the rejected supplies, purchase such supplies as may be necessary at the expense of the supplier.

8.8 The provisions of clauses 8.4 to 8.7 shall not prejudice the right of the purchaser to cancel the contract on account of a breach of the conditions thereof, or to act in terms of Clause 23 of GCC.

9. Packing

- 9.1 The supplier shall provide such packing of the goods as is required to prevent their damage or deterioration during transit to their final destination, as indicated in the contract. The packing shall be sufficient to withstand, without limitation, rough handling during transit and exposure to extreme temperatures, salt and precipitation during transit, and open storage. Packing, case size and weights shall take into consideration, where appropriate, the remoteness of the goods' final destination and the absence of heavy handling facilities at all points in transit.
- 9.2 The packing, marking, and documentation within and outside the packages shall comply strictly with such special requirements as shall be expressly provided for in the contract, including additional requirements, if any, specified in SCC, and in any subsequent instructions ordered by the purchaser.

10. Delivery and documents

- 10.1 Delivery of the goods shall be made by the supplier in accordance with the terms specified in the contract. The details of shipping and/or other documents to be furnished by the supplier are specified in SCC.
- 10.2 Documents to be submitted by the supplier are specified in SCC.

11. Insurance

11.1 The goods supplied under the contract shall be fully insured in a freely convertible currency against loss or damage incidental to manufacture or acquisition, transportation, storage and delivery in the manner specified in the SCC.

12. Transportation

12.1 Should a price other than an all-inclusive delivered price be required, this shall be specified in the SCC.

13. Incidental services

- 13.1 The supplier may be required to provide any or all of the following services, including additional services, if any, specified in SCC:
 - (a) performance or supervision of on-site assembly and/or commissioning of the supplied goods;
 - (b) furnishing of tools required for assembly and/or maintenance of the supplied goods;
 - (c) furnishing of a detailed operations and maintenance manual for each appropriate unit of the supplied goods;
 - (d) performance or supervision or maintenance and/or repair of the supplied goods, for a period of time agreed by the parties,

- provided that this service shall not relieve the supplier of any warranty obligations under this contract; and
- (e) training of the purchaser's personnel, at the supplier's plant and/or on-site, in assembly, start-up, operation, maintenance, and/or repair of the supplied goods.
- 13.2 Prices charged by the supplier for incidental services, if not included in the contract price for the goods, shall be agreed upon in advance by the parties and shall not exceed the prevailing rates charged to other parties by the supplier for similar services.

14. Spare parts

- 14.1 As specified in SCC, the supplier may be required to provide any or all of the following materials, notifications, and information pertaining to spare parts manufactured or distributed by the supplier:
 - (a) such spare parts as the purchaser may elect to purchase from the supplier, provided that this election shall not relieve the supplier of any warranty obligations under the contract; and
 - (b) in the event of termination of production of the spare parts:
 - (i) Advance notification to the purchaser of the pending termination, in sufficient time to permit the purchaser to procure needed requirements; and
 - (ii) following such termination, furnishing at no cost to the purchaser, the blueprints, drawings, and specifications of the spare parts, if requested.

15. Warranty

- 15.1 The supplier warrants that the goods supplied under the contract are new, unused, of the most recent or current models, and that they incorporate all recent improvements in design and materials unless provided otherwise in the contract. The supplier further warrants that all goods supplied under this contract shall have no defect, arising from design, materials, or workmanship (except when the design and/or material is required by the purchaser's specifications) or from any act or omission of the supplier, that may develop under normal use of the supplied goods in the conditions prevailing in the country of final destination.
- 15.2 This warranty shall remain valid for twelve (12) months after the goods, or any portion thereof as the case may be, have been delivered to and accepted at the final destination indicated in the contract, or for eighteen (18) months after the date of shipment from the port or place of loading in the source country, whichever period concludes earlier, unless specified otherwise in SCC.
- 15.3 The purchaser shall promptly notify the supplier in writing of any claims arising under this warranty.
- 15.4 Upon receipt of such notice, the supplier shall, within the period specified in SCC and with all reasonable speed, repair or replace the defective goods or parts thereof, without costs to the purchaser.
- 15.5 If the supplier, having been notified, fails to remedy the defect(s) within the period specified in SCC, the purchaser may proceed to take such remedial action as may be necessary, at the supplier's risk and expense and without prejudice to any other rights which the purchaser

may have against the supplier under the contract.

16. Payment

- 16.1 The method and conditions of payment to be made to the supplier under this contract shall be specified in SCC.
- 16.2 The supplier shall furnish the purchaser with an invoice accompanied by a copy of the delivery note and upon fulfillment of other obligations stipulated in the contract.
- 16.3 Payments shall be made promptly by the purchaser, but in no case later than thirty (30) days after submission of an invoice or claim by the supplier.
- 16.4 Payment will be made in Rand unless otherwise stipulated in SCC.

17. Prices

17.1 Prices charged by the supplier for goods delivered and services performed under the contract shall not vary from the prices quoted by the supplier in his bid, with the exception of any price adjustments authorized in SCC or in the purchaser's request for bid validity extension, as the case may be.

18. Contract amendments

18.1 No variation in or modification of the terms of the contract shall be made except by written amendment signed by the parties concerned.

19. Assignment

19.1 The supplier shall not assign, in whole or in part, its obligations to perform under the contract, except with the purchaser's prior written consent.

20. Subcontracts

20.1 The supplier shall notify the purchaser in writing of all subcontracts awarded under this contracts if not already specified in the bid. Such notification, in the original bid or later, shall not relieve the supplier from any liability or obligation under the contract.

21. Delays in the supplier's performance

- 21.1 Delivery of the goods and performance of services shall be made by the supplier in accordance with the time schedule prescribed by the purchaser in the contract.
- 21.2 If at any time during performance of the contract, the supplier or its subcontractor(s) should encounter conditions impeding timely delivery of the goods and performance of services, the supplier shall promptly notify the purchaser in writing of the fact of the delay, its likely duration and its cause(s). As soon as practicable after receipt of the supplier's notice, the purchaser shall evaluate the situation and may at his discretion extend the supplier's time for performance, with or without the imposition of penalties, in which case the extension shall be ratified by the parties by amendment of contract.
- 21.3 No provision in a contract shall be deemed to prohibit the obtaining of supplies or services from a national department, provincial department, or a local authority.
- 21.4 The right is reserved to procure outside of the contract small quantities or to have minor essential services executed if an emergency arises, the supplier's point of supply is not situated at or near the place where the supplies are required, or the supplier's services are not readily

available.

- 21.5 Except as provided under GCC Clause 25, a delay by the supplier in the performance of its delivery obligations shall render the supplier liable to the imposition of penalties, pursuant to GCC Clause 22, unless an extension of time is agreed upon pursuant to GCC Clause 21.2 without the application of penalties.
- 21.6 Upon any delay beyond the delivery period in the case of a supplies contract, the purchaser shall, without canceling the contract, be entitled to purchase supplies of a similar quality and up to the same quantity in substitution of the goods not supplied in conformity with the contract and to return any goods delivered later at the supplier's expense and risk, or to cancel the contract and buy such goods as may be required to complete the contract and without prejudice to his other rights, be entitled to claim damages from the supplier.

22. Penalties

22.1 Subject to GCC Clause 25, if the supplier fails to deliver any or all of the goods or to perform the services within the period(s) specified in the contract, the purchaser shall, without prejudice to its other remedies under the contract, deduct from the contract price, as a penalty, a sum calculated on the delivered price of the delayed goods or unperformed services using the current prime interest rate calculated for each day of the delay until actual delivery or performance. The purchaser may also consider termination of the contract pursuant to GCC Clause 23.

23. Termination for default

- 23.1 The purchaser, without prejudice to any other remedy for breach of contract, by written notice of default sent to the supplier, may terminate this contract in whole or in part:
 - (a) if the supplier fails to deliver any or all of the goods within the period(s) specified in the contract, or within any extension thereof granted by the purchaser pursuant to GCC Clause 21.2;
 - (b) if the Supplier fails to perform any other obligation(s) under the contract; or
 - (c) if the supplier, in the judgment of the purchaser, has engaged in corrupt or fraudulent practices in competing for or in executing the contract.
- 23.2 In the event the purchaser terminates the contract in whole or in part, the purchaser may procure, upon such terms and in such manner as it deems appropriate, goods, works or services similar to those undelivered, and the supplier shall be liable to the purchaser for any excess costs for such similar goods, works or services. However, the supplier shall continue performance of the contract to the extent not terminated.
- 23.3 Where the purchaser terminates the contract in whole or in part, the purchaser may decide to impose a restriction penalty on the supplier by prohibiting such supplier from doing business with the public sector for a period not exceeding 10 years.
- 23.4 If a purchaser intends imposing a restriction on a supplier or any person associated with the supplier, the supplier will be allowed a time period of not more than fourteen (14) days to provide reasons why the

envisaged restriction should not be imposed. Should the supplier fail to respond within the stipulated fourteen (14) days the purchaser may regard the intended penalty as not objected against and may impose it on the supplier.

- 23.5 Any restriction imposed on any person by the Accounting Officer / Authority will, at the discretion of the Accounting Officer / Authority, also be applicable to any other enterprise or any partner, manager, director or other person who wholly or partly exercises or exercised or may exercise control over the enterprise of the first-mentioned person, and with which enterprise or person the first-mentioned person, is or was in the opinion of the Accounting Officer / Authority actively associated.
- 23.6 If a restriction is imposed, the purchaser must, within five (5) working days of such imposition, furnish the National Treasury, with the following information:
 - (i) the name and address of the supplier and / or person restricted by the purchaser;
 - (ii) the date of commencement of the restriction
 - (iii) the period of restriction; and
 - (iv) the reasons for the restriction.

These details will be loaded in the National Treasury's central database of suppliers or persons prohibited from doing business with the public sector.

- 23.7 If a court of law convicts a person of an offence as contemplated in sections 12 or 13 of the Prevention and Combating of Corrupt Activities Act, No. 12 of 2004, the court may also rule that such person's name be endorsed on the Register for Tender Defaulters. When a person's name has been endorsed on the Register, the person will be prohibited from doing business with the public sector for a period not less than five years and not more than 10 years. The National Treasury is empowered to determine the period of restriction and each case will be dealt with on its own merits. According to section 32 of the Act the Register must be open to the public. The Register can be perused on the National Treasury website.
- 24. Anti-dumping and countervailing duties and rights
- 24.1 When, after the date of bid, provisional payments are required, or antidumping or countervailing duties are imposed, or the amount of a
 provisional payment or anti-dumping or countervailing right is
 increased in respect of any dumped or subsidized import, the State is
 not liable for any amount so required or imposed, or for the amount of
 any such increase. When, after the said date, such a provisional
 payment is no longer required or any such anti-dumping or
 countervailing right is abolished, or where the amount of such
 provisional payment or any such right is reduced, any such favourable
 difference shall on demand be paid forthwith by the contractor to the
 State or the State may deduct such amounts from moneys (if any)
 which may otherwise be due to the contractor in regard to supplies or
 services which he delivered or rendered, or is to deliver or render in
 terms of the contract or any other contract or any other amount which
 may be due to him

25. Force Majeure

- 25.1 Notwithstanding the provisions of GCC Clauses 22 and 23, the supplier shall not be liable for forfeiture of its performance security, damages, or termination for default if and to the extent that his delay in performance or other failure to perform his obligations under the contract is the result of an event of force majeure.
- 25.2 If a force majeure situation arises, the supplier shall promptly notify the purchaser in writing of such condition and the cause thereof. Unless otherwise directed by the purchaser in writing, the supplier shall continue to perform its obligations under the contract as far as is reasonably practical, and shall seek all reasonable alternative means for performance not prevented by the force majeure event.

26. Termination for insolvency

26.1 The purchaser may at any time terminate the contract by giving written notice to the supplier if the supplier becomes bankrupt or otherwise insolvent. In this event, termination will be without compensation to the supplier, provided that such termination will not prejudice or affect any right of action or remedy which has accrued or will accrue thereafter to the purchaser.

27. Settlement of Disputes

- 27.1 If any dispute or difference of any kind whatsoever arises between the purchaser and the supplier in connection with or arising out of the contract, the parties shall make every effort to resolve amicably such dispute or difference by mutual consultation.
- 27.2 If, after thirty (30) days, the parties have failed to resolve their dispute or difference by such mutual consultation, then either the purchaser or the supplier may give notice to the other party of his intention to commence with mediation. No mediation in respect of this matter may be commenced unless such notice is given to the other party.
- 27.3 Should it not be possible to settle a dispute by means of mediation, it may be settled in a South African court of law.
- 27.4 Mediation proceedings shall be conducted in accordance with the rules of procedure specified in the SCC.
- 27.5 Notwithstanding any reference to mediation and/or court proceedings herein,
 - (a) the parties shall continue to perform their respective obligations under the contract unless they otherwise agree; and
 - (b) the purchaser shall pay the supplier any monies due the supplier.

28. Limitation of liability

- 28.1 Except in cases of criminal negligence or willful misconduct, and in the case of infringement pursuant to Clause 6;
 - (a) the supplier shall not be liable to the purchaser, whether in contract, tort, or otherwise, for any indirect or consequential loss or damage, loss of use, loss of production, or loss of profits or interest costs, provided that this exclusion shall not apply to any obligation of the supplier to pay penalties and/or damages to the purchaser; and

- (b) the aggregate liability of the supplier to the purchaser, whether under the contract, in tort or otherwise, shall not exceed the total contract price, provided that this limitation shall not apply to the cost of repairing or replacing defective equipment.
- 29. Governing language
- 29.1 The contract shall be written in English. All correspondence and other documents pertaining to the contract that is exchanged by the parties shall also be written in English.
- 30. Applicable law
- 30.1 The contract shall be interpreted in accordance with South African laws, unless otherwise specified in SCC.
- 31. Notices
- 31.1 Every written acceptance of a bid shall be posted to the supplier concerned by registered or certified mail and any other notice to him shall be posted by ordinary mail to the address furnished in his bid or to the address notified later by him in writing and such posting shall be deemed to be proper service of such notice
- 31.2 The time mentioned in the contract documents for performing any act after such aforesaid notice has been given, shall be reckoned from the date of posting of such notice.

32. Taxes and duties

- 32.1 A foreign supplier shall be entirely responsible for all taxes, stamp duties, license fees, and other such levies imposed outside the purchaser's country.
- 32.2 A local supplier shall be entirely responsible for all taxes, duties, license fees, etc., incurred until delivery of the contracted goods to the purchaser.
- 32.3 No contract shall be concluded with any bidder whose tax matters are not in order. Prior to the award of a bid the Department must be in possession of a tax clearance certificate, submitted by the bidder. This certificate must be an original issued by the South African Revenue Services.
- 33. National 33.1 Industrial Participation (NIP) Programme
 - 33.1 The NIP Programme administered by the Department of Trade and Industry shall be applicable to all contracts that are subject to the NIP obligation.

34. Prohibition of Restrictive practices

- 34.1 In terms of section 4 (1) (b) (iii) of the Competition Act No. 89 of 1998, as amended, an agreement between, or concerted practice by, firms, or a decision by an association of firms, is prohibited if it is between parties in a horizontal relationship and if a bidder (s) is / are or a contractor(s) was / were involved in collusive bidding (or bid rigging).
- 34.2 If a bidder(s) or contractor(s), based on reasonable grounds or evidence obtained by the purchaser, has / have engaged in the restrictive practice referred to above, the purchaser may refer the matter to the Competition Commission for investigation and possible imposition of administrative penalties as contemplated in the Competition Act No. 89 of 1998.

34.3 If a bidder(s) or contractor(s), has / have been found guilty by the Competition Commission of the restrictive practice referred to above, the purchaser may, in addition and without prejudice to any other remedy provided for, invalidate the bid(s) for such item(s) offered, and / or terminate the contract in whole or part, and / or restrict the bidder(s) or contractor(s) from conducting business with the public sector for a period not exceeding ten (10) years and / or claim damages from the bidder(s) or contractor(s) concerned.
