- 1.5 No services must be rendered, or goods delivered before an official MLRF Purchase Order form has been issued by a duly authorised official from the MLRF and received by the bidder. Please note that this is not an instruction to proceed with supply of any goods or service unless the quotation is approved, and a Purchase Order is supplied to you.
- 1.6 Please note that if you receive the Purchase Order, delivery of goods or rendering of services must be done within 14 calendar days or upon agreed time frames. Failing to deliver upon agreed times will result in your Purchase Order being cancelled.
- 1.7 This RFQ will be evaluated in terms of the 80/20 preference point system if is equal to or below R50 million.

TO APPOINT A SERVICE PROVIDER (SP) AS AN INDEPENDENT ENVIRONMENTAL CONTROL OFFICER BY THE DEPARTMENT OF FORESTRY, FISHERIES AND THE ENVIRONMENT (DFFE) / MARINE LIVING RESOURCE FUND (MLRF) IN COMPLIANCE WITH THE ENVIRONMENTAL AUTHORISATION AND ENVIRONMENTAL MANAGEMENT PROGRAMME FOR THE LAND-BASED AQUACULTURE DEVELOPMENT ZONE LOCATED WITHIN QOLORA IN THE EASTERN CAPE FOR A PERIOD OF TWELVE (12) MONTHS

1. PURPOSE

The Department of Forestry, Fisheries and the Environment (DFFE) / Marine Living Resource Fund (MLRF) is the mandated authority for aquaculture management and development in the country. The DFFE, on behalf of Qolora by the Sea Community Property Association, who is the holder of the Environmental Authorisation (EA) for the Qolora Aquaculture Development Zone (ADZ) requires the service of a suitably qualified and experienced service provider as an independent Environmental Control Officer (ECO). The ECO is required for the land-based ADZ's construction phases for the development located in Qolora, within the Mnquma Local Municipality in the Eastern Cape, in compliance with the stipulations as outlined in the EA and the Environmental Management Programme (EMPr), for a contract period of twelve (12) months.

2. SPECIFICATIONS

2.1 Introduction and Background

- 2.1.1. An Aquaculture Development Zone (ADZ) is an area that has been identified or earmarked specifically for aquaculture activities with the purpose of encouraging investor and consumer confidence; creating incentives for industry development, to provide marine aquaculture services; to manage the risks associated with aquaculture; as well as to provide skills development and employment for coastal communities. The development of ADZs supports the Policy for the Development of a Sustainable Marine Aquaculture sector in South Africa (2007) aimed at creating an enabling environment that will promote growth and sustainability of the marine aquaculture sector in South Africa, as well as to enhance the industry's contribution to South Africa's economic growth.
- 2.1.2. In 2009, the Marine Living Resources Fund (MLRF) of the Branch Fisheries Management, outsourced a project aimed at identifying suitable land for the establishment of marine ADZ's in the coastal provinces of South Africa. One of the land-based sites identified as suitable for aquaculture was situated in the Eastern Cape near the town of Qolora which is located in the Eastern Cape, in Centane, and falls within the Mnquma Municipality. The identified site has an area of 26.4 hectares and is situated approximately 60 km northeast of East London.

2.1.3. The project consisted of two phases:

Phase one of the project entailed undertaking the Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) for the Qolora ADZ, to which a positive Environmental Authorisation (EA) (Annexure A) was granted on the 29th September 2011 by the Department of Economic Development, Environmental Affairs and Tourism (DEDEAT). An extension to the EA was granted till the 29th September 2023 (Annexure B). To ensure that relevant permits have been obtain in accordance with the EA, waste licence application was undertaken and approval obtained on the 30th May 2013 (Annexure C), as well as a water use licence was issued on the 13th October 2017 (Annexure D) and the Agreement of Lease of the Sea Shore issued on the 6th November 2023 (Annexure E).

- h) Monitor monthly performance of the contractor (and sub-contractors) and ensure compliance with the ADZ EMPr and associated Method Statements.
- i) Review access and incident records that may pertain to the environment and reconcile the entries with the observations made during site inspection, monitoring and auditing.
- i) Keeping a photographic record of progress on the site from an environmental perspective.
- k) Ensuring a proactive and effective implementation and management of environmental impacts as set out in the EMPr and EA, by advising the Contractor on environmental issues within the defined work areas.
- I) Report compliance and non-compliance issues to MLRF, Contractor, Engineer and Relevant Authorities. Ensure and/or recommend requisite remedial action that can be appropriately implemented in the event of non-compliance.
- m) Take immediate action on site where clearly defined and agreed "no-go" areas are violated or in danger of being violated and to inform an ADZ representative of the occurrence immediately and to take action.
- n) Take immediate action on site when prescriptive conditions are violated, or in danger of being violated and to inform the ADZ representative of the occurrence and action taken. Issue compliance directives to the contractors and/or sub-contractors for corrective action/s required.
- o) Verify all environmental incident reported, as well as corrective and preventive actions taken in this regard and maintain an incident register.
- p) Maintain the public comments register in which all complaints/comments are recorded, as well as action/s taken.
- q) Ensure that monthly ECO inspections and auditing considers environmental aspects of the relevant contractor to minimise environmental impacts and achieve environmental goals as set out in the EMPr.
- r) Liaise with the Competent Authority to ensure that all contraction monitoring provides sufficient, relevant information for the Competent Authority to be assured that activities are suitably managed to minimise impact on the environment.
- s) Draft monthly ECO audit reports, starting from date of appointment and submit these to the Competent Authority.
- t) Attend relevant site meetings to present on environmental compliance and issues that would need to be addressed by the contractor.
- u) Prepare an environmental snag-list and close out report after the construction & rehabilitation phases has been completed.
- 2.2.2 The appointed ECO must be contactable by the public regarding matters of environmental concern as they relate to the operation of the works.

- Reporting back and fulfil role of rapporteur at the site meetings or meetings between the developer, DFFE
 and contractor.
- Issue the constructor with the Construction EMP.
- Appoint a Botanist to undertake a thorough search of the construction area to identify and/or mark any species of special concern as well as bulbs and where a need arises complete the permit application be obtained to relocate protected species.
- Notify SAHRA if the need arises if middens and artifacts of archaeological value are observed during construction.
- Review and issue to the constructor the Construction EMPr (CEMPr) and if required update CEMPr (or CEMP), submit the application as per the legal requirements.
- Attendance at monthly progress meetings and drafting the meeting minutes with the DFFE Project Manager
 held in Cape Town, or virtually at the discretion of the DFFE.
- Draft relevant templates that would be used for reporting and communicating with the contractor, these
 must include the incident form that would be completed by the contractor.
- Compile and ensure safe storage of all monthly progress reports and meeting minutes.
- Facilitation of hand over meeting and documentation to the DFFE project management team at completion
 of the contract.

- 3.2.5 The 80/20 as an appropriate preference point system will be used in the evaluation and adjudication of this quotation. However, it must be extended that the lowest acceptable supplier will be used to determine the applicable preference point system as per regulation (Section 3(2)(b) of the Preferential Procurement Regulations (PPR) 2022, which states: "If it is unclear which preference point system will be applicable, that either the 80/20 or 90/10 preference point system will apply and that the lowest acceptable supplier will be used to determine the applicable preference point system". Therefore, either 80 or 90 points, depending on the rand value of the quotation, will be awarded to the suppliers who offers the lowest price, and proportionately fewer points are awarded to those with higher prices. Either 20 or 10 points are then available as preference points for specific goals, as applicable. The contract will be awarded to the suppliers that scores the highest total number of adjudication points per category.
- 3.2.6 Points will be awarded to a supplier for specific goals in accordance with the table below:

- 3.2.7 The SCM unit of the DFFE / MLRF will allocate preferential points (Specific Goals) to each company for its contribution towards empowerment of the black designated groups as prescribed in the Preferential Procurement Regulations of 2022, women, people with disabilities, youth as well as local economic development.
- 3.2.8 A supplier will not be disqualified from the quotation process if the suppliers does not submit supporting documents substantiating the specific goals preference points claimed or is a non-compliant contributor. Such some suppliers will score 0 for Specific Goals.

- 5.2 The Department / MLRF will not be held responsible for any costs incurred by the SPs in the preparation, presentation and submission of the proposal.
