Z1 Cession delegation and assignment

- Z1.1 The *Contractor* does not cede, delegate or assign any of its rights or obligations to any person without the written consent of the *Employer*.
- Z1.2 Notwithstanding the above, the *Employer* may on written notice to the *Contractor* cede and delegate its rights and obligations under this contract to any of its subsidiaries or any of its present divisions or operations which may be converted into separate legal entities as a result of the restructuring of the Electricity Supply Industry.

Z2 Joint ventures

- Z2.1 If the Contractor constitutes a joint venture, consortium or other unincorporated grouping of two or more persons or organisations then these persons or organisations are deemed to be jointly and severally liable to the Employer for the performance of this contract.
- Z2.2 Unless already notified to the Employer, the persons or organisations notify the Service Manager within two weeks of the Contract Date of the key person who has the authority to bind the Contractor on their behalf.
- Z2.3 The *Contractor* does not alter the composition of the joint venture, consortium or other unincorporated grouping of two or more persons without the consent of the *Employer* having been given to the *Contractor* in writing.

Z3 Change of Broad Based Black Economic Empowerment (B-BBEE) status

- Z3.1 Where a change in the *Contractor's* legal status, ownership or any other change to his business composition or business dealings results in a change to the *Contractor's* B-BBEE status, the *Contractor* notifies the *Employer* within seven days of the change.
- Z3.2 The *Contractor* is required to submit an updated verification certificate and necessary supporting documentation confirming the change in his B-BBEE status to the *Service Manager* within thirty days of the notification or as otherwise instructed by the *Service Manager*.
- Z3.3 Where, as a result, the *Contractor's* B-BBEE status has decreased since the Contract Date the *Employer* may either re-negotiate this contract or alternatively, terminate the *Contractor's* obligation to Provide the Service.
- Z3.4 Failure by the Contractor to notify the Employer of a change in its B-BBEE status may constitute a reason for termination. If the Employer terminates in terms of this clause, the procedures on termination are P1, P2 and P4 as stated in clause 92, and the amount due is A1 and A3 as stated in clause 93.

Z4 Confidentiality

- Z4.1 The Contractor does not disclose or make any information arising from or in connection with this contract available to Others. This undertaking does not, however, apply to information which at the time of disclosure or thereafter, without default on the part of the Contractor, enters the public domain or to information which was already in the possession of the Contractor at the time of disclosure (evidenced by written records in existence at that time). Should the Contractor disclose information to Others in terms of clause 25.1, the Contractor ensures that the provisions of this clause are complied with by the recipient.
- Z4.2 If the *Contractor* is uncertain about whether any such information is confidential, it is to be regarded as such until notified otherwise by the *Service Manager*.
- Z4.3 In the event that the *Contractor* is, at any time, required by law to disclose any such information which is required to be kept confidential, the *Contractor*, to the extent permitted by law prior to disclosure, notifies the *Employer* so that an appropriate protection order and/or any other action can be taken if possible, prior to any disclosure. In the event that such protective order is not, or cannot, be obtained, then the *Contractor* may disclose that portion of the information which it is required to be disclosed by law and uses reasonable efforts to obtain assurances that confidential treatment will be afforded to the information so disclosed.
- Z4.4 The taking of images (whether photographs, video footage or otherwise) of the Affected Property or any portion thereof, in the course of Providing the Service and after the end of the service period, requires the prior written consent of the Service Manager. All rights in and to all such images vests exclusively in the Employer.
- Z4.5 The Contractor ensures that all his subcontractors abide by the undertakings in this clause.

Z5

Z5.1 Any extension, concession, waiver or relaxation of any action stated in this contract by the Parties, the *Service Manager* or the *Adjudicator* does not constitute a waiver of rights, and does not give rise to an estoppel unless the Parties agree otherwise and confirm such agreement in writing.

Z6 Health, safety and the environment: Add to core clause 27.4

Waiver and estoppel: Add to core clause 12.3:

- Z6.1 The *Contractor* undertakes to take all reasonable precautions to maintain the health and safety of persons in and about the execution of the *service*. Without limitation the *Contractor*:
 - accepts that the Employer may appoint him as the "Principal Contractor" (as defined and provided for under the Construction Regulations 2014 (promulgated under the Occupational Health & Safety Act 85 of 1993) ("the Construction Regulations") for the Affected Property;
 - warrants that the total of the Prices as at the Contract Date includes a sufficient amount for proper compliance with the Construction Regulations, all applicable health & safety laws and regulations and the health and safety rules, guidelines and procedures provided for in this contract and generally for the proper maintenance of health & safety in and about the execution of the service; and
 - undertakes, in and about the execution of the service, to comply with the Construction Regulations and with all applicable health & safety laws and regulations and rules, guidelines and procedures otherwise provided for under this contract and ensures that his Subcontractors, employees and others under the Contractor's direction and control, likewise observe and comply with the foregoing.
- Z6.2 The *Contractor*, in and about the execution of the *service*, complies with all applicable environmental laws and regulations and rules, guidelines and procedures otherwise provided for under this contract and ensures that his Subcontractors, employees and others under the *Contractor's* direction and control, likewise observe and comply with the foregoing.

Z7 Provision of a Tax Invoice and interest. Add to core clause 51

- Z7.1 Within one week of receiving a payment certificate from the Service Manager in terms of core clause 51.1, the Contractor provides the Employer with a tax invoice in accordance with the Employer's procedures stated in the Service Information, showing the amount due for payment equal to that stated in the payment certificate.
- Z7.2 If the *Contractor* does not provide a tax invoice in the form and by the time required by this contract, the time by when the *Employer* is to make a payment is extended by a period equal in time to the delayed submission of the correct tax invoice. Interest due by the *Employer* in terms of core clause 51.2 is then calculated from the delayed date by when payment is to be made.
- Z7.3 The *Contractor* (if registered in South Africa in terms of the companies Act) is required to comply with the requirements of the Value Added Tax Act, no 89 of 1991 (as amended) and to include the *Employer's* VAT number 4740101508 on each invoice he submits for payment.

Z8 Notifying compensation events

Z8.1 Delete the last paragraph of core clause 61.3 and replace with:

If the *Contractor* does not notify a compensation event within eight weeks of becoming aware of the event, he is not entitled to a change in the Prices.

Z9 Employer's limitation of liability

- Z9.1 The Employer's liability to the Contractor for the Contractor's indirect or consequential loss is limited to R0.00 (zero Rand)
- Z9.2 The Contractor's entitlement under the indemnity in 82.1 is provided for in 60.1(12) and the Employer's liability under the indemnity is limited to compensation as provided for in core clause 63 and X19.11 if Option X19 Task Order applies to this contract.

Termination: Add to core clause 91.1, at the second main bullet point, fourth sub-bullet **Z10** point, after the words "against it":

Z10.1 or had a business rescue order granted against it.

Z11 Ethics

For the purposes of this Z-clause, the following definitions apply:

Affected Party means, as the context requires, any party, irrespective of whether it is the Contractor

purpose, including to influence an Affected Party to act unlawfully or illegally,

Committing means, as the context requires, the Contractor, or any member thereof in the case of a joint venture, or its employees, agents, or Subcontractors or the Subcontractor's **Party**

employees,

means the offering, giving, taking, or soliciting, directly or indirectly, of a good or **Corrupt Action**

service to unlawfully or illegally influence the actions of an Affected Party,

Fraudulent means any unlawfully or illegally intentional act or omission that misleads, or attempts Action

to mislead, an Affected Party, in order to obtain a financial or other benefit or to avoid

an obligation or incurring an obligation,

Obstructive means a Committing Party unlawfully or illegally destroying, falsifying, altering or Action concealing information or making false statements to materially impede an

investigation into allegations of Prohibited Action, and

Prohibited means any one or more of a Coercive Action, Collusive Action Corrupt Action, Action

Fraudulent Action or Obstructive Action.

Z11.1 A Committing Party may not take any Prohibited Action during the course of the procurement of this contract or in execution thereof.

- Z11.2 The Employer may terminate the Contractor's obligation to Provide the Services if a Committing Party has taken such Prohibited Action and the Contractor did not take timely and appropriate action to prevent or remedy the situation, without limiting any other rights or remedies the Employer has. It is not required that the Committing Party had to have been found guilty, in court or in any other similar process, of such Prohibited Action before the Employer can terminate the Contractor's obligation to Provide the Services for this reason.
- Z11.3 If the *Employer* terminates the *Contractor's* obligation to Provide the Services for this reason. the amounts due on termination are those intended in core clauses 92.1 and 92.2.
- Z11.4 A Committing Party co-operates fully with any investigation pursuant to alleged Prohibited Action. Where the Employer does not have a contractual bond with the Committing Party, the Contractor ensures that the Committing Party co-operates fully with an investigation.

Z12 Insurance

Replace core clause 83 with the following: Z 12 .1

Insurance cover 83

- 83.1 When requested by a Party, the other Party provides certificates from his insurer or broker stating that the insurances required by this contract are in force.
- 83.2 The Contractor provides the insurances stated in the Insurance Table A from the starting date until the earlier of Completion and the date of the termination certificate.

Z13 Nuclear Liability

- Z13.1 The *Employer* is the operator of the Koeberg Nuclear Power Station (KNPS), a nuclear installation, as designated by the National Nuclear Regulator of the Republic of South Africa, and is the holder of a nuclear licence in respect of the KNPS.
- Z13.2 The *Employer* is solely responsible for and indemnifies the *Contractor* or any other person against any and all liabilities which the *Contractor* or any person may incur arising out of or resulting from nuclear damage, as defined in Act 47 of 1999, save to the extent that any liabilities are incurred due to the unlawful intent of the *Contractor* or any other person or the presence of the *Contractor* or that person or any property of the *Contractor* or such person at or in the KNPS or on the KNPS site, without the permission of the *Employer* or of a person acting on behalf of the *Employer*.
- Z13.3 Subject to clause Z13.4 below, the *Employer* waives all rights of recourse, arising from the aforesaid, save to the extent that any claims arise or liability is incurred due or attributable to the unlawful intent of the *Contractor* or any other person, or the presence of the *Contractor* or that person or any property of the *Contractor* or such person at or in the KNPS or on the KNPS site, without the permission of the *Employer* or of a person acting on behalf of the *Employer*.
- Z13.4 The *Employer* does not waive its rights provided for in section 30 (7) of Act 47 of 1999, or any replacement section dealing with the same subject matter.
- Z13.5 The protection afforded by the provisions hereof shall be in effect until the KNPS is decommissioned.

Z14 **Asbestos**

For the purposes of this Z-clause, the following definitions apply:

AAIA means approved asbestos inspection authority.

ACM means asbestos containing materials.

means action level, i.e. a level of 50% of the OEL, i.e. 0.1 regulated asbestos fibres AL

per ml of air measured over a 4 hour period. The value at which proactive actions is required in order to control asbestos exposure to prevent exceeding the OEL.

means breathable air in area of work with specific reference to breathing zone, which **Ambient Air**

is defined to be a virtual area within a radius of approximately 30cm from the nose

inlet.

Compliance Monitoring

means compliance sampling used to assess whether or not the personal exposure of workers to regulated asbestos fibres is in compliance with the Standard's requirements

for safe processing, handling, storing, disposal and phase-out of asbestos and

asbestos containing material, equipment and articles.

OEL means occupational exposure limit.

Parallel Measurements means measurements performed in parallel, yet separately, to existing measurements

to verify validity of results.

means airborne asbestos exposure levels conforming to the Standard's requirements Safe Levels

for safe processing, handling, storing, disposal and phase-out of asbestos and

asbestos containing material, equipment and articles.

Standard means the Employer's Asbestos Standard 32-303: Requirements for Safe Processing,

Handling, Storing, Disposal and Phase-out of Asbestos and Asbestos Containing

Material, Equipment and Articles.

SANAS means the South African National Accreditation System.

TWA means the average exposure, within a given workplace, to airborne asbestos fibres,

normalised to the baseline of a 4 hour continuous period, also applicable to short term

exposures, i.e. 10-minute TWA.

Z14.1 The Employer ensures that the Ambient Air in the area where the Contractor will Provide the Services conforms to the acceptable prescribed South African standard for asbestos, as per the regulations published in GNR 155 of 10 February 2002, under the Occupational Health and Safety Act, 1993 (Act 85 of 1993) ("Asbestos Regulations"). The OEL for asbestos is 0.2 regulated asbestos fibres per millilitre of air as a 4-hour TWA, averaged over any continuous period of four hours, and the short term exposure limit of 0.6 regulated asbestos fibres per millilitre of air as a 10minute TWA, averaged over any 10 minutes, measured in accordance with HSG248 and monitored according to HSG173 and OESSM.

- Z14.2 Upon written request by the Contractor, the Employer certifies that these conditions prevail. All measurements and reporting are effected by an independent, competent, and certified occupational hygiene inspection body, i.e. a SANAS accredited and Department of Employment and Labour approved AAIA. The Contractor may perform Parallel Measurements and related control measures at the Contractor's expense. For the purposes of compliance the results generated from Parallel Measurements are evaluated only against South African statutory limits as detailed in clause Z14.1. Control measures conform to the requirements stipulated in the AAIAapproved asbestos work plan.
- Z14.3 The *Employer* manages asbestos and ACM according to the Standard.

THE PROVISION OF SECURITY SERVICES AT VARIOUS SITES IN CAPE COASTAL CLUSTER - EASTERN CAPE.

- Z14.4 In the event that any asbestos is identified while Providing the Services, a risk assessment is conducted and if so required, with reference to possible exposure to an airborne concentration of above the AL for asbestos, immediate control measures are implemented and relevant air monitoring conducted in order to declare the area safe.
- Z14.5 The Contractor's personnel are entitled to stop working and leave the contaminated area forthwith until such time that the area of concern is declared safe by either Compliance Monitoring or an AAIA approved control measure intervention, for example, per the emergency asbestos work plan, if applicable.
- Z14.6 The Contractor continues to Provide the Services, without additional control measures presented, on presentation of Safe Levels. The contractually agreed dates to Provide the Services, including the Completion Date, are adjusted accordingly. The contractually agreed dates are extended by the notification periods required by regulations 3 and 21 of the Asbestos Regulations, 2001.
- Z14.7 Any removal and disposal of asbestos, asbestos containing materials and waste, is done by a registered asbestos contractor, instructed by the *Employer* at the *Employer*'s expense, and conducted in line with South African legislation.

C2.1 Pricing assumptions: Option A

1. How work is priced and assessed for payment

Clause 11 in NEC3 Term Service Contract (TSC3) core clauses and Option A states:

Identified and 11 defined terms 11.2

(12) The Price List is the price list unless later changed in accordance with this contract.

(17) The Price for Services Provided to Date is the total of

- the Price for each lump sum item in the Price List which the Contractor has completed and
- where a quantity is stated for an item in the Price List, an amount calculated by multiplying the quantity which the Contractor has completed by the rate.

(19) The Prices are the amounts stated in the Price column of the Price List. Where a quantity is stated for an item in the Price List, the Price is calculated by multiplying the quantity by the rate.

This confirms that Option A is a priced contract where the Prices are derived from a list of items of service which can be priced as lump sums or as expected quantities of service multiplied by a rate or a mix of both.

Function of the Price List 2.

Clause 54.1 in Option A states: "Information in the Price List is not Service Information". This confirms that instructions to do work or how it is to be done are not included in the Price List but in the Service Information. This is further confirmed by Clause 20.1 which states, "The Contractor Provides the Service in accordance with the Service Information". Hence the Contractor does not Provide the Service in accordance with the Price List. The Price List is only a pricing document.

3. Link to the Contractor's plan

Clause 21.4 states "The Contractor provides information which shows how each item description on the Price List relates to the operations on each plan which he submits for acceptance". Hence when compiling the price list, the tendering contractor needs to develop his first clause 21.2 plan in such a way that operations shown on it can be priced in the price list and result in a satisfactory cash flow in terms of clause 11.2(17).

4. Preparing the price list

Before preparing the price list, both the Employer and tendering contractors should read the TSC3 Guidance Notes pages 14 and 15. In an Option A contract, either Party may have entered items into the price list either as a process of offer and acceptance (tendering) or by negotiation depending on the nature of the service to be provided. Alternatively the Employer, in his Instructions to Tenderers or in a Tender Schedule, may have listed some items that he requires the Contractor to include in the price list to be prepared and priced by him.

THE PROVISION OF SECURITY SERVICES AT VARIOUS SITES IN CAPE COASTAL CLUSTER - EASTERN CAPE.

It is assumed that in preparing or finalising the *price list* the *Contractor:*

- Has taken account of the guidance given in the TSC3 Guidance Notes relevant to Option A;
- Understands the function of the Price List and how work is priced and paid for;
- Is aware of the need to link operations shown in his plan to items shown in the Price List;
- Has listed and priced items in the *price list* which are inclusive of everything necessary and incidental to Providing the Service in accordance with the Service Information, as it was at the time of tender, as well as correct any Defects not caused by an *Employer's* risk;
- Has priced work he decides not to show as a separate item within the Prices or rates of other listed items in order to fulfil the obligation to complete the service for the tendered total of the Prices.
- Understands there is no adjustment to items priced as lump sums if the amount, or quantity, of
 work within that item later turns out to be different to that which the *Contractor* estimated at time of
 tender. The only basis for a change to the (lump sum) Prices is as a result of a compensation
 event.

4.1. Format of the price list

(From the example given in an Appendix within the TSC3 Guidance Notes)

Entries in the first four columns in the *price list* in section C2.2 are made either by the *Employer* or the tendering contractor.

If the *Contractor* is to be paid an amount for the item which is not adjusted if the quantity of work in the item changes, the tendering contractor enters the amount in the Price column only, the Unit, Expected Quantity and Rate columns being left blank.

If the *Contractor* is to be paid an amount for an item of work which is the rate for the work multiplied by the quantity completed, the tendering contractor enters the rate which is then multiplied by the Expected Quantity to produce the Price, which is also entered.

If the *Contractor* is to be paid a Price for an item proportional to the length of time for which a service is provided, a unit of time is stated in the Unit column and the expected length of time (as a quantity of the stated units of time) is stated in the Expected Quantity column.

1.1 Executive overview

The Provision of Security services at various sites in the Cape Coastal Cluster - Eastern Cape.

1.2 Employer's requirements for the service

The Provision of Security services at various sites in the Cape Coastal Cluster - Eastern Cape.

Physical guarding services which may include the following:

Category A - 24/7 armed/unarmed physical/ static guarding and foot patrols which includes:

- Armed and unarmed Grade C security officers trained to protect NKP and non-NKP sites, as applicable.
- Armed and unarmed Grade B security officers trained to protect NKP and non-NKP sites, as applicable.
- On an "as and when" required basis for a specific period.

Category B - 24/7 physical security escorting and monitoring services which includes:

- Armed Grade C security officers for vehicle patrols and escorts for Eskom employees/contractors/ service providers deployed in high-risk areas or performing high risk tasks (as determined by the business risk assessment).
- Site monitoring (where no Eskom security control room is in operation).
- On an "as and when" required basis for a specific period.

Category C - 24/7 all-inclusive physical security services, namely, armed/unarmed static guarding and foot patrols, control room monitoring, and armed vehicle response, armed escorting and monitoring services combined to provide for the following:

- Armed/unarmed Grade C security officers trained to protect NKP and non-NKP sites, as applicable,
- Armed/unarmed Grade C security officers for vehicle patrols and escorts for Eskom employees/contractors/service providers deployed in high-risk areas or performing high risk tasks (as determined by the business risk assessment),
- Site monitoring (where no Eskom security control room is in operation),

Category D - specialised security services on an as and when required basis or for a specific period which include:

- Armed Grade C security officers capable of rendering tactical and crowd management response services including the provision of a suitable armoured vehicle and intelligent fully monitored surveillance system,
- Grade C armed security officer and canine services,
- Grade B security officer trained in close protection services,

Category E - Ad-hoc Security-related services required which may be requested for a specific task and any period, and at any given time which includes:

- Tactical/armed response,
- · Armed Escorting,
- Static Guarding.

All security officers deployed to Eskom sites must have a valid medical record (not older than 12 months) available which should declare the individual fit for security duties.

All security officers' equipment /site requirements listed below shall form part of the scope for the provision of security services and shall be covered in the **overhead fee and profit percentage** payable to the service provider to ensure that the officers are fully equipped to perform their duties:

- Batons
- Pepper Spray
- Torches per officer
- Panic Buttons linked to the contractor control room
- At least 2 communication devices on each site e.g. PPT, PTT (incl SMART PTT and iTALK devices), two-way radios and/or cell phones
- Handcuffs
- Security Supervision 1 visit per site, per shift (Urban).
- Security Supervision 1 weekly visit per site, per shift (Rural).
- · Fire extinguishers for vehicles.
- Fire Fighting training record for officers deployed to Eskom sites.
- First aid kits on the Eskom sites and the allocated vehicles.
- First Aid training record for Security officers deployed to Eskom sites.
- Real time guard monitoring devices/ systems and reporting capability
- Access control services such as breathalyser testing and access control monitoring.
- Bullet proof vests (Level III Special SA Mix).
- Security uniforms.
- Firearms (9mm pistols and 12 bore Shotguns) if and when required.

Where the guard house is required on a temporary basis, Eskom may pay the costs for rental of the guard houses, with the obligation for sourcing of the guard

houses placed on the supplier. The size of the guardhouse must be $1.2m \times 2.4m$. Material must be Aluminium zinc coated sheeting. Wall hight must be 2m and roof hight must be 2.3m. it must have two opening glass windows $-600mm \times 900mm$. it must have a shelf or desk. Electric -DB board, 1×1000 and 1×1000 board, 1×100

Drinking Water

Where there is no access to potable water at a site, Eskom shall request for a quotation (RFQ) for a daily rate quotation from the Service Provider for the supply of potable water for its security guards.

It should be noted that the provision of potable water by Eskom to a site where water is not available is an Occupational Health and Safety Act requirement and therefore makes it mandatory for Eskom to provide drinking water to a contractor on a site where there is no access to potable water. Any efforts by the business to save on this particular aspect of the service shall be weighed against the risk of non-compliance to the health and safety of the persons employed on the Employer's premises to provide the service.

Ablution Facility (portable Toilet)

Where ablution facilities are required at a site, Eskom shall request a quote for the supply, delivery and maintenance on a weekly basis of the facility. This requirement is also a legal obligation and mandatory for Eskom to ensure it is provided to the security service provider.

Bullet Proof Vests Level III Special SA MIX

Security suppliers to provide the vests as part of their offer and at no cost to Eskom. This view is based on the fact that bullet proof vests are part of the scope for security services and is a necessary item of PPE especially in light of the RSA crime profile and the nature of attacks/incidents at Eskom sites. It is therefore not necessary for Eskom to pay for bulletproof vests. As such bullet proof vests shall therefore be procured, supplied and maintained by the supplier as part of its PPE scope of supply for the services.

Transportation of security guards

The PSIRA guidelines provide for the costs associated with the transportation of security to be included in the overhead and profit cost. In this regard Eskom shall not pay additional costs for the transportation of guards to and from work.

N.B.: For safety reasons no security guards shall be transported at the back of a bakkie. This requirement shall be spelled out clearly in the scope document.

5 Working on the Affected Property

5.1 *Employer's* site entry and security control, permits, and site regulations

The Contractor and all of his staff shall undergo Eskom induction prior to entering the Affected Property.

5.1.1 Roads and Vehicles

- All vehicles used on site, by the Contractor will be compliant with Eskom Standards.
- All road signs and traffic laws / regulations on site will be adhered to. Employees of the Contractor failing to comply will be removed from site and denied any further access.
- Drivers of vehicles in the Eskom Property will be required to obtain an Eskom Driver Permit.

5.1.2 Security

- The Contractor's staff will be subject to all security measures, rules and regulations of the Eskom Security Services
- Vehicles and staff agree and accept the searching of all staff, bags, briefcases and vehicles.

5.1.3 Access to and Departure from the Site

- Access to all sites will be via the main security gate. The Employer informs the Contractor of the
 access procedures, and it should be expected that such procedures may change depending on the
 prevailing security situation.
- The Employer reserves the right for its Security personnel to search persons or vehicles entering or leaving the premises. This includes, but is not limited to staff, briefcases, bags and toolboxes.
- All persons entering Eskom sites are subjected to alcohol testing.

5.1.4 Temporary Gate Permits

- The *Contractor* provides the *Employer* with the personal details of their staff at least two weeks prior to the contract start date. All names and details to be submitted to the *Employer* who arranges for all gate permits.
- If an employee is no longer in the employ of the *Contractor*, the *Contractor* shall notify the *Employer* in advance, and replacements communicated to the *Employer* as well, whereby they will have to attend induction as well.
- The *Contractor* ensures that all equipment and materials brought through the security gate is signed in at the main security gate on the approved Eskom security form.

5.1.5 Removal

- The Contractor is not allowed to remove any equipment or materials from site without producing the relevant Eskom security forms and the equipment lists.
 - o If the equipment or material is to be removed the same day, on which they were brought on to site, then the security form will need to be produced at the gate when leaving the site.
 - The removal of any item at a later stage of the contract will require a security form with the necessary approval and responsible manager's signature.

5.2 People restrictions, hours of work, conduct and records

 and on Site.
- The Contactor is responsible for the training and development of his staff whilst employed by the Employer.
- The Contractor keeps records of his people working on the Affected Property, including those of his Subcontractors and the Service Manager shall have access to these records at any time.

5.4.1 Protection of Flora

The *Contractor* shall protect fauna living within the Site and shall ensure that hunting, snaring, poisoning, shooting, nest raiding or egg collecting and disturbance does not occur.

The *Contractor* is to ensure that his employees are instructed not to feed wild animals.

The use of pesticides is prohibited unless accepted by the Service Manager.

No domestic pets or livestock are permitted on site.

5.5 Cooperating with and obtaining acceptance of Others

The Contractor will cooperate with the Service Manager, his delegates and support structures, in matters relating to this contract.

The Contractor will cooperate with the management staff of the Affected Property.

The Contractor will cooperate with all statutory authorities or inspection agencies.

5.6 Records of Contractor's Equipment

Prior to starting work on the Affected Site, the *Contractor* will compile a list of his equipment, either owned or hired, which will be used for the execution of this contract. It should include the make, type, year of

manufacture, colour and function or use. This list will be signed off by the *Contractor* and the *Service Manager*.

- Any electrical equipment or appliances used by the Contractor must comply with all relevant safety regulations and requirements and be maintained in safe and proper working condition.
- The *Employer* has the right to stop the *Contractor's* use of any electrical equipment or appliance, which in the *Employer's* opinion does not conform to the foregoing.

5.7 Equipment provided by the Employer

Prior to starting work on the Affected Site, the *Contractor* will compile the list of the Employer's equipment which is on site and will be used for the execution of the contract. This list will be signed off by the *Contractor* and the *Service Manager*.

5.8 Site services and facilities

5.9 Control of noise, dust, water and waste

Having due regard for local communities and dwellings, the *Contractor* shall restrict any of his operations which result in undue noise disturbance to those communities and dwellings.

The *Contractor* shall take appropriate measures to minimise the generation of dust as a result of his works, operations and activities to the satisfaction of the *Service Manager*.

The management of solid waste on site shall be strictly controlled and monitored. Only accepted waste disposal methods shall be allowed;

Littering shall be avoided;

(a) Domestic waste

Metal refuse bins or equivalent plastic refuse bins, all with lids, shall be provided by the *Employer* for all buildings. Refuse shall be collected and removed by the *Contractor* from all facilities on a daily basis to the central waste disposal area.
