1. INTRODUCTION AND BACKGROUND

- 1.1. Small Enterprise Finance Agency hereinafter referred to as sefa, is a wholly owned subsidiary of the Industrial Development Corporation of South Africa Limited (IDC) and reports to the Small Business Development Department (DSBD, its Executive Authority.
- 1.2. sefa operates as a Development Finance Institution (DFI) to foster the establishment, development, and growth of Small, Micro and Medium Enterprises (SMMEs) and contributes towards poverty alleviation, job creation and economic growth. Sefa provides products and services to qualifying SMMEs as defined in the National Small Business Act of 1996, as amended in 2004, through a hybrid of wholesale and direct lending channels.

2. SCOPE OF WORK

Khula Business Premises (Pty) Ltd (KBP) a wholly owned subsidiary of the Small Enterprise Finance Agency (**sefa**) wishes to appoint a Professional Fire Prevention and Protection Services Provider who is registered with relevant authorities to provide the above service at its properties listed below.  - Size of extinguishers
 - Type of extinguishers
 - Make of extinguishers
 - Condition of extinguishers (pressure test required etc)
 - Assessment report of Sprinkler System where applicable (Condition of Valves, reticulation, etc)
- Supply and install any fire signage as per OHS Act regulations that is required

3. Evaluation criteria

This RFQ will be evaluated into three (3) phases, i.e., Administration Compliance, Mandatory Requirements, Price, and Specific Goals.

3.1 Phase 1 - Administrative Requirements

- (i) The Standard Bid Document (SBD 4 & 6.1) forms must be fully completed and signed.
- (ii) The bidder must submit proof of registration on CSD (Central Supplier Database) in the form of the CSD Report.
- (iii) Submission of valid Tax Compliance Status (TCS) Certificate with a unique security personal, Identification (PIN) issued by the South African Revenue Services certifying that the taxes of the bidder are in the order must be submitted at the closing date and time of bid/RFQ.
- (iv) Submission of certified valid B-BBEE certificate
- (v) In the event of submission of a B-BBEE Sworn Affidavit, the bidder must ensure that the Affidavit is stamped by the Commissioner of Oath and indicate the contribution level of the Bidding entity;
- (vi) Submission of bidder's Companies & Intellectual Property Commission (CIPC) company registration documents listing all Directors or Shareholders

Note:

- If the bidder is listed on the National Treasury List of Restricted Suppliers shall result in disqualification of the RFQ.
- If any of its Directors are Listed on the Register of Defaulters shall result in disqualification of the RFQ.



Note: All bidders who do not comply with the items listed above may be disqualified and not be evaluated further.

3.2 Phase 2 – Mandatory Requirements

C.	The bidder / Contractor must provide SABS Permit to Apply Certification Mark – Certificate.	

Failure to comply with the above requirements in Phase 2 (Mandatory Requirements) will lead to disqualification and not be evaluated further on Price and Specific Goals.

3.3 Phase 3 - Price and Specific Goals

This RFQ will be evaluated based on price and specific goals in line with the provisions of the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act 5 of 2000, Regulation 2022. As the RFQ price is estimated to be less than R 500 000.00, RFQ responses will be evaluated on the 80/20 price & specific goals.
