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
SCOPE OF WORK

The new TAP aggregators should be able to scale to a 3-tier architecture, with the ability to add advanced services, analytics and recorder nodes.

Respondents of RFP should describe and illustrate the replacing of the three TAP aggregators. The proposed solution should easily scale in terms of design and architecture to accommodate future expansion/scalability requirements (without replacing current investment).

Without replacing the newly acquired three (3) TAP aggregators, the proposed future solution should provide a single pane of glass with a scale-out 3-tier architecture for a monitoring fabric that provides connectivity to allow more than 256 tap/span ports, over 64 ports for tool ports, ability to add in the future advanced services, analytics and recorder nodes. An example of a proposed architecture solution illustrated in the next figure 1.

Figure 1. Proposed TAP aggregators with 3-Tier Solution Architecture



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- Three TAP aggregators to replace the existing equipment.
 Replacing them with TAP aggregators that will allow them to scale to a 3-tier architecture as previously mentioned. They must have the ability to add advanced services, analytics and recorder nodes.
- The proposed solution should be covered by five (5) Years 24x7 OEM support with Next Business Day (NBD) hardware replacement
- All subscription-based licenses must cover 5 Years.
- Purchase OEM professional services to commission afterhours the new TAP aggregators.
 The migration of old filter rules (plus minus a 1000 rules on one port, with smaller filter
 groups on the other ports) to the new devices. A duration of three (3) months will be required
 for troubleshooting config errors in the environment.
- From time to time Eskom will require professional services to perform
 - o A deep dive on packet traces and perform analysis on it.
 - o To provide an in-dependent report of the problem with recommendations.
 - Period Over 5 years with 50 hours per year (250 Hours).
- OEM approved Training and exam vouchers for six (6) operational staff members.
- Eskom requires high-end devices that are capable of multiple 1/10/40/100Gig connections with SFP/SFP+/QSFP, license, support and maintenance. The ability to aggregate, replicate and capture traffic at line rate for analysis without affecting production flows.
- Any-to-any packet replication at 1/10/25/100Gbps. Copy traffic to multiple tools for analysis in any size network from single rack to large cloud infrastructures.
- Delivery of 48 ports of 25Gig per device (for the three TAP aggregators), which can scale between 1/10/25Gig, with 144x10GBASE-SR SFP+ (Short Reach)
- Delivery of 10 ports of 100Gig per device (for the three TAP aggregators) with 10x100GBASE-SWDM4 QSFP transceiver, up to 70m over Duplex OM3
- Extensive L2/3/4 & DPI hardware filtering for traffic identification and redistribution at wirerate on all ports.
- Graphical Interface for configuration and monitor of TAP aggregation, the topology view of groups and the associations of it.
- Devices need to be separate physical devices.

Training / Transfer of skills:

Train up to six (6) Eskom Staff on how to configure, operate and to certify on the new product will be required.

OEM training and Certified Exam Vouchers for six (6) People - Access to Online/Remote training to book classes to train.

1. GENERAL CONDITIONS

- 1.1 The following preference point systems are applicable to all bids:
 - the 80/20 system for requirements with a Rand value of up to R50 000 000 (all applicable taxes included); and
 - a) The value of this bid is estimated to exceed/not exceed R50 000 000 (all applicable taxes included) and therefore the 80/20 preference point system shall be applicable;
 - b) Either the 80/20 preference point system will be applicable to this tender (*delete whichever is not applicable for this tender*).
- 1.2 Points for this bid shall be awarded for:
 - (a) Price; and
 - (b) B-BBEE Status Level of Contributor.
- 1.3 The maximum points for this bid are allocated as follows:

1.4 Failure on the part of a bidder to submit proof of B-BBEE Status level of contributor together with the bid, will be interpreted to mean that preference points for B-BBEE status level of contribution are not claimed.

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1.5 The purchaser reserves the right to require of a bidder, either before a bid is adjudicated or at any time subsequently, to substantiate any claim in regard to preferences, in any manner required by the purchaser.

2. **DEFINITIONS**

- (a) **"B-BBEE"** means broad-based black economic empowerment as defined in section 1 of the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act;
- (b) "B-BBEE status level of contributor" means the B-BBEE status of an entity in terms of a code of good practice on black economic empowerment, issued in terms of section 9(1) of the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act;
- (c) "bid" means a written offer in a prescribed or stipulated form in response to an invitation by an organ of state for the provision of goods or services, through price quotations, advertised competitive bidding processes or proposals;
- (d) "Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act" means the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act, 2003 (Act No. 53 of 2003);
- (e) "EME" means an Exempted Micro Enterprise in terms of a code of good practice on black economic empowerment issued in terms of section 9 (1) of the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act;
- (f) "functionality" means the ability of a tenderer to provide goods or services in accordance with specifications as set out in the tender documents.
- (g) "prices" includes all applicable taxes less all unconditional discounts;
- (h) "proof of B-BBEE status level of contributor" means:
 - 1) B-BBEE Status level certificate issued by an authorized body or person;
 - 2) A sworn affidavit as prescribed by the B-BBEE Codes of Good Practice;
 - 3) Any other requirement prescribed in terms of the B-BBEE Act;
 - "QSE" means a qualifying small business enterprise in terms of a code of good practice on black economic empowerment issued in terms of section 9 (1) of the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act;
- (j) "rand value" means the total estimated value of a contract in Rand, calculated at the time of bid invitation, and includes all applicable taxes;

3. POINTS AWARDED FOR PRICE

3.1 THE 80/20 PREFERENCE POINT SYSTEMS

A maximum of 80 points is allocated for price on the following basis: 80/20

 or $Ps = 90\left(1 - \frac{Pt - P\min}{P\min}\right)$

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Where

Ps = Points scored for price of bid under consideration

Pt = Price of bid under consideration

Pmin = Price of lowest acceptable bid

4.1 In terms of Regulation 6 (2) and 7 (2) of the Preferential Procurement Regulations, preference points must be awarded to a bidder for attaining the B-BBEE status level of contribution in accordance with the table below:
