- 1.4 Late and incomplete submissions will not be considered. Submissions received after closing time and date will be classified as LATE and WILL NOT be considered.
- 1.5 No services must be rendered, or goods delivered before an official MLRF Purchase Order form has been issued by a duly authorised official from the MLRF and received by the bidder. Please note that this is not an instruction to proceed with supply of any goods or service unless the quotation is approved, and a Purchase Order is supplied to you.
- 1.6 Please note that if you receive the Purchase Order, delivery of goods or rendering of services must be done within 14 calendar days or upon agreed time frames. Failing to deliver upon agreed times will result in your Purchase Order being cancelled.
- 1.7 This RFQ will be evaluated in terms of the 80/20 preference point system if is equal to or below R50 million.
- 1.8 Bidders are required to register on the Central Supplier Database at www.csd.gov.za if you are not registered on the CSD.
- 1.9 All questions regarding this RFQ must be forwarded to tnw50@dffe.gov.za within 24 hours after the RFQ has been issued.
- 1.10 Any bidder who has reasons to believe that the RFQ specification is based on a specific brand must inform MLRF within two (2) days before the RFQ closing date.
- 1.11 Where quotations/proposals submitted are equal to or below R50 million, bidders are required to submit the original and valid proof for preference points claimed or certified copies thereof; to substantiate their preference points claims. SBD 6.1 must also be duly completed, signed, and submitted alongside the bid to claim preference points. Failure to do so will result in preference points being forfeited.

- 1.13 Bidders are required to duly complete, sign and submit the new SBD 4 together with their quotations/proposals. Failure to do so may result in your quotation/proposal **not** being accepted.
- 1.14 For designated sectors for local production and content, SBD 6.2 and Annexures C, D & E must be duly completed, signed and SBD 6.2 together with Annex E must be submitted with your quotation/proposal.
- 1.15 All quotations/proposals submitted must be inclusive of Value Added Tax (VAT) if you are VAT registered and must be quoted in South African Rands (ZAR) and price must be firm.
- 1.16 The full costs must be disclosed as there will be no variances that will be entertained, and no price adjustment will be entertained after the Purchase Order has been issued.
- 1.17 These terms and conditions supersede any terms and conditions that may be issued by the service provider/supplier on their quotations or any other document similar to that.

1. PURPOSE

- 1.1. The Marine Living Resource Fund (MLRF), Fisheries Management Branch of the Department of Forestry, Fisheries, and the Environment requires the services of a Service Provider (SP) to facilitate the establishment of a small-scale fishery local co-management structure for 8 small-scale fishing co-operatives within the Port St Johns Local Municipality in the Eastern Cape, over five (5) months.

3. SPECIFICATIONS

- 3.1 The role of the SP(S) will be to assist the Department in the establishment of Local co-management structure within the Port St Johns Local Municipality in the Eastern Cape. This will include nominations of representatives to server in the co-management structures from the respective small-scale fishing co-operatives within the Port St Johns Local Municipality is indicated in the table below. In addition, the SP will also be required to conduct training and capacity building; develop co-management agreements and implement such co-management agreements.

- 3.2 For the DFFE/MLRF to be able to provide developmental support to the co-management structures, the SP is required to conduct co-management-related training to members of the Co-management structures.
- 3.3 The SP(s) must ensure that all physical meetings and other activities related to the process are recorded and reported on in a format as required by DFFE/MLRF and submitted as agreed to DFFE/MLRF.
- 3.4 The SP must provide logistics such as booking of venues, catering (Tea/coffee with morning snacks, warm lunch with cool drink) and transport (where required) and accommodation (where required) for all participants per meeting session. The SP must quote per person for both breakfast and lunch.
- 3.5 The SP must also conduct monitoring and evaluation of the implementation process and to implement any revision or revisiting where required, throughout the implementation period.
- 3.6 The Service Provider must provide a close out report with relevant recommendations based on the detailed job description. The report to be submitted to the project manager within a month after the end of the pilot project to be reviewed and approved by the project manager.
- 3.7 The SP(s) must declare that they have no direct financial interest in the small-scale fishing sector and its value chain (direct buying, processing and/or marketing of fish products from a identified eight (8) fishing co-operatives.

Detailed description:

- 3.8 The SP(s) will focus on the following key deliverables, which will serve as the Terms of Reference (TOR):
- 3.8.1 Facilitating initial engagements to establish local co-management structure.**
- a) Based on the contact details you will receive from the Department and the announcement of the project; you will be required to contact all 8 small-scale fishing co-operatives informing them of your scope of work.
- 3.8.2 Establish of small-scale fishing Local co-management structure within the Port St Johns Local Municipality in the Eastern Cape.**
- a) The Service Provider(s) (SP) must submit a project implementation plan and must be approved by project manager prior to the actual work start. The project plan must include a problem recognition and preliminary assessment of the project.

- b) Develop a management structure plan and clear timeframes and deliverables and schedules for meetings on the progress of the project. Which will include the project implementation plan, proposed stakeholder engagements and the formulation of a proposed co-management structure.
- c) Establish communications and coordination approach for the duration of the project implementation period.
- d) Analysis and plan on the approach to be followed (including identification of stakeholders and possible co-management structure model).
- e) Co-operative mobilisation and Development of community facilitation schedule.

3.8.3 Finalise nominations of representatives and revisit certain areas for re-election (where necessary).

- a) The Service Provider to visit all 8 small-scale fishing co-operatives to facilitate for the nomination of small-scale fishing co-operatives members who will serve and represent his/her co-operative in the local co-management structure within the Post St Johns Local Municipality.
- b) The Service Provider, with the project manager, must identify and engage with relevant stakeholders and spheres of government that would form part of or consult on the co-management structure.
- c) The Service Provider must guarantee the presence of suitable personnel to oversee fieldwork throughout the duration of the contract and provide such staff with the relevant training.
- d) The Service provider is expected to facilitate small-scale fisheries co-management structure workshops with identified stakeholders as the above. This will require the service provider to:
 - i. Book an appropriate venue.
 - ii. Provide transport and/or accommodation for participants (where required).
 - iii. Provide catering including Tea (with morning snacks) and warm Lunch (with cool drink)
 - iv. Facilitate the content required to establish co-management structure. By including, but not limited to:
 - Why a local co-management.
 - Roadmap to establishing a local co-management structure.
 - Develop and implement co-management agreements.
 - Develop and implement protocols outlining the practical steps per deliverable.
- e) Convene an inaugural co-management structure with relevant and identified stakeholders.
- f) Facilitate the development of founding documents such as, but not limited to, co-management agreements, code of conduct, Terms of reference, etc.

3.8.4 Conduct training and Capacity building (A minimum of 3 relevant and identified training themes may be done in one seating)

- a) Identify training needs for the local co-management structure established/being established.
- b) Facilitate training sessions with identified stakeholders by:
 - i. Securing meeting venues
 - ii. Sending invites
 - iii. Transportation (where required) and accommodation (where necessary) of co-management members.
 - iv. Provide training (may be non-accredited)
 - v. Providing Logistics (as per heading 2 above)
- c) Capture attendance registers, minutes, and video clips of proceedings of all meetings.

4. EVALUATION METHOD

4.1 PHASE 1: FUNCTIONALITY AND TECHNICAL CRITERIA

Only bid proposals that meets pre-qualification will be considered to be evaluated on functionality and technical criteria,

4.2 PREFERENTIAL POINTS (80/20 SYSTEM)

- 4.2.1 An evaluation of Price and Specific Goals Preference points on the suppliers, that successful qualified to this stage of evaluation.
- 4.2.2 **Calculation of points for price** - The Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act (PPPFA) prescribes that the lowest acceptable bid will score 80 points (for tenders under R50m) or 90 points (for tenders above R50m) for price. Suppliers that quoted higher prices will score lower points for price on a pro-rata basis. Where functionality is set as criteria, only bid proposals that meets functionality requirements will be considered for evaluation on price and specific goals preference points.
- 4.2.3 The 80/20 as an appropriate preference point system will be used in the evaluation and adjudication of this quote. - 4.2.4 Points will be awarded to a supplier for specific goals. Bidders are required to submit the original and valid proof for preference points claimed or certified copies thereof; to substantiate their preference points claims. SBD 6.1 must also be duly completed, signed, and submitted alongside the bid to claim preference points. Failure to do so will result in Specific Goals preference points being forfeited.
- 4.2.5 The 80/20 as an appropriate preference point system will be used in the evaluation and adjudication of this quotation. 4.2.7 The SCM unit of the DFFE / MLRF will allocate preferential points (Specific Goals) to each company for its contribution towards empowerment of the black designated groups as prescribed in the Preferential Procurement Regulations of 2022, women, people with disabilities, youth as well as local economic development.

4.2.8 A supplier will not be disqualified from the quotation process if the suppliers does not submit supporting documents substantiating the specific goals preference points claimed or is a non-compliant contributor. Such some suppliers will score 0 for Specific Goals.

4.2.9 Suppliers will be subject to SCM conditions of the Department – MLRF and the Preferential Procurement Regulations, 2022 issued in terms of section 5 of the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act (Act No 5 of 2000) (PPPFA).

4.2.10 The PPPFA prescribes that the lowest acceptable bid will score 80 or 90 points for price (as explained above, depending on whether the bid prices is more or less than R50million). Suppliers that quoted higher prices will score lower points for price on a pro-rata basis. Where functionality is set as a criterion, only bid proposals that meets functionality requirements will be considered to be evaluated on price and Specific Goals.
