2. COMPANY OVERVIEW

South African Broadcasting Corporation (SABC) is a Public Entity founded in August 1936 and listed in terms of Schedule 2 of the Public Finance Management Act, Act No. 1 of 1999, as a public broadcaster in South Africa, and provides 19 radio stations as well as five television broadcasts to the general public.

3. BACKGROUND

SABC Limpopo is looking for a reputable service provider to repair, service and maintain our security systems at our Polokwane and Thohoyandou Office for a period of Five (5) years. Some of the equipment requires repair work and thereafter the servicing and maintenance of the said equipment.

The SABC was declared as a National Key Points (NKP) site on 11 August 2006 under the National Key Point Act, Act 102 of 1980. The South African Broadcasting Corporation SOC Limited (SABC) in terms of the Control of Access to Public Premises and Vehicle Act 53 of 1985 and National Key Points Act, No 102 of 1980, as amended. SABC has employed various security technologies throughout its sites to ensure the security of its personnel, visitors and infrastructure and to comply with the National Key Point Act

4. REQUIREMENTS AND SCOPE OF SERVICES

Polokwane Scope of services

The Polokwane Office requires the Repairs, Service and Maintenance of below Equipment's on a bi-annual basis. In addition, refresher training on the use of the security equipment for SABC staff and Security Personnel is required at each service interval.

4.1 Repair Works required on the following equipment:

- CCTV Camera repair (Quantity of 28)
- Replace magnets for studio doors, MCR and all critical areas (Quantity of 11). Commission the doors to a working condition
- Repair biometric/card readers (Quantity of 14)
- Repair spiked boom gates (Quantity of 3)
- Repair the booth at the parking entrance
- Assessment of the installed system and ensure its optimal utilization

4.2 Service and Maintenance work required on the following equipment:

- CCTV Cameras (x67 Indigo Vision cameras)
- CCTV Servers (2x Dahua N)
- Access control enrolment machines for loading users and visitors (3x Computers)
- Access Control System (Softcon Softwin3 with CR391 controllers)
- Access Control Biometric Readers (54x Morpho J-series readers, 4x MA520 readers)
- Access Control Spiked Security Booms (3x)
- Access Control Security Booth (1x)

- Access Control Speedstiles (4x Turnstar Speedstiles)
- Access Control Paraplegic Gate (1x Turnstar Special needs gate)
- Electric fence (Nemtek Merlin 4)
- Automated main entrance door

4.3 Repairs, Service and Maintenance works required on the following equipment

- X Ray machines (2x WG IS5335 X-ray machines)
- Metal detectors (3x Saflec Popular 2000)

4.4 Gate Motor and Remote repairs service and Maintenance

- 2x Centurion (D10) gate motors.
- 2x Centurion (D5) gate motors.

Thohoyandou Scope of Service

The Thohoyandou Office requires the Repairs, Service and Maintenance of below Equipment's on a bi-annual basis. In addition, refresher training on the use of the security equipment for SABC and Security Personnel staff is required at each service interval.

4.5 Service and Maintenance works required on the following equipment:

- CCTV Cameras (Hikvision 4MP Network Cameras, Quantity x4)
- CCTV NVR (Hikvision 32-Channel Embedded NVR, Quantity x1)
- CCTV Operator viewing station
- Access control enrolment machine for loading users (1x Computers)
- Access Control System (Sifton Softwin3 with CR391 controllers)
- Access Control Biometric Readers (4x Morpho Sigma-series readers)

4.6 Gate Motor and Remote repairs service and Maintenance

- 1x Centurion (D5) gate motors.

4.7 Staff Expertise

- At least One **(1) Supervisor**, comprehensive CVs must show a **minimum of 5 years'** experience in servicing and maintenance of CCTV and access control.
- At least One **(1) Technician**, comprehensive CVs with a **minimum of 3 years'** experience in servicing and maintenance of CCTV and access control.
- AND at least One **(1) Technician**, comprehensive CVs with a **minimum of 3 years'** experience in servicing and maintenance **X-ray** machines.

5.1 The Maintenance Contract shall be divided in Eleven parts as follows:

5.1.1 Preventative Maintenance

A bi-annual preventative maintenance visit that allows a technician to carry out a complete audit/ Check the Access control system, the documentation associated with the CCTV system, and the training requirements of users where necessary. The Access control system should receive at least bi-annual major preventative maintenance visit each year. However, additional maintenance visits may be required depending on the complexity of the system, the environmental conditions, and the need to change 'perishable items.

In addition.

- The technician should complete a maintenance report whilst carrying out preventative maintenance of access control system.
- The report should list any deviations of the system from the fully functional state, and should list relevant comments about the system
- The report will help the SABC and/or user to monitor the reliability of the access control system to ensure the system meets its original purpose and will assist the budgeting of any replacement parts required in the future.
- A copy of the report should be made available to the SABC's Logistics Manager on completion of each maintenance for record and further attention purposes either by way of e-mails or hard copies.

All preventative maintenance work shall be scheduled by the SABC or its authorized representative and communicated to the Contractor. When the maintenance is due the authorized SABC representative will issue a job card to the contractor and together shall perform the necessary planning and preparations for the successful execution of the work. Work shall be scheduled in a manner so as not to interfere with any normal operations of the SABC. On completion of work the SABC representative, together with the contractor, shall inspect the work and if both parties are satisfied with the work done both shall sign off the job card together with the maintenance reports.

The appointed service provider will be required to work and cooperate with other contractors on site whenever it is necessary for the purpose of installation, maintenance, faulty findings and repairs. Normal operational hours on site shall be **from 08:00 to 16:30** for every working day, Monday to Friday. No planned maintenance work will be allowed to be performed on Weekends or Public holidays unless prior approval is received from the SABC or authorized representative.

A. Access Control and Speed Stiles:

- i) Adhoc servicing and repairs of the security equipment (Speed stiles, Single security booth with metal detector, CCTV Cameras, Metal detectors, X-ray machines, electric fencing, Motorised gates and associated equipment; as well as problem solving on the Softcon Access Control Software to ensure optimal operation of all equipment and software.
- ii) **Respond to callouts to do fault finding and quote on repairs/replacements when required**
 - Check motors and all moving parts of the turnstiles

- Check all electrical parts and operation of the turnstiles
- Lubricate parts where required
- The service provider will be expected to replace all the parts and components as necessary (Quoted separately)
- Service providers must have specialised knowledge of Softcon access control software.
- Installation/Repair of access control equipment e.g. Maglocks, Biometric and card readers, controllers etc.
- Provide service reports and recommendations after each site visit.

Note: The service of this equipment is required quarterly or as and when required

B. CCTV Cameras

- Respond to callouts to do fault finding and quote on repairs/replacement when required.
- Checking cameras and CCTV (NVR) systems.
- Cleaning camera glass and lenses
- Provide service reports and recommendations after each visit.
- This contract will not include new installations. New supply and fit will go out to the market.

C. Motorized Sliding Gates

- Quarterly service of the gates motors and moving parts.
- Respond to callouts to do fault finding and quote on repairs when required.
- Check the sensors to ensure they are working properly.
- Check the gate wheels, bearings and replace if worn out.
- Lubricate parts and oil where required.
- Check the batteries and charger if they are fully functional, repair or replace if required
- The service provider will be expected to replace all the parts and components as necessary (quoted separately)
- Provide service reports and recommendations after each visit.

Note: The service of this equipment is required quarterly or as and when required.

D. Security Boom Gates

Respond to callouts to do fault finding and quote on repairs/replacements when required

- Inspect and lubricate mechanical components (boom arm, pivot, springs).
- Check and test motors, actuators, and power supply (including UPS/battery backup if applicable).
- Verify control systems, sensors (loop detectors, photo beams), and safety devices.
- Test access devices (RFID readers if any, keypads, remotes) and integration with access control systems.

- Clean housings, remove debris, and check environmental seals.
- Perform functional and safety tests, including emergency release and fail-safe modes.
- Provide service reports and recommendations after each visit.

Note: The service of this equipment is required quarterly or as and when required.

E. Motorized Sliding Doors:

Yearly and Adhoc servicing of motorized sliding doors.

Respond to callout to fault finding and quote on repairs when required

- Check and service motor and all moving parts including replacement if necessary
- Check the tension belts
- Check the wheel track
- Check the functionality of the sensors

Treatment of rust on all gates including electrical connections. Service provider should provide the warranty on all replaced parts and services rendered.

Note: Service rates shall apply for all preventative maintenance as per values agreed on the maintenance contract. The Contractor shall not be entitled to claim for payment for scheduled items that have not been included in the monthly schedule and approved by the Employer or his representative. SABC reserves the right to remove security equipment from the schedule due to changes in operational requirements and the contract amount will be adjusted accordingly.

5.1.2 Reactive Maintenance

SABC or its authorized representative will report any CCTV, Access Control, Security Equipment' and/or associated equipment faults or breakdowns which may occur to the contractor. All emergencies will be reported telephonically and then followed by a job card. Any other maintenance will be communicated in writing and a repair job card will be transmitted to the Contractor. The Contractor shall respond promptly to the complaint and restore the equipment to functional status in accordance with the assigned priority level. On completion of work the SABC representative together with the contractor shall inspect the work and if both parties are satisfied with the work done both shall sign off the job card together with the detailed report for the repairs.

Response Time

Response time shall be measured as the time taken from reporting the call, to the time taken by the artisan to arrive at the relevant piece of equipment.

The response to call outs shall be categorized according to the need for urgency in attending to the call out. All breakdowns **during and after working hours** shall be responded to as follows:

(a) Emergency Response

This shall be defined as an event that requires an immediate response or action to prevent and or mitigate against equipment damage, harm or injury to persons or property or to limit the disruption of services. The Contractor shall respond to an emergency call-out within **2hour**.

(b) Urgent Response

This shall mean any failure or repair requirement that could significantly affect the services or pose a danger if left unattended for a lengthy period of time. The Contractor shall respond to an urgent call-out within **4 hours**.

(c) Routine Response

This shall apply to other failures or repairs other than those requiring emergency and urgent response. These items shall be dealt with as unscheduled additional work items as requested by the SABC or authorized representative.

Any breakdown impacting on operations shall be attended-to until restored to good reliable condition. This implies that no breakdown may be left unattended or incomplete for the next day.

SABC will hold the Contractor liable for any costs incurred as a result of negligence or unreasonable poor performance by the Contractor including excessive time taken to effect repairs.

The Contractor shall attend to all callouts and/or ad-hoc maintenance and the response time shall be as stipulated on the service level agreement. Where the Contractor is called out for faults or requested to provide a service, the Contractor shall only be paid for the labour, materials and services that have been rendered during the call out or request of service and unscheduled rates shall apply. Where the service contractor is required to provide spares or services not included in the bill of quantities, the Contractor shall first submit a quote for approval, and may only provide the spares and services after approval has been granted in writing and a % mark-up shall apply for all third-party items, services and spares.

The following services will be performed by the appointed services provider:

- General routine repairs and replacement of defective equipment on planned and emergency basis.
- Provide technical support for controllers and advise SABC on solutions
- Provide technical support on newly installed and future security equipment.
- Compile procedures and drawings on an ad-hoc basis when required.
- Perform equipment failure investigations and Root Cause Analysis
- Submit detailed report on breakdowns and repairs
- Training of internal staff and security personnel

5.1.3 Modifications/ Improvement Process

- Contractors shall assume the costs incurred by SABC, as a result of defective supplies, services or product liability issues.
- Any change to the original service or product design must be approved by SABC prior to implementation.

- A Request for Change needs to be submitted to SABC and approved prior to implementing the change.
- The Contractor shall keep records of all requests and corresponding SABC approvals.

5.1.4 **Performance Management**

- Once deliveries of the component, system, or service have initiated, SABC will monitor the Contractor's performance to establish a trend of Continuous Improvement.
- Quality of service or material and On-Time Delivery shall be the minimum metrics to be tracked for Contractor performance.
- Resolution of non-conformances in the service to SABC will be addressed in a manner that will best support SABC 's standard requirements.
- Expenses associated with Contractor non-conformances will be the responsibility of the Contractor.

I. **Key Performance Indicators**

SABC will monitor Contractor's performance and report on it on a regular basis. Contractor's Performance Indicators are as follows:

- Service Quality: % defect free deliveries received
- On-time delivery: % of complete service delivery and on time, based on agreed standards.
- Adherence to agreed response times

Contractors are expected to work with SABC to improve performance and/or process capability where needed.

In case of repeated poor performance or failure to improve, the contract shall be terminated.

II. **Containment of Non-Conformity Supply of Service**

In the event a non-conforming material, component, system, or service is detected, SABC or its authorized representative will determine the best method of securing conformity to meet SABC's requirements such as:

- Return the entire lot of non-conforming material, component or systems to Contractor.
- Contractor to sort/rework/repair the non-conformance at SABC sites.
- SABC to identify an external resource (certified by SABC to perform, sort/rework/repair at the cost of the Contractor).

5.1.5 **Cost Recovery**

- Contractors shall assume the costs incurred by SABC, as a result of defective supplies, services or product liability issues.
- Damage caused by contractor activities or employees shall be for the contractor's account.

5.1.6 **Warranty**

- The warranty period shall be 12 months for all repairs and spares supplied by the service provider

5.1.7 **Key Personnel**

- A schedule of key personnel to this Contract (as per the Schedules) will be provided to the Authorized SABC Representative at commencement of this Contract. This will, as a minimum, include all persons to

management level. For the full duration of this Contract, none of these persons will be replaced by a person of lesser ability or qualification. All on- site staff leaves shall be reported and agreed with the Engineer. The Authorized SABC Representative may request the replacement of any person with unsatisfactory performance or who fails to comply with this contract.

5.1.8 Management of Meetings

- The Contractor will attend meetings relating to maintenance, operations, contract management and other issues that may arise from time to time. As far as is practicable, the Contractor will make all required persons available for these meetings. The Contractor shall not submit claims for payment for staff attending any of these meetings.

5.1.9 Communication

- Work instructions, monthly maintenance reports, breakdown reports, etc. will all be in a format as agreed with the Authorized SABC Representative.

5.1.10 Health, Safety & Environment

The appointed service provider shall comply with SABC's Health and Safety Systems.

- All persons on company premises shall obey all health and safety rules, procedures and practices. In particular, NO SMOKING signs and the prohibition of the carrying of smoking materials in designated areas shall always be obeyed.
- The Contractor shall be fully responsible for compliance to the Occupational Health and Safety Act for all persons and equipment relating to this Contract.
- Any work involving open flames sparks, cutting or heat shall be authorised by the issue of a permit to work - obtainable from the Safety department. Any work done under the protection of a permit to work shall be in strict compliance with every prescription regarding the permit.
- Safety equipment shall be used where applicable (e.g. safety goggles, boots, harness, etc.) The Contractor, at his/her own expense shall provide such equipment, for his/her employees. The Contractor shall apply the necessary discipline and control to ensure compliance by his workers.
- All Contractors must ensure that his/her employees are familiar with the existing emergency procedures and must co-operate in any drills or exercises, which might be held. Emergency / fire equipment and extinguishers shall not be obstructed at any time.
- No person shall perform an unsafe / unhealthy act or operation whilst on Company premises.
- No unsafe/dangerous equipment or tools may be brought onto or used on Company premises. The Company reserves the right to inspect all equipment/tools at any time and to prevent/prohibit their use, without any penalty to the Company and without affecting the terms of the Contract in any way.
- Submission of the safety file: No document is required at the tendering stage. However, the safety file component should be factored in the pricing schedule to be submitted in response to the RFQ, as the preferred

service provider will be required to furnish a copy of the aforementioned file prior to commencing with commencing.

5.1.11 Environmental Management

- The appointed service provider shall comply with SABC's Environmental Systems.
- The Contractor / Service Provider remains solely responsible disposal and clean-up of any form of waste that is produced during the term of their contract at SABC.
- The Contractor / Service Provider will ensure that all waste which necessitates the safe disposal thereof, will be done in accordance with all the latest and applicable legislation (environmental etc.) governing same.
- Proof of such disposal must be submitted to SABC.

4. RFQ VALIDITY PERIOD

This bid will remain valid **90 (ninety) days** from the date of bid closing.

5. COSTING

The quotation must reflect a detailed cost breakdown, and any indirect costs associated with the delivery of the required service. Bidders are advised to use **Annexure F - Pricing Schedule**

- a) The prices and rates in the Bill of quantities for Preventative Maintenance shall be treated as being fully inclusive of all labour, tools, materials, consumables, transport, overheads, liabilities, risks, obligations and profit as incurred or required by the contractor in carrying out the item.
- b) The base rates will be adjusted in accordance with **Consumer Price Index** with effect from the **2nd, third year, Fourth and Fifth year**.
- c) Unscheduled rates shall apply during breakdowns and repairs.
- d) The provisional sum belongs to the Project Manager and shall be used on and as and when required on a proven cost basis and % mark-up shall apply for all third - party items and services. The mark-up shall be calculated on the amount for each item or service **excluding VAT**. Expenditure against the provisional sum shall be authorized by the Project Manager or his delegate.
