 Proof of previous supply of road construction/maintenance material/s in excess of R350 000.00 within the last 5 years (2020 to 2025) - Attach Purchase Order and Appointment Letter

N.B: All certified copies must not be older than three months before the bid closing date and must not be copies of certified copies.

### Stage 2: Price and Specific Goals:

Responsive bids will be evaluated further, using the 80/20 price and specific goal.

#### Step 1: Calculation of points for Price

The PPPFA prescribes that the lowest acceptable bid will score 80 points for price. Bidders that quoted higher prices will score lower points for price on a pro-rata basis. The formula to be used for calculating points scored for price is the following:

$$Ps = 90 \left( 1 - \frac{P_t - P_{\min}}{P_{\min}} \right)$$

Where

Ps = Points scored for price of the bid or bid under consideration
Pt = Price (Rand value) of bid or bid under consideration
Pmin = Price (Rand value) of the lowest acceptable bid or bid

Points scored must be rounded off to the nearest 2 decimal places

### Calculation of points for specific goals

Points for specific goals will be awarded in line with SBD 6.1.
