1. INTRODUCTION AND PURPOSE

The purpose of this letter is to request approval for a quotation to appoint a service provider to supply and deliver feed for animals to the City of Tshwane resorts Operations Section.

2. BACKGROUND

The City of Tshwane's resort operations staff conduct condition assessments to evaluate the condition of the animals to ensure that the animals stay in a prime condition.

The feeding is required to ensure these animals stay healthy and do not loose condition, especially in the winter months.

This is required for the following reasons:

- 1. Supplement feeding to Rooihuiskraal and Derdepoort.
 - To fill the nutrient shortages in natural grazing especially in winter.
 - To ensure the survival of endangered species such as blue cranes and reptile park animals.
 - To help animals with the digestion of food, and to maintain the body weight and condition of game.
 - To feed animals in captivity.
 - To feed agricultural animals such as cattle, goats, chickens, horse, pigs and sheep

3. PROJECT SCOPE

The service provider will have to supply and deliver feed for animals to the City of Tshwane resorts.

The service can be required at any of the City of Tshwane's resorts.

4. DELIVERABLES

A feeding programme will be supplied to the tenderer to ensure that the different items are delivered in accordance with a set schedule. However, some of the items must be delivered weekly / monthly.

The service provider must provide all the products and deliver it to applicable reserves and resorts

All feed must be of good quality and without any pests and/or mould.

4.1. CONDITIONS OF THE ANIMAL FEED CONTRACT

- The service provider must fulfil the entire contract within the specified time frame.
- It is the responsibility of the service provider to deliver and off load the animal feed.
- It is the responsibility of the service provider to ensure that animal feed is of good quality. And to certify that none of the products are rotten and free of pests.
- It is the responsibility of the service provider to ensure that all legal requirements, if any, are met with the delivery of the animal feed.
- Preference will be given to companies in Gauteng'.

4.2. TIME FRAMES

It will also be expected from the service provider to supply and deliver the animal feed within the time frames agreed upon beforehand.

5. STAGES OF EVALUATION

This bid will be evaluated in the following three stages:

Stage 1: Administrative compliance

Stage 2: Mandatory

Stage 3: Preference point system

5.1 ADMINISTRATIVE COMPLIANCE

All the bids will be evaluated against the administrative responsiveness requirements as set out in the list of returnable documents.

5.3. PREFERENCE POINT SYSTEM

The 80/20 preference point system, in terms of the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act, 2000 (Act 5 of 2000) Regulations 2017, will be applicable.

- 80 points for price
- 20 points for B-BBEE status (the service provider must submit a certified copy of the B-BBEE level rating certificate)

7. MARKET ANALYSIS

The city of Tshwane reserves the right to conduct market analysis. Should the city exercise this option, where a tenderer offers a price that is deemed not to be viable to supply goods or services as required, written confirmation will be made with the tenderer if they will be able to deliver on the price, if a tenderer confirm that they cannot, The tenderer will be disqualified on the basis of being non-responsive. If they confirm that they can deliver, a tight contract to mitigate the risk of non-performance will be entered into with the service provider. Further action on failures by the supplier to deliver will be handled in terms of the contract including performance warnings and listing on the database of restricted suppliers.

The city further reserves the right to negotiate a market related price with a tenderer scoring the highest points.

If the tenderer does not agree to a market-related price, the city reserves the right to negotiate a market-related price with the tenderer scoring the second highest points, if the tenderer scoring the second highest points does not agree to a market-related price, negotiate a market-related price with the tenderer scoring the third highest points. If a market-related price is not agreed, the city reserves the right to cancel the quotation.

- invitation by an organ of state for the provision of services, works or goods, through price quotations, advertised competitive bidding processes or proposals;
- (e) "Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act" means the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act, 2003 (Act No. 53 of 2003) as amended by Act No 46 of 2013:
- (f) "comparative price" means the price after the factors of a non-firm price and all unconditional discounts that can be utilized have been taken into consideration:
- (g) "consortium or joint venture" means an association of persons for the purpose of combining their expertise, property, capital, efforts, skill and knowledge in an activity for the execution of a contract;
- (h) "contract" Error! Bookmark not defined. means the agreement that results from the acceptance of a bid by an organ of state;
- (i) "EME" means an Exempted Micro Enterprise as defines by Codes of Good Practice issued in terms of section 9 (1) of the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act, 2003 (Act No. 53 of 2003);
- (j) "Firm price" means the price that is only subject to adjustments in accordance with the actual increase or decrease resulting from the change, imposition, or abolition of customs or excise duty and any other duty, levy, or tax, which, in terms of the law or regulation, is binding on the contractor and demonstrably has an influence on the price of any supplies, or the rendering costs of any service, for the execution of the contract;
- (k) "functionality" means the measurement according to predetermined norms, as set out in the bid documents, of a service or commodity that is designed to be practical and useful, working or operating, taking into account, among other factors, the quality, reliability, viability and durability of a service and the technical capacity and ability of a bidder;
- (I) "non-firm prices" means all prices other than "firm" prices;
- (m) "person" includes a juristic person;
- (n) "QSE" means a Qualifying Small Enterprise as defines by Codes of Good Practice issued in terms of section 9 (1) of the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act, 2003 (Act No. 53 of 2003);

- 3.3 Points scored must be rounded off to the nearest 2 decimal places.
- In the event that two or more bids have scored equal total points, the successful bid must be the one scoring the highest number of preference points for B-BBEE.
- 3.5 However, when functionality is part of the evaluation process and two or more bids have scored equal points including equal preference points for B-BBEE, the successful bid must be the one scoring the highest score for functionality.
- 3.6 Should two or more bids be equal in all respects, the award shall be decided by the drawing of lots.
