Section 1: Specific Goals

To claim preference points, a tenderer must submit the proof of B-BBEE status level of contributor (e.g. a valid B-BBEE certificate issued by a SANAS accredited verification agency / sworn affidavit / CIPC affidavit)

Failure on the part of a supplier to submit "proof of B-BBEE status level of contributor" for purposes of evaluation and scoring by the tender closing will not result in disqualification (if tenderer is otherwise deemed to be responsive/acceptable in all other aspects). The tenderer will, however, be scored zero on B-BBEE for purposes of PPPFA scoring and ranking.

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A tenderer may not be awarded points for B-BBEE status level if the tender documents indicate that the tenderer intends to subcontract more than 25% of the value of the contract to any other person not qualifying for at least the points that the tenderer qualifies for, unless the intended subcontractor is an EME that has the capability to execute the subcontract.

Section 2: Objective Criteria (Condition for contract award)

The objective criteria for this transaction is according to section (2) (1) (f) of the PPPFA and will be used in awarding the tender not to the highest scorer. It includes the following:

1. Designated Sectors

When applicable the following stipulated minimum threshold for Local Production and Content must be achieved in full by the tenderer at tender stage

2. Local Content Designation

2. Mandatory subcontracting

Tenderers are required to sub-contract to EME's and QSE's with a minimum of 51% black ownership.

Rigging and transport activities have been identified as the potential scope for sub-contracting, however tenderers are requested to identify and propose any scope for sub-contracting.

e) Manufacturing opportunities

There is an opportunity for the local manufacturing of the container. Tenderer's will be requested to identify the manufacturing opportunities within this scope and to come up with a plan on how local suppliers will benefit from this scope.

Section 3: Reporting and Monitoring

- The suppliers shall on a monthly/quarterly basis submit a report to Eskom in accordance with Data Collection Template on their compliance with the SDL&I obligations described above.
- Eskom shall review the SDL&I reports submitted by the suppliers within 60 (sixty) days of receipt of the reports and notify the suppliers in writing if their SDL&I obligations have not been met.
- Upon notification by Eskom that the suppliers have not met their SDL&I obligations, the suppliers shall be required to implement corrective measures to meet those SDL&I obligations before the commencement of the following report, failing which Retention clauses shall be invoked.
- Every contract shall be accompanied by the SDL&I Implementation Schedule which must be completed by the suppliers and returned to SDL&I representative for acceptance 30 days after contract award.
