TERMS OF REFERENCE FOR THE APPOINTMENT OF THE ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT PRACTITIONER TO OBTAIN WUL FOR THE UMZINTO SLUDGE PLANT UPGRADE

1. Background

Umngeni-Uthukela Water has appointed Engineering Services to undertake the Umzinto Sludge Handling Feasibility Study. The objective of this study is to determine the feasibility of constructing a Sludge Plant at the Umzinto Water Treatment Plant (WTP). This report includes the procedures carried out during this study, a hydraulic analysis of the sludge plant and design of major infrastructure and associated equipment, including:

- Thin Sludge Holding Tank;
- · Poly Dosing System;
- Gravity thickener; (Sludge) Drying Beds
- Transfer pumps

The Umzinto Water Treatment Plant (WTP) is part of the Middle South Coast Sub-System and receives its raw water from two sources. The first source is the water from Umzinto River Weir, which gets water from the Umzinto Dam. The second source is the E.J. Smith Dam situated on the Mzimayi River. Raw water is supplied from both sources simultaneously.



Location of Umzinto Water Treatment Works plant

The treatment plant has a capacity of 20 Ml/day and is currently operating at 13.5 Ml/day. Properties of the existing infrastructure and dosing chemicals at the Treatment Plant are described in Table 1 and were used in the assessment of the plant to ensure the integration of the Sludge Plant with the existing infrastructure and processes.

This consultant will report to the Environmental Scientist (Technical Support, Infrastructure Development).

- Monthly reporting to UW, Technical Support Scientist.
- Monthly progress meetings to be attended with project team.
- All for the duration of the construction period (1.5 years) and post construction period (six months)

Report Requirements

1. Aquatic Assessment

- The assessment must be completed during both the wet and dry seasons.
- The assessment must include nocturnal surveys.
- The initial desktop assessment must discuss the project site and rivers, streams and drainage lines within the regulated area (i.e. within 100m of the river, stream or drainage line, within the 1: 100 floodline or the river or stream and within the riparian area, whichever is the greatest distance). These must be depicted on a map.
