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1. Introduction

Siyathemba Local Municipality hereby invites suitably qualified and accredited service providers to submit proposals for the provision of laboratory testing and analytical services for municipal water and wastewater systems. The appointed service provider will enter into a three-year service contract to support the Municipality's strict compliance with national water quality standards and environmental regulations.

2. Objectives

The objective of this contract is to ensure:

- 2.1 Consistent, accurate monitoring of water and wastewater quality.
- 2.2 Full Compliance with SANS 241:2015 and other applicable regulatory standards.
- 2.3 Timely reporting and expert advisory support for implementing corrective actions.
- 2.4 Seamless Integration of All laboratory data into municipal IT systems for improved oversight and audit readiness.

3. Scope of Services

The successful bidder will be required to perform the following Services:

- 3.1 Conduct Routine Regular and Unscheduled Sampling from designated municipal sites, including but not limited to Water Treatment Works, Reservoirs, Clinics and Sewage Discharge points.
- 3.2 Maintain the Emergency Sampling capacity with a maximum response time of eight (8) hours from the request. Adhere to strict protocols to preserve sample integrity during rapid collection and transport in emergency scenarios.
- 3.3 Perform Comprehensive Testing of Water and Wastewater Samples using SANAS-accredited methods in accordance with ISO/IEC 17025:2017.
- 3.4 Analytical microbiological, chemical and physical parameters as stipulated by SANS 241:2015 and other relevant standards and Conduct validation, verification and document measurement uncertainty requirements.
- 3.5 Establish and Propose internal quality control procedures. Participate in proficiency testing programs and use appropriate reference materials to ensure the accuracy and reliability of test results.
- 3.6 Propose a program to ensure that all municipal laboratory personnel possess the required qualifications and competencies. The program must include ongoing training and competency assessments to maintain technical proficiency.
- 3.7 Provide a plan for the management of municipal equipment, calibration and the maintenance and performance verification of all municipal laboratory equipment to guarantee reliable testing outcomes.
- 3.8 In emergency sampling scenarios, adhere to strict protocols that preserve sample integrity during rapid collection and transport.

4. Reporting and Data Management

The service provider shall be responsible for:

- 4.1 Submitting Detailed Analytical Reports within agreed-upon turnaround times.
- 4.2 Immediate Notification of Non-Compliance or potential Health Risks.
- 4.3 Monthly and annual summary Reports based on SANS standards, highlighting trends and anomalies.
- 4.4 Provide data in formats compatible with municipal digital platforms and audit systems.
- 4.5 Maintain data integrity through secure transmission, regular backup and long-term storage of analytical data, compatible with municipal digital platforms and audit systems.

5. Location and Accessibility Requirements

- 5.1. The service provider must demonstrate capacity to respond to urgent requests within eight (8) hours.
- 5.2. Maintain laboratory facilities must be maintained under controlled environmental conditions, ensuring compliance with relevant laboratory standards to support valid and consistent testing.

6. Contract Period

- 6.1 The contract will be valid for a period of thirty-six (36) months from the date of award.
- 6.2 Performance will be reviewed annually. The contract includes provisions for renewal or termination based on service delivery and compliance.

7. Minimum Requirements

Bidders must meet the following minimum criteria to be considered:

- 7.1. Valid SANAS accreditation for relevant testing disciplines.
- 7.2. Demonstrated experience in municipal water and wastewater analysis.
- 7.3. Proven ability to meet turnaround and emergency response requirements.
- 7.4. Valid tax clearance certificate.
- 7.5. Registration on the Central Supplier Database (CSD).
- 7.6. Maintain of a formal risk Register, including root cause analysis and corrective and preventive actions to address nonconformities or testing deviations.

8. Confidentiality and Compliance

All data and reports generated under this contract shall remain the property of Siyathemba Municipality. The service provider must adhere to advanced data security protocols to protect laboratory data confidentiality, in compliance with the Protection of Personal Information Act (POPIA).

9. Penalty Conditions

The following penalties will apply for non-compliance:

- 9.1. Late reporting: A 1% penalty of the monthly fee per day, up to a maximum of 10%.
- 9.2. Use of non-accredited methods: Suspension of services and a penalty of up to 15%.
- 9.3. Emergency response delay: A 2% penalty per incident.
- 9.4. Breach of confidentiality or POPIA: Immediate contract termination and potential legal action.
- 9.5. Repeated violations: Possible contract termination and disqualification from future tenders.

Penalties will be deducted from payments or recovered through legal means as necessary.

- A detailed document addressing all aspects of the tender.
- Proof of accreditation for all relevant testing disciplines.

2. Technical and Operational Plans

- A detailed Plan outlining how the service provider will perform the services listed in the "Scope of Services" section.
- A Proposal for internal quality control procedures.
- A Program to ensure municipal laboratory personnel are qualified and competent.
- A Plan for the calibration, maintenance, and verification of all municipal laboratory equipment.
- A formal Risk Register including a plan for root cause analysis and corrective/preventive actions.
- A detailed plan outlining the protocol for emergency sampling, including the ability to meet the 8-hour response time.
- Confirmation that the primary laboratory facility is within a 500km radius of Prieska, Northern Cape.

3. Reporting and Data Management Submissions

- A Plan detailing the formats, frequency (monthly and annual), and turnaround times for all reports.
- A Plan for secure data transmission, backup, and long-term storage, including compliance with POPIA.
- A Statement confirming the ability to provide data in formats compatible with the municipality's digital platforms and audit systems.
