5 LATE SUBMISSIONS

5.1 Quotations received late shall not be considered. A quotation will be considered late if it arrived even one second after 11:00 or any time thereafter. The tender (bid) box shall be closed at exactly 11:00 and quotations arriving late will not be considered under any circumstances. Quotations received late shall be returned unopened to the respondent. Respondents are therefore strongly advised to ensure that quotations be despatched allowing enough time for any unforeseen events that may delay the delivery of the quotation.

5.2 The official Telkom time, which can be observed by dialling 1026 from any phone, will be used to verify the exact closing time.

5.3 Quotations sent to the RAL via normal post or any other mechanism shall be deemed to be received at the date and time of arrival at the RAL premises (tender/bid box or reception). Quotations received at the physical address after the closing date and time of the quotation, shall therefore be deemed to be received late.

6 PAYMENTS

- 6.1 RAL will pay the Contractor the fees set out in the final contract according to the table of deliverables. No additional amounts will be payable by the RAL to the Contractor.
- 6.1.1 The Contractor shall from time to time during the duration of the contract, invoice RAL for the services rendered.
- 6.1.2 The invoice must be accompanied by supporting source document(s) containing detailed information, as RAL may reasonably require, for the purposes of establishing the specific nature, extent and quality of the services which were undertaken by the Contractor.
- 6.1.3 No payment will be made to the Contractor unless an original tax invoice complying with section 20 of the VAT Act No 89 of 1991, as amended, has been submitted to RAL.
- 6.1.4 Payment shall be made by bank transfer into the Contractor's bank account normally 30 days after receipt of an acceptable, original, valid tax invoice. Money will only be transferred into a South African bank account. (Banking details must be submitted as soon as the bid is awarded).

TERMS OF REFERENCE (TOR)

1. INTRODUCTION

Roads Agency Limpopo SOC Ltd (“RAL”) is a provincial road infrastructure delivery parastatal registered under the Company’s Act of the Republic of South Africa. It has been established under its constitutive Act, the Northern Province Roads Agency Act and Provincial Roads Act No.7 of 1998. RAL started operating in 1999/2000 financial year. Its main functions are planning, designing, construction, maintenance, and control of the provincial road network. It owns and manages all the provincial roads, except municipal roads and National Roads. RAL is managed by a chief executive officer who reports to the Board of Directors. Members of Board are in turn reporting to the Shareholder, who is the MEC for Limpopo Department of Public Works, Roads, and Infrastructure.

2. INVITATION

RAL seeks to appoint a suitably qualified, reputable, and experienced external service provider to repair the current electronic security management system (Biometrics and CCTV cameras).

3. BACKGROUND

- 3.1. RAL had established the security system in the form of CCTV cameras and biometrics access control system for the purposes of protecting its assets, people, and equipment.
- 3.2. It is against this background that RAL requires external technical support from competent service provider to perform once off repairs on existing security management system.

4. OBJECTIVE

- 4.1. The objective of this engagement is to appoint a suitably qualified, reputable, and experienced service provider to repair the current RAL’s electronic security management system (Biometrics and CCTV cameras).

6. SCOPE OF WORK

6.1. The scope of work includes repairing the following, amongst others:

6.1.1. Access Management System ("UNIS for Biometrics Access System version 4").

6.1.2. Nuuo Remote Live Viewer for CCTV Cameras.

6.1.3. 1x A Body Scanner.

6.1.4. 4x turnstiles.

6.1.5. Entire cable management (Security Network Cables).

6.1.6. 56x CCTV cameras installed inside and outside the RAL building.

6.1.7. 33x Office biometrics access control devices.

6.1.8. 4x TV/LCD screens.

6.1.9. Storage servers located in the server-room.

6.1.10. Relocation of a CCTV camera from the Cashier's Office to an allocated site.

6.1.11. Resuscitate the entire system back to normal.

6.1.12. Compile a detailed report on how RAL can upgrade its current system in consideration of the latest technology available in the market, for the

purposes of continual improvement.

6.1.13. Fix all the identified security related deficiencies including repairing of components with compatible latest technology.

6.1.14. All consumables and components must be repaired as part of the scope of work.

6.1.15. The service provider should upskill and train the RAL's Governance, Risk, and Compliance unit on how the upgraded system works.

6.1.16. A service provider to compile a project schedule, and submit to RAL for consideration, and approval.

NB: All security gadgets must be SABS approved.

7. PROJECT COST

The service provider will be required to provide a detailed cost-breakdown of the project. The total cost must be VAT inclusive and should be quoted in South African currency (i.e., Rands).

1.2.2 The score for functionality shall be calculated as follows:

- Each panel member shall award values for each individual criterion on a score sheet. The value scored for each criterion shall be multiplied with the specified weighting for the relevant criterion to obtain the marks scored for the various criteria. These marks should be added to obtain the total score for functionality.
- The score of each panel member shall be added together and divided by the number of panel members to establish the average score obtained by each individual respondent for functionality.

1.2.3 A bidder will be disqualified if the combined score for functionality fails to meet the minimum threshold for functionality as per paragraph 1.5.1.

1.3 ELIMINATION OF PROPOSALS ON GROUNDS OF FUNCTIONALITY

1.3.1 Quotations that score less than **60 points** for functionality will be eliminated from further consideration. Marks will therefore not be awarded for their cost proposals or for preference.

1.4 PRICE AND SPECIAL GOALS STATUS LEVEL POINTS

1.4.1 All remaining quotations will be evaluated as follows:

1.4.2 The **80/20** preference point system will be applied. Points for price and Special Goals will be awarded in accordance with the stipulations in the Preference Point Claim Form in terms of the Preferential Procurement Regulations, 2022.

1.4.3 If appropriate, implied contract price adjustments will be made to the cost proposals of all remaining quotations.

1.4.4 The point awarded for the Special Goals for each acceptable quotation will now be added to the price point.

1.4.5 The Evaluation Committee may recommend that the contract be awarded to the respondent obtaining the highest aggregate mark as determined by **1.4.4** or to a lower scoring quotation on justifiable grounds.

1.5 ADJUDICATION OF QUOTE

1.5.1 The relevant award structure will consider the recommendations and make the final award. The successful respondent will usually be the service provider scoring the highest number of points or it may be a lower scoring quotation on justifiable grounds or no award at all.
