9 Specification/Scope of Work

9.1 Task Summary

The task involves commissioning a Scoping and Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) process (including specialist studies) in order to acquire environmental authorisation, in accordance with the National Environmental Management Act, 1998 (Act No. 107 of 1998) as amended and all relevant Regulations promulgated thereof relevant to the proposed installation of a vertical diesel storage tank and decommissioning of existing diesel tanks at Transnet Freight Rail (TFR) Komatipoort Depot, Mpumalanga Province - see Figure 1 below.



Figure 1: Locality map of TFR Komatipoort Depot (25° 26' 12.52" and 31° 57' 06.90")

The environmental assessment process relevant to the proposed project is a full Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) as stipulated in the EIA Regulations of 2014 (as amended), promulgated in terms of the National Environmental Management Act, 1998 (Act No. 107 of 1998). The appointed Environmental Assessment Practitioner (EAP) (herein referred to as Practitioner) will be required to conduct a comprehensive screening exercise to ensure that all triggered listed activities under the said Regulations and associated Listing Notices have been identified and it is confirmed that indeed the process to follow is a full EIA.

The appointed Practitioner is further expected to scope all environmental related approvals (i.e. other permits and/licenses) applicable to the proposed project and ensure that these are obtained from the relevant Competent Authorities concurrent with the EIA process.

9.2 Project Description

Transnet currently purchases about 188 million litres of diesel per annum for own consumption. 24 million litres of this volume is utilised only at Komatipoort diesel depot alone. This is more than 10% of the complete consumption. The currently holding stock at Komatipoort loco diesel depot is

- 1 x 108 000L tank safe level 100 000
- 2 x 30 000L tank safe level 30 000
- 1 x 30 000L tank not operational
- Total on site holding 160 000L

Average usage per week is 500 000L with a daily offtake of 71 500L. Due to the major strain now being experienced in the country with diesel shortages. These shortages are due to almost all of South Africa's fuel refineries closing down citing high cost of refurbishments. Currently Sasol is the only functional refinery. Sasol has to import most of its diesel as it is unable to provide its users. All the major fuel suppliers including Astron, Total, Engen, Shell and BP rely on imports. This has created a major burden on the fuel supply chain. This has now prompted that we have at least 1 week of stock available on site although 2 weeks would be better.

Komatipoort diesel depot is a strategic and important base as it looks after the main coal line going to Richards Bay. The knock-on effect of no fuel at Komatipoort would have a huge negative impact on Transnet's ability to service its clients and the impact to make a profit. Therefore, increasing storage capacity at Komatipoort Depot by 500 000L resulting in combined total storage capacity of 608 000L will ensure Transnet continue to service its client.

9.3 Environmental Approval Processes

An internal review of environmental legislation, and more specifically the NEMA EIA Regulations, has identified the following activity that will be triggered. However, the responsibility to ensure that all triggered activities are identified remains with the appointed Practitioner.

Table 2: NEMA listed activities that are possibly triggered by this proposal.

9.4 Specialist studies

The appointed Practitioner will be required to undertake specialist studies that will be required for the application of the environmental authorisation. As a minimum, the following specialist study has been identified:

- Soil and groundwater contamination assessment

9.4.1. Compliance statements

Based on the outcome of the screening process as required in terms of the 2014 EIA Regulations, the sensitivity themes listed below were classified as very high to high sensitive thus requiring specialist studies. However, the site in question is already a disturbed environment (with existing tank farm) and no development will take place outside the footprint of the tank farm. The EAP is thus required to compile compliance statements to motivate and provide reasons for not including the identified specialist studies in the assessment report. The compliance statements (for the following themes) must be compiled as per the assessment protocol.

- Agricultural theme;
- Animal species theme;

- Aquatic Biodiversity theme;
- Archaeological and cultural Heritage theme; and
- Terrestrial Biodiversity theme.

It is the responsibility of the EAP to identify any other specialist studies that might be applicable to the project. All spatial information generated as part of the specialist studies and authorisation will be provided to Transnet once the studies have been completed and finalised.

9.5 Consulting Team Requirements

The Environmental Assessment Practitioner (EAP) must have relevant qualification (degree and/or diploma) from recognized institutions with EAPASA registration, preferably registered as an EAP. The team must have personnel who have the following minimum key competencies:

- Environmental impact assessment (EIA);
- Public participation process (PPP); and
- Project management.

9.5.1. Composition of the team

The EAP must have undertaken and completed at least two environmental impact assessment projects, one relating to hydrocarbon storage facility;

The project manager must have at least five years relevant experience;

The team must include a proficient public participation facilitator with a minimum of five years' experience; and

Any sub-contractors contracted by the appointed EAP to undertake specialist studies or other relevant environmental approval processes, must meet the relevant requirements with respect to experience and qualifications as stipulated above. The appointed specialists must be registered with South African Council for Natural Scientific Professions (SACNASP) under the relevant field of practice.

9.6 The Activities

The tasks that are listed below are generic to Environmental Impact Assessment process. The tasks have been categorised according to certain project phases. The appointed Practitioner shall carry out all the tasks as listed plus any other which are required, to fulfil all the functions necessary to ensure Transnet receives a decision from the competent authority. The appointed Practitioner should take note that the competent authority for all Transnet projects requiring environmental authorisation is the National Department of Forestry, Fisheries and the Environment (DFFE).

9.6.1. Activity 1: Project Initiation

Tasks will include but not necessarily be limited to the following main activities:

- Conduct a comprehensive screening exercise to identify any applicable listed activities as per the 2014 EIA Regulations (as amended) and required specialist studies;
- Arrange and conduct a pre-application meeting with the Competent Authorities;
- Prepare and submit an application for environmental authorisation under NEMA, together with all the prescribed documents to DFFE;
- Review and understand existing project data and information which will be provided by Transnet;
- Identify project information gaps and list information requirements; and
- Arrange project initiation meeting and site visit.

The deliverables include, but not limited to –

- Environmental authorisation application forms and other relevant documents;
- Minutes of all project planning meetings; and
- Project schedule.

9.6.2. Activity 2: Public participation

Carry out a public participation process to comply with Regulation 40 – 44 of the EIA Regulations of 2014 (as amended). Tasks will include but not necessarily be limited to the following main activities:

- Plan, implement and manage all aspects of the public participation programme for all the parts of the Project. This includes keeping a detailed record of all public participation activities, comments received and responses to these in terms of said Regulations;
- Develop and maintain a comprehensive database of stakeholders as required by the in the Regulations. The database shall differentiate clearly with respect to key stakeholders as required by the Regulations;
- Announce and advertise the environmental assessment process and application for environmental authorisation appropriately, in terms of the requirements of the Regulations;
- Such announcements and advertisements shall include but not necessarily be limited to press releases, a background information document, site notice boards, and letters to stakeholders, telephone calls, e-mail correspondence and information placed on the internet;
- Public participation shall be carried out during scoping, impact assessment and appeal phases or as and when required in the EIA process;
- Liaise and consult with the competent authority and other government departments that are relevant to the Project. This includes but is not necessarily limited to DFFE, DWS, SAHRA Regional Offices and appropriate departments within the relevant Municipality;
- Where appropriate organise, conduct and record the discussions and inputs received from workshops aimed at the competent authority and key stakeholders;
- Where appropriate organise and convene appropriate public meetings to inform the public of the findings and recommendations contained in the Environmental Impact Report (EIR) and/or Environmental Management Programme (EMPr);
- Record comments and inputs from stakeholders and draw up a Comments and Response Report based on the feedback obtained from stakeholders;
- Include the Comments and Response Report in the Scoping Report and the EIR;
- Appropriate distribution of all reports and documentation in compliance with the Regulations and as required by the competent authority;
- On-going consultation with authorities and the broader stakeholder-base throughout the assessment process;
- Notification to stakeholders of the decision by the competent authority on the application; and
- Handle any appeal in consultation with Transnet, as and when required.

The deliverables include, but not limited to -

- Register of I&APs, stakeholders and lead stakeholders;
- Minutes of all relevant project and public meetings, workshops and discussions;
- All public documents such as advertisements, background information document, letters, press releases and the like; and
- Reports (e.g., Comment and Response Report, Public Participation Report, etc.).

9.6.3. Activity 3: Scoping

Carry out scoping in terms of Regulation 21-22 of the EIA Regulations of 2014 (as amended). The tasks involved include but are not necessarily limited to:

- Prepare a plan of study for environmental impact assessment;
- Identify and draw up final terms of reference for specialist studies (where necessary);
- Appoint specialists to carry out studies (where necessary);
- Compile and present specialist findings to the Transnet project team;
- Undertake site visits;
- Arrange and conduct integration meetings with specialists (where necessary);
- Compile Scoping report;
- Submit draft reports to Transnet for review;
- Place the draft reports for public review;
- Arrange and conduct meetings, workshops and interactions with stakeholders;
- Analyse feedback from Stakeholders and compile a Final Scoping Report and Draft EMPr; and
- Finalise documentation and submit to authority for consideration and decision making.

The deliverables include, but not limited to -

- Final Scoping Report and Plan of Study for EIA;
- Draft terms of reference for specialist studies (where required);
- Minutes of all relevant project planning and progress meetings;
- Draft EMPr; and
- All requirements of Regulation 21-22 of 2014 EIA Regulations (as amended).

9.6.4. Activity 4: Environmental Impact Assessment

Carry out scoping in terms of Regulation 23 of the EIA Regulations of 2014 (as amended). The tasks involved include but are not necessarily limited to:

- Project management;
- Appoint specialists to carry out studies (where necessary);
- Undertake site visits;
- Arrange and conduct integration meetings with specialists;
- Review specialist reports;
- Compile draft Environmental Impact Report (EIR);
- Compile draft Environmental Management Programme (EMPr);
- Employer, peer and public review of draft EIR and draft EMPr;
- Analyse feedback from stakeholders and compile final EIR and final EMPr; and
- Finalise documentation and submit to authorities for consideration.

The deliverables include, but not limited to –

- Specialist reports;
- Draft Environmental Impact Report (DEIR);
- Final Environmental Impact Report (EIR);

- Final Environmental Management Programme (FEMPr);
- Closure Plan and/or Remediation Plan (to be confirmed during pre-application meeting); and
- All requirements of Regulation 23 of 2014 EIA Regulations (as amended).

9.6.5. Activity 5: Project Management

Tasks will include but not necessarily be limited to the following main activities;

- Project planning and management of all project tasks and deliverables;
- Hold project planning and coordination meetings;
- Submit monthly project progress reports (inclusive of progress %, risks and latest project schedule) to Transnet;
- Attend monthly virtual project progress meetings;
- Draw up and revise the project programme when necessary;
- Arrange and hold project meetings with DFFE;
- Manage specialist investigations and review processes; and
- Liaise with both Transnet and other authorities (such as DWS where necessary).

The deliverables include, but not limited to -

- General project communique;
- Minutes of all project related meetings; and

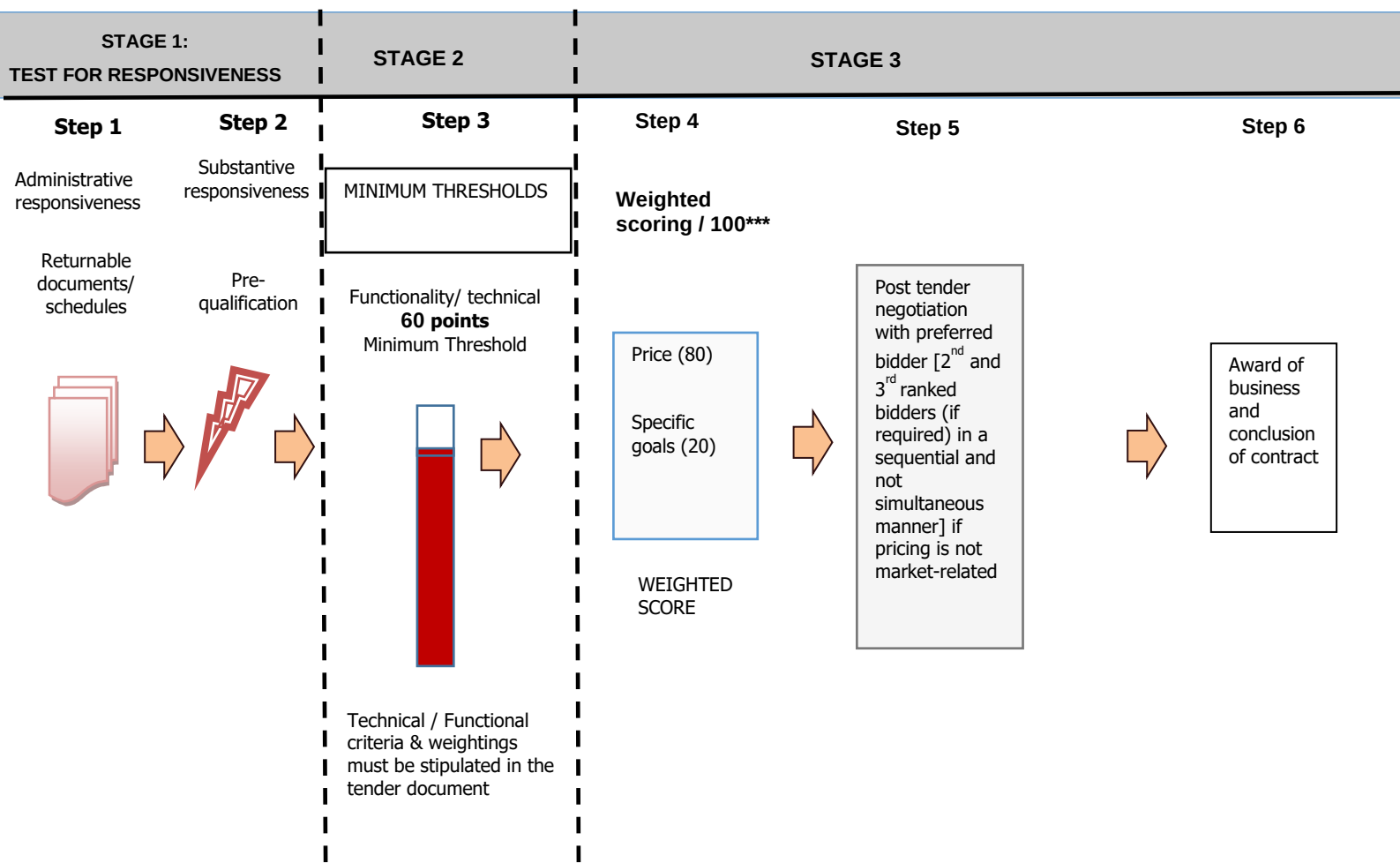
