8 DISCLAIMERS

PRASA is not committed to any course of action because of its issuance of this RFQ and/or its receipt of a Quotation in response to it. Please note that PRASA reserves the right to:

- Modify the RFQ's goods / service(s)/works and request Bidders to re-bid on any changes.
- Reject any Quotation which does not conform to instructions and specifications which are detailed herein; and
- Reject Quotations submitted after the stated submission deadline or at the incorrect venue.

Should a contract be awarded on the strength of information furnished by the bidder, which after the conclusion of the contract, is proved to have been incorrect, PRASA reserves the right to cancel the contract.

PRASA reserves the right to award businesses to the highest scoring bidder/s unless objective criteria justify the award to another bidder.

Should the preferred bidder fail to sign or commence with the contract within a reasonable period after being requested to do so, PRASA reserves the right to award the business to the next highest ranked bidder provided that he/she/it is still prepared to provide the required goods at the quoted price.

9 LEGAL REVIEW

Proposed contractual terms and conditions submitted by a bidder will be subjected to review and acceptance or rejection by PRASA's Legal Counsel, prior to consideration for an award of business.

10 NATIONAL TREASURY'S CENTRAL SUPPLIER DATABASE

Bidders are required to self-register on National Treasury's Central Supplier Database (CSD) which has been established to centrally administer supplier information for all organs of state and facilitate the verification of certain key supplier information. PRASA is required to ensure that price quotations are invited and accepted from prospective bidders listed on the CSD. Business may not be awarded to a bidder who has failed to register on the CSD. 11 PROTECTION OF PERSONAL DATA

In responding to this bid, PRASA acknowledges that it may obtain and have access to personal data of the Bidders. PRASA agrees that it shall only process the information disclosed by Bidders in their response to this bid for the purpose of evaluating and subsequent award of business and in accordance with any applicable law.

Furthermore, PRASA will not otherwise modify, amend or alter any personal data submitted by Bidders or disclose or permit the disclosure of any personal data to any Third Party without the prior written consent from the Bidders. Similarly, PRASA requires Bidders to process any personal information disclosed by PRASA in the bidding process in the same manner.

13 ADMINISTRATIVE RESPONSIVENESS

The test for administrative responsiveness will include completeness of response and whether all returnable and/or required documents, certificates; verify completeness of warranties and other bid requirements and formalities have been complied with. Incomplete Bids will be disqualified.

14 VALIDITY PERIOD

14.1 PRASA requires a validity period of **90 Working Days** from the closing date.

14.2 Bidders are to note that they may be requested to extend the validity period of their response, on the same terms and conditions, if the internal processes are not finalized within the validity period. However, once the delegated authority has approved the process the validity of the successful bidder(s)' bid will be deemed to remain valid until finalization of the award.).

15 PUBLICATION OF INFORMATION ON THE NATIONAL TREASURY E-TENDER PORTAL

Bidders are to note that, bid awards, amendments and cancellations will be published on the e-tender portal and or media used to advertise the bid. 2. Stage 2: Technical / Functionality Requirements

The technical evaluation process will be conducted in two phases, as outlined below:

2.1. Stage 2A: Phase 1: Document-Based Technical Evaluation

In this phase, bidders will be evaluated based on their technical capability, compliance with product standards, and ability to demonstrate past performance in the supply of Personal Protective Equipment (PPE).

Bidders are required to submit a completed PPE Technical Assessment Sheet along with all mandatory supporting documents, which include: valid product certifications, detailed product data sheets, documented proof of similar completed PPE supply contracts, a signed warranty commitment for the listed items, and a delivery lead time declaration supported by relevant evidence. Only bidders who achieve a minimum score of 70% in this phase will be considered for **Phase 2 (Sample Inspection)**.

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2.2. Stage 2B: Phase 2 Sample Inspection, Assessment, and Testing

Bidders who meet or exceed the 70% threshold in Phase 1 will proceed to Phase 2. This phase involves **inspection of PPE samples** to verify compliance with PRASA standards and specifications.

2.2.1. General Requirements

Suppliers must prepare and submit PPE samples for each item specified in the Bill of Quantities (BOQ), along with detailed datasheets and product catalogues. PRASA will perform physical inspections and verifications to assess compliance with technical specifications, quality standards, and performance requirements.

2.2.2. Submission Deadline

All samples and supporting documentation must be submitted within **5 working days** from the date of formal request by PRASA.

Late or incomplete submissions will be disqualified and **not considered** for further evaluation.

2.2.3. Evaluation Criteria

Submitted samples and documentation will be evaluated comprehensively against the following criteria:

Evaluation Criteria	Description
Material Quality	PPE must be made from high-quality, durable materials. Resistance to wear, comfort features (e.g., breathability, softness), and protection against specific hazards will be assessed. Inferior materials or uncomfortable designs will not be accepted.
Compliance to Standards	All PPE items must comply with applicable national or international standards (e.g., OSHA, SANS, SABS, EN). Certification documents must be valid and verifiable. Non-compliant or uncertified items will be disqualified.
Design and Fit	PPE must offer ergonomic design, proper fit, and freedom of movement without compromising protection. Poorly fitting or restrictive designs will be rejected.
Protection Efficiency	Items must effectively protect against relevant hazards (e.g., chemicals, impact, particulates). Supporting test data or certifications must be provided. Insufficient protection leads to disqualification.

Ease of Use and Maintenance	PPE should be easy to wear, clean, store, and maintain. Clear maintenance instructions must be provided. Cumbersome items or those without instructions may be rejected.
Packaging and Labeling	Packaging must protect the product and include accurate labeling (e.g., content, batch number, manufacture and expiry dates). Inadequate packaging or labeling may lead to rejection.
Health and Safety Compliance	PPE must comply with occupational health and safety regulations. Required documentation includes Material Safety Data Sheets (MSDS) and evidence of non-toxic materials. Non-compliance results in disqualification.

2.2.4. Evaluation Methodology

2.2.4.1. Submission Verification

All submissions will be checked for completeness and timely delivery. Late or incomplete submissions will be automatically disqualified.

2.2.4.2. Preliminary Compliance Check

A review will be conducted to confirm the presence and validity of all required documentation and certifications. Missing or invalid documents will result in disqualification.

2.2.4.3. Physical Inspection and Testing

Qualified samples will be physically inspected to verify material quality, fit, design, and other attributes. PRASA may require laboratory testing at the bidder's cost if necessary.

2.2.4.4. Comply / Not Comply Assessment

Each submission will be assessed strictly according to the criteria above. Any failure to comply with a mandatory requirement will result in the submission being marked "Not Compliant" and excluded from further consideration.

2.2.4.5. Final Determination

Only submissions that meet **all mandatory requirements** will proceed to the next stage of procurement evaluation

2 Stage 3- Price and Specific Goals Evaluation.

3. POINTS AWARDED FOR SPECIFIC GOALS

- 3.1. In terms of Regulation 4(2); 5(2); 6(2) and 7(2) of the Preferential Procurement Regulations, preference points must be awarded for specific goals stated in the tender. For the purposes of this tender the tenderer will be allocated points based on the goals stated in table 1 below as may be supported by proof/ documentation stated in the conditions of this tender:

4. OBJECTIVE CRITERIA

- 4.1** Section 2(1)(f) of the PPPFA empowers an organ of state to award a tender to the highest scoring bidder unless there is an objective criterion that justify the award to another tenderer.
- 4.2** PRASA reserves the right to apply the objective criteria for this bid.
- 4.3** PRASA may award a bid to a bidder that did not score the highest points under the following circumstances:
- A negative track record of the bidder in other related projects.
 - spreading the award to bidders that have not been previously appointed.
 - the need to avoid concentrating awards to the previously appointed bidders. Prasa shall consider the following:
 - the number of bid(s) awarded to the highest scoring bidder(s) in the preceding financial years.
 - the capacity of the highest scoring bidder(s) despite the previous appointments.
 - the value and scope of the bid(s) already awarded to the highest scoring bidder(s);
 - the materiality of the price difference between the highest scoring bidder and other bidders; and
 - whether the goods, services or works are of a specialized nature.

5. SPLITTING OF AWARDS

- 5.1** PRASA reserves the right to split the award of this bid to more than one service provider, provided that the nature of the services or goods or works to be provided are capable of being split to more than one service provider.

6. APPOINTMENTS OTHER THAN THE SUCCESSFUL BIDDER

6.1 PRASA may appoint a bidder other than the successful bidder under the following instances:

- (i) When a successful bidder, after having been informed of the acceptance of its Bid, fails to sign a contract within a prescribe period e.g. 14 (fourteen) days after being called upon to do so.
- (ii) When a successful bidder has failed to provide the necessary security, bonds or guarantees within the time required to do so by PRASA.
- (iii) When a successful bidder fails to meet a condition precedent for the award of business (e.g. to obtain the necessary funding); and
- (iv) When final contract negotiations with a preferred bidder fails and a contract is not agreed upon.

6.2 PRASA will only award a bid to a bidder other than the highest scoring bidder provided that such bid is still within the bid validity period.

6.3 Only if the second ranked bidder is also unable/unwilling, PRASA may proceed to the third ranked bidder.

SECTION 4

PRICING AND DELIVERY SCHEDULE

- 3 Pricing Bill of Quantity is completed in line with schedule if applicable (delete if not applicable).
- 4 Cost breakdown must be indicated.
- 5 Price escalation basis and formula must be indicated.
- 6 To facilitate like-for like comparison bidders must submit pricing strictly in accordance with this price schedule and not utilize a different format. Deviation from this pricing schedule could result in a bid being declared non-responsive.
- 7 Please note that should you have offered a discounted price(s), PRASA will only consider such price discount(s) in the final evaluation stage on an unconditional basis.

ANNEXURE A**SPECIAL CONDITIONS OF TENDER****1. GENERAL**

- 1.1 Unless otherwise stated, an employee, employees, committee or department designated by Prasa shall be the inspecting authority.
- 1.2 Pre-production samples from the range of sizes shall have been inspected, tested and approved by the inspecting authority before bulk production is commenced, and it shall be the duty of the manufacturer to give adequate notice to the inspecting authority of the availability of these samples. The inspection process is described below in paragraph 2.
- 1.3 The garments/items shall be subject to inspection during manufacture. The inspecting authority shall, during regular working hours, be given all reasonable facilities for carrying out his duties and shall have the right of entry into the contractor's factory and the factory or works of any sub-contractor where work on garments/items supplied to this specification may be in progress.
- 1.4 The contractor shall inspect the finished garments for compliance with the specification before submitting them to the inspecting authority for final inspection.
- 1.5 Before acceptance, the garments/items shall have been inspected and tested by the inspecting authority and found to comply with the requirements of the specification.

2. THE INSPECTION PROCESS

- 2.1 Prasa shall provide the garment/item specifications for all applicable garments/items in electronic format to service providers who wish to tender or quote.
- 2.2 Service providers must provide a quotation sample (only one sample from the range of sizes) of each garment/item according to specifications with their quotation.
- 2.3 Service providers must, as part of their tender/quotation, also include letters from fabric and reflective tape manufacturers to indicate the content, specification, manufacturing country, and technical data sheets of these products (where applicable) to be used during the production of the garments/items. Non-compliance in providing such letters shall disqualify the tender/quotation.
- 2.4 The inspecting authority shall assess the sample garments/items for compliance with the provided specifications.
- 2.5 A purchase order will be issued to the successful service provider(s) once the inspecting authority is satisfied with the quotation sample.
- 2.6 A briefing meeting will be held with the appointed service provider(s) to discuss the specifications before a pre-production sample is manufactured.

- 2.7 A pre-production sample (only one size) of each garment/item has to be provided by the service provider for inspection by the inspecting authority, using a predetermined checklist to ensure that all specification criteria are met.
- 2.8 Photographic evidence of compliance/non-compliance must be kept by the inspecting authority for all specification areas as per the checklist for each pre-production garment/item sample.
- 2.9 Where pre-production samples do not meet the criteria, a new/corrected pre-production sample must be provided for inspection and verification, and the same process as indicated in paragraphs 2.8 to 2.9 needs to be repeated.
- 2.10 The service provider and all members of the inspecting authority will sign off the completed inspection checklist for each garment/item found to meet the specification criteria.
- 2.11 Prasa shall retain all approved (signed-off) pre-production samples for comparison with produced garments/items as it is delivered to confirm continuous adherence to the specifications.
- 2.12 Once a pre-production sample was approved; the service provider shall commence manufacturing one size each for all different garments/items; the process from steps 2.8 to 2.12 has to be followed to ensure that all the various sizes of garments/items also meet the specification criteria.
