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- 6.4.1 Bids will be evaluated in terms of the new **Preferential Procurement Regulation**, **2017** and the bid evaluation criteria stipulated in this section.
- 6.4.2 Tenderers must, as part of their bid documents, submit supportive documentation for all functional requirements as indicated in the Terms of Reference. The panel responsible for scoring the respective bids will evaluate and score all bids based on their submissions and the information provided.
- 6.4.3 The score for functionality will be determined by the Bid Evaluation Committee (BEC) whereby each member will rate each individual criterion or it may be decided to rate tenderers collectively by allocating the specified points indicated.

#### 8. JOINT VENTURE AGREEMENTS

- 8.1 Where an entity forms a Joint Venture or a Consortium with another entity and/or other entities, such parties must express in the bid proposal and a JV agreement should be submitted together with the bid. In the JV agreement the banking details which the payment should be made must be specified and should remain the same for the duration of the contract. Authorised signatories of documents, invoices and reports should be appointed in the JV agreement.

#### 9. CONFIDENTIALITY

- 9.1 Information relating to the evaluation of proposals and recommendations concerning award shall not be disclosed to any bidder who submitted the proposals or to other persons not officially concerned with the process, until the successful bidder has been notified of the outcome of the bid.
- 9.2 No material or information derived from the procurement and provision of the services under the contract may be used for any purposes other than those of Free State Provincial Government, except where authorized in writing to do so.

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9.3 DARD: FS agrees to keep the details of the bidder's proposal strictly confidential, including but not limited to any financial information provided, and will not disclose the content thereof to any third party, except as required by law.

#### 10. AGREEMENTS

- 10.1 The Service Provider(s) will be expected to sign a Service Level Agreement with DARD: FS. The Service Level Agreement or any other applicable construction contract will be subject to the bid documents, including the General Conditions of Contract (GCC), Scope of Work and Contract data as well as clauses related to other construction related contracts such as the GCC for Construction work, JBCC, etc.
- 10.2 Should funds no longer be available to pay for the execution of the responsibilities of Bid DARD/RFT 06/2022, the Department may terminate the Agreement in its own discretion or temporarily suspend all or part of the services by notice to the successful bidder who shall immediately make arrangements to stop the performance of the services and minimize further expenditure: Provided that the successful bidder shall thereupon be entitled to payment in full for the services delivered, up to the date of cancellation or suspension.

- 12.2 The Provincial Government may not award any tender or enter into any contract with an employee of the Free State Provincial Government or a provincial public entity contrary to Treasury Instruction Note 17 of 2012.
- 12.3 All bids received contrary to Treasury Instruction Note 17 of 2012 shall be disqualified.
- 12.4 For the definition of "business interest", "employee" and "entity", refer to par. 5 of Treasury Instruction Note 17 of 2012.

### 13. VALIDITY PERIOD OF BID AND EXTENSION THEREOF

13.1 The validity (binding) period for the bid will be 120 days from close of bid. However, circumstances may arise whereby the department may request tenderers to extend the validity (binding) period. Should any requirements of the measurement and payment clause of the applicable Standard Specification, or the Scope of Work, conflict with the terms of the Bill of Quantities, the requirements of the Standard Specification or Scope of Work, as applicable, shall prevail.
- 6. The prices and rates to be inserted in the Bill of Quantities are to be full inclusive prices for the work described under the items. Such prices and rates shall cover all costs and expenses that may be required in and for the execution of the work described, and shall cover the cost of all general risks, liabilities, and obligations set forth or implied in the documents on which the tender is based, as well as overhead charges and profit. Reasonable prices shall be inserted as these will be used as a basis for assessment of payment for additional work that may have to be carried out.

## BACKGROUND

The following provides a background on Gariep Aquaculture Technology Demonstration Centre (ATDC) with special reference to Tilapia mini hatchery unit.



### LOCATION DISCRIPTION

The project is located in Free State province, Xhariep District, kopanong local municipality, Gariep dam along the Orange River System which supplies water to the Centre, Area of 47 ha.



Figure1: Maps depicting the area in RSA, Free State Province showing where Gariep ATDC is situated and exact spot Gariep ATDC at Gariep dam.

The Gariep ATDC is situated along the Upper Orange River Water Basin in the Xhariep District bordering the Northern Cape Province. The total farm is amounting 47 ha in size, though the portion area parcel where the Centre is situated is less than 20 Ha.

The key functions of the Gariep Aquaculture Technology Demonstration Centre (ATDC) is for research and development, technology demonstration, fish breeding techniques, training and promotions to support aquacultural development in the South African Development Community regional countries, with special reference to South Africa as the country of first priority.

The Gariep ATDC systems was initially planned and developed as Flow Through Aquaculture System (FTAS) for both breeding and grower production systems, which was and is still inefficient. This FTAS is not user friendly since it is not energy efficient (meaning it wastes lot of electricity because the water from the Orange River is only heated once and then flow back directly into the river without reuse, thus continuous heating), FTAS is further risky because there is higher chances for both fries and fingerlings fish to have higher chances of escaping into the Orange River due to poor metal screen, thus it can result in dire repercussions.

The whole Hatchery FTAS is in the process of been reconstructed into Recirculating Aquaculture System (RAS), of which both the hatchery for brooder stock and nursery grower for growing both fries and fingerlings units are anticipated to operate more energy efficient and cost effectively;

After the handover of the Gariep ATDC by the Chinese Government to RSA Government, with special reference to the National Department of Agriculture, a new premise was set wherein, the systems were

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DARD/RFT 06/2022: UPGRADE OF THE OLD NURSERY/HATCHERY BUILDING FOR TILAPIA BREEDING AND FRIES PRODUCTION AT ATDC re-planned to suit the South African conditions. This therefore, let to the redesigning and refocusing to ensure efficient upgrade in order to support sustainable development from Flow-Through Aquaculture Systems (FTAS) to Recirculating Aquaculture Systems (RAS).

It is against this background therefore that, a Tilapia Mini Hatchery RAS Unit is in the process of been developed through reconstruction (see picture 1 & 2) from the existing old hatchery and store building into a Tilapia Mini Hatchery RAS facility. The current old hatchery and store building needs to be reconstructed into a more plausible user friendly system to ensure effective and efficient Research & Development, hatchery for breeding, Training and promotion, and Technology demonstrations infrastructure through upgrade. The attached sketch depicts a full component design plans for the envisaged new Tilapia Mini Hatchery;

Currently the FTAS is been converted into RAS, of which for further development of Tilapia species within the fish industry, a Tilapia Mini Hatchery is a necessity;

Since the whole old hatchery is been upgraded to RAS. The store-room joined with old hatchery building is hereby to be reconstructed and upgraded to a more economical plausible RAS unit for Tilapia breeding purposes;

The ultimate intent and processes of the Gariep ATDC includes amongst others, center's revitalization, upgrade, further development and growth to serve and fulfill the requirements of a developmental state for successful R&D, Breeding techniques, Training promotions and technology demonstration.








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



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















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FIGURE 9: Leaky pipe diffuser construction
