## A. INTRODUCTION TO THE REQUEST FOR QUOTATION

#### 1. Introduction

- 1.1 The Export Credit Insurance Corporation of South Africa (SOC) LTD (ECIC or Corporation)<sup>1</sup> is a self-sustained state-owned entity listed under Schedule 3B of the Public Finance Management Act 1 of 1999 (as amended) and established in terms of the Export Credit and Foreign Investments Insurance Act 78 of 1957 (as amended).
- 1.2 The mandate of the ECIC is to facilitate and encourage South African export trade, by underwriting export credit loans and investments outside the country, to enable South African contractors to win capital goods and services contracts in countries outside South Africa. The ECIC is a registered short-term insurer and is regulated by the Financial Sector Conduct Authority and Prudential Authority. Currently exempted in terms of FAIS Notice 78 of 2019.
- 1.3 ECIC operates from offices at Block C7 Eco Origins Office Park, 349 Witch Hazel Avenue, Highveld Ext 79, Centurion, 0157, South Africa.

## 2. Purpose

2.1 The purpose of this Request for Quotation (RFQ) is to appoint three (3) service providers with a strong access or presence on the African continent to provide credit reports for international buyers of South African goods and services.

## 3. Document(s) required to substantiate claims for Specific Goal

3.1 For this bid, bidders are requested to provide the following documents in substantiation for their claim of Specific Goals in line with the 2022 Preferential Procurement Regulations:

- 3.2 Any bid received from a bidder who did not provide the document requested in this paragraph 3 shall be awarded zero points for Specific Goals.
- 3.3 Points for Specific Goals will be allocated as indicated in paragraph 7.1.2.2 of this RFQ and in the SBD6.1 Form. Bidders are required to indicate how they claim points for each preference points on the SBD6.1 Form, in the table on page 2424 (paragraph 4.1). If a bidder does not indicate the preference points they are claiming, the bidder will be awarded zero (0) points for Specific Goals.

## B. TERMS OF REFERENCE

## 5. SCOPE OF WORK

- 5.1 The appointed bidders will be required (as and when required) to:
  - 5.1.1 Provide credit reports on various international buyers (mainly companies, juristic persons) for a period of 3 years, as and when required. The reports must be provided electronically.
  - 5.1.2 Detail the countries they cover for credit reports.
  - 5.1.3 Detail the turnaround timeframes of the credit reports.
  - 5.1.4 Provide an inclusion of express and fully investigated report timeframes and pricing thereof.
- 5.2 The credit report will contain the following information but not limited to:
  - 5.2.1 Date of report.
  - 5.2.2 Legal Name and Trading name of the Buyer.
  - 5.2.3 Registered address of the buyer.
  - 5.2.4 Date buyer established.
  - 5.2.5 Registration number.
  - 5.2.6 Description of business activities (nature of business)<sup>2</sup> and any name change.
  - 5.2.7 Present ownership relating to the company and/or group of companies
  - 5.2.8 Management/Director information.
  - 5.2.9 Legal status of buyer.
  - 5.2.10 Number of employees.
  - 5.2.11 Bank relationship(s).
  - 5.2.12 Market/public adverse information about the buyer.

- 5.2.13 Legal notices/judgments on both the company/buyer and its directors.
- 5.2.14 Credit risk ratings and credit limit recommendations.
- 5.2.15 Trade payment trends up to 4 trade references to include:
  - 5.2.15.1 Years of credit experience with the buyer (s)/off-takers
  - 5.2.15.2 Terms of sale/terms of the loan.
  - 5.2.15.3 Annual sales to buyer (s)/Off-takers.
  - 5.2.15.4 Date of last sale.
  - 5.2.15.5 Recent high credit amount.
  - 5.2.15.6 Current outstanding amount(s).
- 5.2.16 Past due amount (if any).
- 5.2.17 Days past due.

## 6. Additional information

- 6.1 Bidders are required to provide sample of the Credit Report/s. The sample will form part of evaluation process.
- 6.2 Bidders are also required to indicate which regions on the African continent they have access to. Furthermore, the bidders must also indicate which regions of the world they have access to.
- 6.3 ECIC is aware that the Banks may not be able to provide Bank Reports. However, where possible a Bank report or Bank Confirmation letter or a Full General Report or equivalent can either be provided separately.

#### 7. Bid evaluation

7.1 The proposals will be evaluated as follows:

## 7.1.1 Evaluation Phase One: Pre-qualification and compliance

- 7.1.1.1 Service provider to provide:
  - 7.1.1.1.1 A Credit Report. The report/s must be provided electronically, and the report/s must be included with the RFQ submission. The Credit report must include the following:
    - 7.1.1.1.1 Trade references of the buyer.

- 7.1.1.1.2 Company information on the buyer.
- 7.1.1.2 Details of countries covered by bidder for credit report (s) (at minimum, the service provider must be able to provide reports on the Eastern or Western or SADC regions of Africa).
- 7.1.1.3 Detail turnaround timeframes of the credit reports and pricing thereof as per below:
  - 7.1.1.3.1 Express report not exceeding 5 days working days.
  - 7.1.1.3.2 Fully investigated report not exceeding 4 weeks.
- 7.1.1.2 ECIC will only consider a bid if the relevant bidder meets the mandatory requirements listed in paragraphs 7.1.1.1.1 to 7.1.1.1.3 Where a bidder fails to meet the requirements, the bid will be considered an unacceptable bid and will be disqualified from further evaluation.

## 7.1.2 Evaluation Phase Two: Preference point system

7.1.2.1 This bid will be evaluated using the preference points system. The formula below will be used to calculate the preference procurement points for price:

$$Ps = 80 \left( 1 - \frac{Pt - Pmin}{Pmin} \right)$$

Where

Ps = Points scored for comparative price of bid under consideration Pt = Comparative price of bid or offer under consideration Pmin = Comparative price of lowest acceptable bid

7.1.2.2 ECIC will add the following points for Specific Goals in evaluating for preference points:

7.1.2.3 ECIC will identify the bidders who achieves the top three highest preference points as preferred bidders to be appointed under this RFQ

## 7.1.3 Phase Three: Objective criteria

- 7.1.3.1 In this evaluation stage, ECIC will check if the bidder has a person who meet the following criteria in awarding the bid:
  - 7.1.3.1.1 The bidder has a significant shareholder or owner (or equivalent) (directly or indirectly) who is classified or can be classified as a Prominent Influential Person (PIP) in accordance with Financial Intelligence Centre Act, 38 of 2001 (FICA).
  - 7.1.3.1.2 The bidder has a shareholder or member or owner (or equivalent) who has questionable integrity status.
  - 7.1.3.1.3 The bidder has a director or equivalent who is classified or can be classified as a PIP in accordance with FICA.
- 7.1.3.2 Should it be found during this evaluation stage, that the bidder who has attained the highest points under Evaluation Stage Two (Preference Point System) has persons listed in paragraphs to, ECIC reserves the right to conduct further due diligence on the person(s). Should the outcome of a further due diligence not be satisfactory to ECIC, or such a person(s) poses an unacceptable high-risk reputation and/or integrity of the person(s) be questionable, ECIC reserves the right not to award the bid to that bidder. This process may be repeated to the next bidder if so required.

## C. ANNEXURES

## Annexure 1: Terms and conditions of request for quotation

- The potential bidders are required to provide the goods/services as indicated on the scope of work or specifications of good/services required by the corporation. ECIC standard conditions of purchase shall apply.
- 2. ECIC reserves the right not to procure the goods and/or services.
- 3. Late and incomplete submissions will not be accepted.
- 4. Bidders are required to attach the latest Central Supplier Database (CSD) report from the National Treasury or register their company onto the CSD website address: www.csd.gov.za.
- 5. Bidders are required to submit B-BBEE Certificates/ sworn affidavits from the dtic website for QSE and EME suppliers with their quotations.
- 6. All quotations must be in South African Rand. If the quotation is not in South African Rand, ECIC will convert the currency used to quote into South African Rand as at the closing date of the bid.
- 7. No services must be rendered, or goods delivered before an official ECIC Purchase Order has been sent to the supplier.
- 8. Bidders are required to complete and return the attached Standard Bidding Documents.
- 9. Bidders are required to attach the company profile to their submissions, where applicable.
- 10. ECIC reserves the right to conduct site visits to the selected bidders.
- 11. ECIC reserves the right to conduct business with ethical suppliers.
- 12. ECIC reserves the right to disqualify any bidder, based on any one or more of the following, and such disqualification may take place without prior notice to the non-compliant bidder:
  - 12.1. bidders who submitted incomplete information and documentation essential for the adjudication of the requirements of this RFQ;
  - 12.2. bidders who submitted information that is fraudulent, factually untrue or inaccurate, for example memberships that do not exist, experience, etc;
  - 12.3. bidders who received information not available to other vendors through fraudulent means: and/or
  - 12.4. bidders who do not comply with mandatory requirements as stipulated in this RFQ.

- 13. All bidders to note that payments are processed within 30 days after receipt of the invoice.
- 14. This terms and conditions govern the contract for procurement of goods/services for the ECIC.
- 15. ECIC reserves the right to request for demonstration of products or items as and when required through presentation.
- 16. ECIC preferred bidders should obtain a Purchase Order prior to rendering of services or providing goods to the corporation. Should there be additional services/goods which were not part of the initial purchase order, ECIC will not be responsible for payment of such without a purchase order.

## 17. Awarding a bid

- 17.1. ECIC will not award a bid to a bidder:
  - 17.1.1. Who is or the bidder's director(s), trustee(s), shareholder(s), member(s), partners(s) or any person(s) having controlling interest in the bidder are restricted to conduct business with the State.
  - 17.1.2. Who is in the employ of the State or has a director(s), trustee(s), shareholder(s), member(s), partners(s) or any person(s) having controlling interest in the bidder who is in the employ of the State as contemplated in the Public Administration Management Act, 11 of 2014 and is prohibited from conducting business with the State in terms of section of PAMA.
  - 17.1.3. Who is in the service of the State or has a director(s), trustee(s), shareholder(s), member(s), partners(s) or any person(s) having controlling interest in the bidder and has not declared their business interest as required in the applicable SBD4 form.
  - 17.1.4. Has been found to have transgressed Prevention and Combating of Corrupt Activities Act,12 of 2004 (as amended).
  - 17.1.5. Has been found to have transgressed or is transgressing the Competition Act, 89 of 1998 (as amended).
- 17.2. ECIC shall not award a bid or contract or order to a bidder whose tax affairs are not compliant, except to foreign bidders with no tax obligations in South Africa.
- 17.3. For a bidder or the bidder's director(s), trustee(s), shareholder(s), member(s), partners(s) or any person(s) having controlling interest in the bidder who have declared their business interest as required in the applicable SBD4 form, ECIC will not award a bid to a bidder who has declared their interest and:

- 17.3.1. Is prohibited from conducting business with the State; or
- 17.3.2. Does not have permission to conduct remunerative work outside their employment.
- 17.4. ECIC will verify with the relevant Organ of State to determine if paragraphs 17.3.1 and 17.3.2 are not applicable.
- 17.5. ECIC will assume that, the person contemplated in paragraph 17.3 is prohibited from conducting business with the State or the person does not have permission to conduct remunerative work outside their employment if it does not receive any response within 21 days from such verification request to an Organ of State.
- 17.6. ECIC will then recommend to award the bid to the bidder who achieved the second highest preference points, and should it be established that, the bidder who achieved the second highest preference points have a person contemplated in paragraph 17.3, ECIC will conduct verification as contemplated in paragraphs 17.4 and 17.5. This step can be performed to up to the bidder who achieved the third highest preference points.

### Annexure 2: Protection of Personal Information

#### PROTECTION OF PERSONAL INFORMATION

- ECIC recognises that when the Bidder submit its proposal in response to this Request for Quotations, it will provide personal information, which ECIC will process for the sole purpose of evaluating the Bidder's proposal. By submitting its proposal in responding to this Request for Quotations, the Bidder hereby provide its consent to the processing of its Personal Information by ECIC.
- 2. The following terms shall have the meaning ascribed to them:
  - 2.1. "Personal Information" shall bear the same meaning as ascribed to it under POPI;
  - 2.2. "POPI" means Protection of Personal Information Act, No. 4 of 2013;
  - 2.3. "Responsible Party" shall bear the same meaning as ascribed to it under POPI; and
  - 2.4. "RFQ" means this Request for Quotations.
- 3. ECIC as the Responsible Party undertakes to:
  - 3.1. comply with the provisions of POPI as well as all applicable legislation as amended or substituted from time to time:
  - 3.2. treat all Personal Information strictly as defined within the parameters of POPI;
  - 3.3. process Personal Information only in accordance with the consent it was obtained for, for the purpose agreed, as permitted by law;
  - 3.4. secure the integrity and confidentiality of any Personal Information in its possession or under its control by taking appropriate, reasonable technical and organisational measures to prevent loss, damage, unauthorised destruction, access, use, disclosure or any other unlawful processing of Personal Information;
  - 3.5. not transfer any Personal Information to any third party in a foreign country unless such transfer complies with the relevant provisions of POPI regarding transborder information flows: and
  - 3.6. not retain any Personal Information for longer than is necessary for achieving the purpose in terms of RFQ or in fulfilment of any other lawful requirement.
- 4. ECIC will ensure that all reasonable measures are taken to:
  - 4.1. identify reasonably foreseeable internal and external risks to the Personal

Information in its possession or under its control;

- 4.2. establish and maintain appropriate security safeguards against the identified risks;
- 4.3. regularly verify that the security safeguards are effectively implemented;
- 4.4. ensure that the security safeguards are continually updated in response to new risks or deficiencies in previously implemented safeguards;
- 4.5. provide immediate notification to the Bidder if a breach in information security or any other applicable security safeguard occurs; provide immediate notification to the Bidder where there are reasonable grounds to believe that the Personal Information has been accessed or acquired by any unauthorised person;
- 4.6. remedy any breach of a security safeguard in the shortest reasonable time and provide the Bidder with the details of the breach and, if applicable, the reasonable measures implemented to address the security safeguard breach;
- 4.7. provide immediate notification to the Bidder where the Bidder has, or reasonably suspects that, Personal Information has been processed outside of the purpose agreed to or consented to;
- 4.8. provide the Bidder, upon request, with all information of any nature whatsoever relating to the processing of the Personal Information for the purpose of the RFQ and any applicable law; and
- 4.9. notify the Bidder, if lawful, of receipt of any request for access to Personal Information, in its possession and relating to the Bidder.
- 5. The Bidder has the right to inspect the Personal Information processing operations, as well as the technical and organisational information security measures employed by the ECIC to ensure compliance with the provisions of this Annexure.

- 5. ECIC will only accept fixed prices for the contract term. The quoted price must be an all-inclusive price and ECIC will not pay for any items required in this bid but not quoted for. The bidder must ensure that the quotation includes all the services required under scope of work.

- 1.2. ALL BIDS MUST BE SUBMITTED ON THE OFFICIAL FORMS PROVIDED— (NOT TO BE RE-TYPED) OR IN THE MANNER PRESCRIBED IN THE BID DOCUMENT.
- 1.3. THIS BID IS SUBJECT TO THE PREFERENTIAL PROCUREMENT POLICY FRAMEWORK ACT, 2000 AND THE PREFERENTIAL PROCUREMENT REGULATIONS, THE GENERAL CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT (GCC) AND, IF APPLICABLE, ANY OTHER SPECIAL CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.
