SECTION 1: BACKGROUND, OVERVIEW AND RFP SCOPE OF REQUIREMENTS

1. INTRODUCTION

The National Lotteries Commission (The NLC) is a public entity established by Lotteries Act No. 57 of 1997, as amended to regulate the South African lotteries industry. The functions of the NLC can be divided into two categories, namely "regulation of National Lottery and other Lotteries" and "administration of the National Lottery Distribution Trust Fund (NLDTF)".

The Distributing Agencies (DA's) who are appointed by the Minister of Trade & Industry are responsible for the adjudication of the funding applications as per the Lotteries Act and applicable Regulations.

2. BACKGROUND

The NLC intends to appoint a suitably qualified service provider to render managed Xerox document scanner services. The services are be provided for a period of thirty-six (36) months.

The NLC specifically makes use of a particular Xerox document scanner model due to the historically established operational workflows at all the NLC provincial offices. This model of the Xerox scanner is already well integrated into the ERP Grant Management System (GMS) processes and workflows. The specific scanner device description is as follows:

OEM: Xerox

Model: DocuMate 4790

Document scanners are to be delivered to the nine NLC provincial offices across the country as outlined in section 3 of this document.





In line with the requirements of the Public Finance Management Act (PFMA) No. 1 of 1999, as amended and Treasury Regulations, the NLC invites suitably qualified and experienced service providers to render XEROX Document Scanner or equivalent services for the NLC.

#### 3. SCOPE OF WORK

- i. Deliver the Xerox document scanner or equivalent machines at each NLC office as per the table of geographic footprint of NLC offices below.
- ii. Provide 1<sup>st</sup> level print server administrator training.
- iii. Render maintenance and support in line with SLA provisions in terms of the functional upkeep of the printers and supply of printer cartridges and related consumables.

#### 4. SERVICE LEVEL RAMEWORK

- iv. Step by step procedure to be followed by NLC to order new consumables such as cartridges and other related items.

#### 5. DELIVERABLES

The following deliverables are identified as project outputs:

- a. XEROX DocuMate 4790 scanner machines or equivalent.
- b. Maintenance and Support Service Level Agreement.
- c. Maintain and support the deployed document scanner machines including quarterly maintenance on the machines.

#### 6. REPORTING REQUIREMENTS

The successful service provider will report to the Information Communications Technology Division.

#### 7. DURATION OF THE PROJECT

The appointment period for this RFP is thirty-six (36) months from date of signing of the service level agreement (SLA).

#### **SECTION 2: NOTICE TO BIDDERS**

- 1. Terms and conditions of Request for Proposals (RFP)
- 1.1 This document may contain confidential information that is the property of the NLC.
- 1.2 No part of the contents may be used, copied, disclosed, or conveyed in whole or in part to any party in any manner whatsoever other than for preparing a proposal in response to this RFP without prior written permission from the NLC.
- 1.3 All copyright and intellectual property herein vests with the NLC.
- 1.4 Late and incomplete submissions will not be accepted.
- 1.5 No services must be rendered, or goods delivered before an official NLC Purchase Order form hasbeen received.
- 1.6 This RFP will be evaluated in terms of the 80/20 preference point system prescribed by the Preferential Procurement Regulations, 2022.
- 1.7 Suppliers are required to register on the Central Supplier Database at <a href="www.csd.gov.za">www.csd.gov.za</a>.
- 1.8 Suppliers must provide their CSD registration number (and attach a CSD registration report) and ensure that their tax matters are compliant. Bidders' tax affairs must be in order at the closing date & time of this bid submission.
- 1.9 All questions regarding this RFP must be forwarded to <a href="mailto:thobile@nlcsa.org.za">thobile@nlcsa.org.za</a>, no later than within three days of the RFP closing date.
- 1.10 Any supplier who has reasons to believe that the RFP specification is based on a specific brand must inform the NLC via the email addressed in 1.9.

#### 2. General rules and instructions

- 2.1 News and press releases
- 2.1.1 Bidders or their agents shall not make any news releases concerning this RFP or the awarding of the sameor any resulting agreement(s) without the consent of, and then only in co-ordination with, the NLC.
- 2.2 Precedence of documents
- 2.2.1 This RFP consists of a number of sections. Where there is a contradiction in terms between the clauses, phrases, words, stipulations or terms and herein referred to generally as stipulations in this RFP and the stipulations in any other document attached hereto, or the RFP submitted hereto, the relevant stipulations in this RFP shall take precedence.
- 2.2.2 Where this RFP is silent on any matter, the relevant stipulations addressing such matter, and which appearin the PPPFA shall take precedence. Bidders shall refrain from incorporating any additional stipulations in its proposal submitted in terms hereof other than in the form of a clearly marked recommendation that the NLC may in its sole discretion elect to import or to ignore. Any such





- inclusion shall not be used for any purpose of interpretation unless it has been so imported or acknowledged by the NLC.
- 2.2.3 It is acknowledged that all stipulations in the PPPFA are not equally applicable to all matters addressed in this RFP. It, however, remains the exclusive domain and election of the NLC as to which of these stipulations are applicable and to what extent. Bidders are hereby acknowledging that the decision of the NLC in this regard is final and binding. The onus to enquire and obtain clarity in this regard rests with the Bidder(s). The Bidder(s) shall take care to restrict its enquiries in this regard to the most reasonable interpretations required to ensure the necessary consensus.
- 2.3 Preferential procurement reform
- 2.4 The NLC supports B-BBEE as an essential ingredient of its business. In accordance with government policy, the NLC insists that the private sector demonstrates its commitment and track record to B-BBEE in the areas of ownership (shareholding), skills transfer, employment equity and procurement practices (SMME Development) etc.
- 2.5 National Industrial Participation Programme
- 2.6 The Industrial Participation policy, which was endorsed by Cabinet on 30 April 1997, is applicable to contracts that have an imported content. The NIP is obligatory and therefore must be complied with. Bidders are required to sign and submit the Standard Bidding Document (SBD).
- 2.7 Language
- 2.7.1 Bids shall be submitted in English.
- 2.8 Gender
- 2.8.1 Any word implying any gender shall be interpreted to imply all other genders.
- 2.9 Headings
- 2.9.1 Headings are incorporated into this RFP document and submitted in response thereto, for ease of reference only and shall not form part thereof for any purpose of interpretation or for any other purpose.
- 2.10 Occupational Injuries and Diseases Act 13 of 1993
- 2.10.1 The Bidder warrants that all its employees (including the employees of any sub-contractor that may be appointed) are covered in terms of the Compensation for Occupational Injuries and Diseases Act 13 of 1993 and that the cover shall remain in force for the duration of the adjudication of this RFP and/ or subsequent agreement. the NLC reserves the right to request the Bidder to submit documentary proof of the Bidder's registration and "good standing" with the Compensation Fund, or similar proof acceptable to the NLC.

- 2.11 Processing of the Bidder's Personal Information
- 2.11.1 All Personal Information of the Bidder, its employees, representatives, associates and sub-contractors ("Bidder Personal Information") required under this RFP is collected and processed for the purpose of assessing the content of its tender proposal and awarding the bid. The assessment and award of the bid shall be conducted in accordance with applicable legislation. The Bidder is advised that Bidder Personal Information may be passed on to third parties to whom the NLC is compelled by law to provide such information. For example, where appropriate, the NLC is compelled to submit information to National Treasury's Database of Restricted Suppliers.
- 2.11.2 All Personal Information collected will be processed in accordance with POPIA and with the NLC Data Privacy Policy.
- 2.11.3 The following persons will have access to the Personal Information collected:
- 2.11.3.1 The NLC personnel participating in procurement/award procedures; and
- 2.11.3.2 Members of the public: within seven working days from the time the bid is awarded, the following information will have to be made available on National Treasury's e-Tender portal:
- 2.11.3.2.1 contract description and bid number.

- 2.11.3.2.3 the contract price(s) (if possible).

- 2.11.4 The NLC will ensure that the rights of the Bidder and of its employees and representatives (i.e. the right of access and the right to rectify) are effectively guaranteed in accordance with the procedures as specified in the NLC PAIA manual.
  - 2.11.5 In signing this document, the Bidder consents to the use of its Personal Information for the purposes as specified in section 2.9.1 above.

#### 3. Formal Briefing Session

There will be no compulsory briefing session.

#### 4. Validity Period

- 4.1 The NLC requires a validity period of 120 [one hundred and twenty] Business Days [from closing date] against this RFP.
- 4.2 Bidders are to note that they may be requested to extend the validity period of their bids, on the sameterms and conditions, if the internal evaluation process are not finalised within the validity period.

#### 5. National Treasury's Central Supplier Database

- 5.1 Bidders are required to self-register on National Treasury's Central Supplier Database (CSD) which has been established to centrally administer supplier information for all organs of state and facilitate the verification of certain key supplier information.
- 5.2 The NLC may not award business to a bidder who has failed to register on the CSD.
- 5.3 Only foreign suppliers with no local registered entity need not register on the CSD.
- 5.4 The CSD can be accessed at https://secure.csd.gov.za/

#### 6. Confidentiality

- 6.1 Bids submitted for this Request for Proposals will not be revealed to any other bidders and will be treated as contractually binding.
- 6.2 The NLC reserves all the rights afforded to it by the POPIA in the processing of any of its information as contained in Bid Proposals.
- 6.3 The Bidder acknowledges that it will obtain and have access to personal information of The NLC and agrees that it shall only process the information disclosed by the NLC in terms of this bid award and only for the purposes as detailed in this RFP and in accordance with any applicable law.
- The Bidder shall notify the NLC in writing of any unauthorised access to personal information and the information of a third party, through cybercrimes or suspected cybercrimes, in its knowledge and report such crimes or suspected crimes to the relevant authorities in accordance with applicable laws, after becoming aware of such.

#### 7. Communication

- 7.2 In the interest of fairness and transparency the NLC's response to such a query may be made available to other bidders.

- 7.4 Bidders found to be in collusion with one another will be automatically disqualified and restricted from business with organs of state for a specified period.

Stage 5: Due Diligence

The NLC reserves the right to undertake a due diligence exercise on the preferred bidder/s as part of a material risk evaluation aimed at determining to its satisfaction, the validity of the information provided by the Bidder. Such exercise shall be fully documented and may include, but need not be limited to, all or any combination of the following:

- a) Physical inspection of the Bidder's offices, branches or other places
- b) Verification of accuracy, correctness and authenticity of information provided
- c) Validation of extent of compliance to the RFP requirements and evaluation criteria based on what has so far been found by the evaluation team
- d) Inquiry and reference checking with National Treasury Restricted Suppliers
