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SECTION 1: BACKGROUND, OVERVIEW AND RFP SCOPE OF REQUIREMENTS

1. INTRODUCTION

- 1.1. The National Lotteries Commission was established in terms of the Lotteries Act No. 57 of 1997, as amended (Lotteries Act) to regulate the National Lottery as well as other lotteries and societies.
- 1.2. The NLC aims to ensure that funds raised through the National Lottery are distributed equitably and expeditiously across South Africa in order to advance social upliftment of communities in need with the aim of addressing poverty and reducing inequalities in line with the National Development Plan.
- 1.3. The Commission is required to apply principles of openness and transparency in the exercise of its functions assigned to it in terms of the Lotteries Act No 57 of 1997.

2. BACKGROUND

The National Lotteries Commission (NLC), is a public entity established in terms of Lotteries Act No. 57 of 1997, as amended to regulate the South African lotteries industry. The functions of the Commission are divided into two categories, namely regulation of the National Lottery, other Lotteries and sport pools and administration of the National Lottery Distribution Trust Fund (NLDTF).

The NLC is required to establish a platform where NLC staff, stakeholders and members of the public can report allegations of fraud and corruption anonymously. In line with the requirements of the Public Finance Management Act No. 1 of 1999 ("PFMA") and Treasury Regulations, the NLC seeks to engage the services of a duly qualified service provider to provide and manage the whistleblowing hotline for a period of 3 (three) years.

3. THE OBJECTIVE OF THIS PROJECT

The primary objectives of the service required are as follows:

- 3.1. The primary objective of the ToR is to appoint a suitably qualified and experienced service provider to provide and manage, 24 hours per day, 7 days a week and 365 days a year (24/7/365) whistleblowing hotline for the NLC.
- 3.2. The whistleblowing hotline will provide staff, beneficiaries, and other stakeholders with an alternative reporting mechanism for allegations of fraud and corruption. The data received from the hotline will assist the NLC in combating all fraud related incidences relating to the national lottery, other lotteries and sports pools.

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4. METHODOLOGY

4.1. The Service Provider must clearly outline and explain the methodology that will be used to conduct forensic investigations at the NLC (no textbook explanation) stipulate the approach and provide a step-by-step explanation of the proposed process.

5. SCOPE OF WORK

The scope of work entails the following:

- (a) Providing the technological infrastructure for the operation of the whistleblowing hotline.
- (b) Take over the current whistleblowing hotline telephone number, short message service (SMS) number, and facsimile number (switching and related cost to be borne by the service provider).
- (c) Ability to operate the call center 24/7/365;
- (d) Have multi lingual capabilities, preferably in all eleven (11) official languages;
- (e) Ensure protection and confidentiality of information and the whistleblowers;
- (f) Provide the NLC with the use of a FreeCall number for its stakeholders in South Africa;
- (g) Retain / Secure the existing NLC Fraud Hotline number 0800 21 21 29 (for consistency);
- (h) Provides a unique email address;
- (i) Make generic FreePost and FreeFax facilities available to the NLC
- (j) Provide the NLC with access to a Case Management Application, to enable the NLC to receive its tip-off cases.
- (k) Provide reports, which are electronically uploaded onto the Case Management Application, within 24 (Twenty-four) hours of receipt during weekdays, or within 36 (thirty-six) hours following a weekend or South African public holiday or distributed to the NLC via e-mail within the same timeframes.
- (I) Translate calls, made in any South African official language, into English
- (m) Uploads electronically via the Case Management Application and/or sent via e-mail to the NLC in accordance with the reporting structure protocols maintained by service provider, as advised by the NLC.
- (n) Make available a Call Summary Report to the NLC on the Case Management Application, summarising its tip-offs received by service provider during the period in question.

6. DELIVERABLES

6.1. The service provider should provide whistleblowing hotline technological infrastructure and reports on allegations of fraud and corruption at a frequency determined by the NLC.

7. REPORTING REQUIREMENTS

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The service provider will report to the Office of the Chief Audit Executive.

SECTION 2: NOTICE TO BIDDERS

1. Terms and conditions of Request for Proposals (RFP)

- 1.1 This document may contain confidential information that is the property of the NLC.
- 1.2 No part of the contents may be used, copied, disclosed, or conveyed in whole or in part to any party in any manner whatsoever other than for preparing a proposal in response to this RFP without prior written permission from the NLC.
- 1.3 All copyright and intellectual property herein vests with the NLC.
- 1.4 Late and incomplete submissions will not be accepted.
- 1.5 No services must be rendered, or goods delivered before an official NLC Purchase Order form has been received.
- 1.6 This RFP will be evaluated in terms of the 80/20 preference point system.
- 1.7 Suppliers are required to register on the Central Supplier Database at www.csd.gov.za.
- 1.8 Suppliers must provide their CSD registration number (and attach a CSD Registration report) and ensure that the tax matters are compliant.
- 1.9 All questions regarding this RFP must be forwarded to penelope@nlcsa.org.za
- 1.10 Any supplier who has reasons to believe that the RFP specification is based on a specific brand mustinform the NLC via the email addressed in 1.9.

2. General rules and instructions

- 2.1 News and press releases
- 2.1.1 Bidders or their agents shall not make any news releases concerning this RFP or the awarding of the same or any resulting agreement(s) without the consent of, and then only in co-ordination with, the NLC.
- 2.2 Precedence of documents
- 2.2.1 This RFP consists of several sections. Where there is a contradiction in terms between the clauses, phrases, words, stipulations, or terms and herein referred to generally as stipulations in this RFP and the stipulations in any other document attached hereto, or the RFP submitted hereto, the relevant stipulations in this RFP shall take precedence.
- 2.2.2 Where this RFP is silent on any matter, the relevant stipulations addressing such matter, and which appearin section 217 of the constitution of the republic shall take precedence. Bidders shall refrain from incorporating any additional stipulations in its proposal submitted in terms hereof other than in the form of a clearly marked recommendation that the NLC may in its sole discretion elect to import or to ignore. Any such inclusion shall not be used for any purpose of interpretation unless it has been

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so imported or acknowledged by the NLC.

2.2.3 It remains the exclusive domain and election of the NLC as to which of these stipulations are applicable and to what extent. Bidders are hereby acknowledging that the decision of the commission in this regard is final and binding. The onus to enquire and obtain clarity in this regard rests with the Bidder(s). The Bidder(s) shall take care to restrict its enquiries in this regard to the most reasonable interpretations required to ensure the necessary consensus.

2.3 Preferential procurement reform

- 2.3.1 The Commission supports B-BBEE as an essential ingredient of its business. In accordance with government policy, the NLC insists that the private sector demonstrates its commitment and track record to B-BBEE in the areas of ownership (shareholding), skills transfer, employment equity and procurement practices (SMME Development) etc.
- 2.4 National Industrial Participation Programme
- 2.4.1 The Industrial Participation policy, which was endorsed by Cabinet on 30 April 1997, is applicable to contracts that have an imported content. The NIP is obligatory and therefore must be complied with. Bidders are required to sign and submit the Standard Bidding Document (SBD).

2.5 Language

2.5.1 Bids shall be submitted in English.

2.6 Gender

2.6.1 Any word implying any gender shall be interpreted to imply all other genders.

2.7 Headings

- 2.7.1 Headings are incorporated into this RFP document and submitted in response thereto, for ease of reference only and shall not form part thereof for any purpose of interpretation or for any other purpose.
- 2.8 Occupational Injuries and Diseases Act 13 of 1993
- 2.8.1 The Bidder warrants that all its employees (including the employees of any sub-contractor that may be appointed) are covered in terms of the Compensation for Occupational Injuries and Diseases Act 13 of 1993 and that the cover shall remain in force for the duration of the adjudication of this RFP and/ or subsequent agreement. the commission reserves the right to request the Bidder to submit documentary proof of the Bidder's registration and "good standing" with the Compensation Fund, or similar proofacceptable to the commission.

2.9 Processing of the Bidder's Personal Information

- 2.9.1 All Personal Information of the Bidder, its employees, representatives, associates and sub-contractors ("Bidder Personal Information") required under this RFP is collected and processed for the purpose of assessing the content of its tender proposal and awarding the bid. The Bidder is advised that Bidder Personal Information may be passed on to third parties to whom the commission is compelled by law to provide such information. For example, where appropriate, the commission is compelled to submit information to National Treasury's Database of Restricted Suppliers.
- 2.9.2 All Personal Information collected will be processed in accordance with POPIA and with the commission Data Privacy Policy.
- 2.9.3 The following persons will have access to the Personal Information collected:
- 2.9.3.1 The commission personnel participating in procurement/award procedures; and
- 2.9.3.2 Members of the public: within seven working days from the time the bid is awarded, the following information will have to be made available on National Treasury's e-Tender portal:
- 2.9.3.2.1 contract description and bid number.
- 2.9.3.2.2 names of the successful bidder(s) and preference points claimed.
- 2.9.3.2.3 the contract price(s) (if possible).
- 2.9.3.2.4 contract period.
- 2.9.3.2.5 names of directors; and
- 2.9.3.2.6 date of completion/award.
- 2.9.4 The commission will ensure that the rights of the Bidder and of its employees and representatives (i.e., the right of access and the right to rectify) are effectively guaranteed in accordance with the procedures as specified in the commission PAIA manual.
- 2.9.5 In signing this document, the Bidder consents to the use of its Personal Information for the purposes as specified in section 2.9.1 above.

3. Formal Briefing Session

3.1 No briefing session.

4. Validity Period

- 4.1 The Commission requires a validity period of 120 [one hundred and twenty] Business Days [from closing date] against this RFP.
- 4.2 Bidders are to note that they may be requested to extend the validity period of their bids, on the same terms and conditions, if the internal evaluation process are not finalised within the validity period.

5. National Treasury's Central Supplier Database

5.1 Bidders are required to self-register on National Treasury's Central Supplier Database (CSD) which has been established to centrally administer supplier information for all organs of state and facilitate

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the verification of certain key supplier information.

- 5.2 The Commission may not award business to a bidder who has failed to register on the CSD.
- 5.3 Only foreign suppliers with no local registered entity need not register on the CSD.
- 5.4 The CSD can be accessed at https://secure.csd.gov.za/

6. Confidentiality

- 6.1 Bids submitted for this Request for Proposals will not be revealed to any other bidders and will be treated as contractually binding;
- 6.2 The Commission reserves all the rights afforded to it by the POPIA in the processing of any of its information as contained in Bid Proposals.
- 6.3 The Bidder acknowledges that it will obtain and have access to personal information of The NLC and agrees that it shall only process the information disclosed by the NLC in terms of this bid award and only for the purposes as detailed in this RFP and in accordance with any applicable law.
- 6.4 The Bidder shall notify the NLC in writing of any unauthorised access to personal information and the information of a third party, through cybercrimes or suspected cybercrimes, in its knowledge and report such crimes or suspected crimes to the relevant authorities in accordance with applicable laws, after becoming aware of such.

7. Communication

- 7.1 Specific queries relating to this RFP should be submitted penelope@nlcsa.org.za, before the closing date.
- 7.2 In the interest of fairness and transparency the NLC's response to such a query may be made available to other bidders.
- 7.3 It is prohibited for bidders to attempt, either directly or indirectly, to canvass any officer or employee of the NLC in respect of this RFP between the closing date and the date of the award of the business.
- 7.4 Bidders found to be in collusion with one another will be automatically disqualified and restricted from doing business with organs of state for a specified period.

SECTION 3: EVALUATION CRITERIA

The NLC will evaluate all proposals in terms of the Preferential Procurement Regulation of 2017 and Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act. No.5 of 2000 (PPPFA). A three (3) phase evaluation process will be considered in evaluating the proposals, being:
