The update of the **FRAMEWORK AGREEMENT FOR CONSTRUCTION WORKS** for a period of 2-years starting 1 April 2026 and ending on 31 March 2028, for the procurement of construction work in relation to;

• Construction of sheep shearing sheds	• Construction of multi-purpose sheds
• Construction of plunge dip facilities for cattle	• Construction of large stock handling facilities for cattle
• Construction of spray dip facilities for cattle	• Construction of small stock handling facilities for sheep
• Stock water reticulation system	• Rehabilitation of earth dams for stock water

3. Bidders already on the framework who wish to change the area of operation may apply for swapping

4. **Bidders are to note the functionality criteria scoring for each commodity and ensure submission of the required in order to qualify for points.**

DETAIL SCOPE OF WORK FOR THE CATEGORIES OF WORKS TENDERED

Refer to Schedule 1 – **General Specification** attached to this Framework Agreement for Technical Standards for the Works.

1 SHEARING SHEDS

Scope of Work:

The construction of shearing sheds on agricultural land at various locations in the Eastern Cape Province.

Shearing sheds would typically be located in remote rural agricultural areas of the Eastern Cape Province. It would be required from the appointed contractor to have proven experience in general building projects, have access to the required plant; and have experienced qualified personnel on site to execute the works on instruction of the Employers Agent, to adhere to specification.

The works include:

1. A masonry building of 20 x 9m, concrete floor, plastered, painted, with a pitched roof covered with IBR Chromadek sheeting.
2. A concrete sheep plunge dip tank
3. Pit toilet
4. Perimeter fence
5. The supply and demonstration of shearing equipment.
6. The supply and demonstration of prefabricated sheep handling sections.

The contractor will be responsible for the supply and delivery of materials to site, as well as the execution of all works.

2. MULTIPURPOSE SHEDS

Scope of Work:

The construction of Multipurpose Sheds on agricultural land at various locations in the Eastern Cape Province.

Multipurpose Sheds would typically be located in remote rural agricultural areas of the Eastern Cape Province. It would be required from the appointed contractor to have proven experience in general building projects, have access to the required plant; and have experienced qualified personnel on site to execute the works on instruction of the Employers Agent, to adhere to specifications.

The works include:

1. A portal frame structure as per measurements indicated by the Employer's Agent, steel sliding doors, IBR sheeting and cladding, concrete floor, apron and ramps.
2. Pit toilet
3. Perimeter fence
4. The supply and demonstration of shearing equipment.
5. The supply and demonstration of prefabricated sheep handling sections.

The contractor shall provide the Engineer with an approved geotechnical investigation report with recommendation for the treatment of the subgrade, should it be required, an approved structural design certificate, drawings and specifications, as provided by the design engineer and manufacturer. The design of the structure and footings must be based on the findings and recommendations of the geotechnical report. The contractor and design engineer takes full responsibility and liability for the structure. The structure must be erected from a level area. The contractor will be responsible for the supply and delivery of materials to site, as well as the execution of all works.

3. PLUNGE DIP FOR CATTLE

Scope of Work:

The construction of a Plunge Dip Facility on agricultural land at various locations in the Eastern Cape Province.

Plunge Dip Tank Facilities would typically be located in remote rural agricultural areas of the Eastern Cape Province. It would be required from the appointed contractor to have proven experience in general civil projects, have proven experience in reinforced water tight concrete structures or reinforced concrete water holding structures, have proven experience of form work with shuttering, have access to the required plant; and have experienced qualified personnel on site to execute the works on instruction of the Employers Agent, to adhere to specifications.

The works include:

1. A cattle handling facility from steel IPE and CFLC sections or timber treated poles, a reinforced concrete water tight plunge dip with capacity of at least 15 000liters, a reinforced concrete water tight evaporation pond, a sludge pump with pipes and fittings for emptying and cleaning the dip tank, a neck clamp and concrete floors for the drip race and stone pitched concrete as per measurements indicated on the drawings or by the Employer's Agent;
4. The plunge dip structure is reinforced concrete casted in shuttering works and due to the height of the walls, scaffolding works is also required.
5. The concrete race floor and dip tank will be constructed at a slope of 1% fall to the plunge dip to ensure water returning to plunge dip;
6. A 2,4m x 2,4m Steel Dip Storage Shed manufactured from 50 x 50 x 3mm square tubing frame covered with Chromadek IBR sheeting;
7. Installation of a stock water system consisting of the equipping of the borehole with a submersible pump, wind turbine, water tanks, drinking troughs and the pipe network;
8. Perimeter stock proof fence of 1,2m height around the facility; and 1,2m welded mesh fence around water tanks and evaporation pond;
9. The demonstration of use and maintenance of the sludge pump and stock water system.

The contractor will be responsible for the supply and delivery of all materials to site, as well as the execution of all works.

4. SPRAY DIP FOR CATTLE

Scope of Work:

The construction of Spray Dip Facility on agricultural land at various locations in the Eastern Cape Province.

Spray Dip Tank Facilities would typically be located in remote rural agricultural areas of the Eastern Cape Province. It would be required from the appointed contractor to have proven experience in general civil projects, have access to the required plant; and have experienced qualified personnel on site to execute the works on instruction of the Employers Agent, to adhere to specifications.

The works include:

1. A cattle handling facility from steel IPE and CFLC sections or timber treated poles, a pre-manufactured spray dip covered with IBR cladding, pre-manufactured water reservoir with capacity of 1 300liters and pump with pipes and fittings for spray dip, a neck clamp and concrete floors for the race and stone pitched concrete as per drawing or as indicated by the Employer's Agent;

2. The concrete race floor and dip tank will be constructed at a slope of 1% fall to the spray dip to ensure water returning to spray dip reservoir;
3. A 2,4m x 2,4m Steel Dip Storage Shed manufactured from 50 x 50 x 3mm square tubing frame covered with Chromadek IBR sheeting;
4. Installation of a stock water system consisting of the equipping of the borehole with a submersible pump, wind turbine, water tanks, drinking troughs and the pipe network;
5. Perimeter stock proof fence of 1,2m height around the facility;
6. The demonstration of use and maintenance of the pre-manufactured spray dip and pump and stock water system.

The contractor will be responsible for the supply and delivery of materials to site, as well as the execution of all works.

5. LARGE STOCK HANDLING FACILITY FOR CATTLE

Scope of Work:

The construction of Large Stock Handling Facilities on agricultural land at various locations in the Eastern Cape Province.

Large Stock Handling Facilities would typically be located in remote rural agricultural areas of the Eastern Cape Province. It would be required from the appointed contractor to have proven experience in general building projects, have access to the required plant; and have experienced qualified personnel on site to execute the works on instruction of the Employers Agent, to adhere to specifications.

The works include:

1. A timber large stock handling facility.
2. Crush with scale and heavy duty body- and neck clamp.
3. Loading ramp.

The contractor will be responsible for the supply and delivery of materials to site, as well as the execution of all works.

1. SMALL STOCK HANDLING FACILITY FOR SHEEP AND GOATS

Scope of Work:

The construction of Small Stock Handling Facilities on agricultural land at various locations in the Eastern Cape Province.

Small Stock Handling Facilities would typically be located in remote rural agricultural areas of the Eastern Cape Province. It would be required from the appointed contractor to have proven experience in general building projects, have access to the required plant; and have experienced qualified personnel on site to execute the works on instruction of the Employers Agent, to adhere to specifications.

The works include:

1. A small stock handling facility.
2. Sheep race and loading ramp.

The contractor will be responsible for the supply and delivery of materials to site, as well as the execution of all works.

2. STOCK WATER RETICULATION SYSTEM

Scope of Work:

The abstraction of water from a water source and installation of a stock water reticulation system on agricultural land at various locations in the Eastern Cape Province.

Abstraction of water from a water source such as rivers, dams and boreholes and installation of water reticulation system for stock water system would typically be located in remote rural agricultural areas of the Eastern Cape Province. It would be required from the appointed contractor to have proven

experience in water reticulation system powered by wind turbines, solar systems, wind mills or engines and generator sets and stock water system installation projects, have access to the required plant; and have experienced qualified personnel on site to execute the works on instruction of the Employers Agent, to adhere to specifications.

The works include:

1. The equipping of boreholes with electric submersible pumps, wind mill water cylinder or mono pump elements;
2. The energy source for the borehole pump could be an ESCOM connection, wind turbine, wind mill, engine or generator set;
3. All electrical works must be executed by a registered electrician and an approval certificate (COC) must be submitted;
4. Reticulation of a stock water system consists of connecting the water pipes (steel pipes or HPPE (high density polyethylene pipes)) from the borehole pump to the water reservoir and reticulate to the drinking troughs;
5. Reinforced concrete works are required for the foundations/footings of the wind turbine/ solar panel system and windmill as well as the concrete slab for the water tanks;
6. The water reservoir can be a polyethylene water tank/s or concrete reservoir and the size will be as indicated by the Employer's Agent or as indicated on the drawings;
7. The drinking troughs could be steel troughs, polyethylene troughs or concrete troughs and the size will be as indicated by the Employer's Agent or as indicated on the drawings;
8. Water reticulation pipes can be above ground if the terrain is very rocky or it can be laid underground by means of trenching;
9. All polyethylene tanks and drinking troughs shall be installed on a concrete slab as indicated by the Employer's Agent or as indicated on the drawings;
10. A demonstration on the use and maintenance of the stock water system shall be conducted by the contractor in order for the beneficiaries to utilize the stock water system.
11. Perimeter stock proof fence of 1,2m height around the facility water tanks and wind turbine and borehole;

The contractor will be responsible for the supply and delivery of materials to site, as well as the execution of all works.

3. REHABILITATION OF EARTH DAMS FOR STOCK WATER

Scope of Work:

The de-silting, repairing, and upgrading of existing small earth dams on agricultural land at various locations in the Eastern Cape Province.

Dams would typically be existing small earth dams, located in remote rural agricultural areas of the Eastern Cape Province. It would be required from the appointed contractor to have proven experience in the building, repair and renovation of earth dams; have access to the required plant; and have experienced qualified personnel on site to execute the works on instruction of the Employers Agent, to adhere to the following basic specifications:

1. The dam must be constructed in such a manner, to make provision for a minimum water capacity of 5000m³, unless otherwise specified by the engineer.
2. A minimum spillway width of 10m to be used, widening further away from the embankment (see drawing), unless otherwise specified by the engineer. Care must be taken to ensure that runoff water will be discharged safely in the original watercourse.
3. A minimum total board of 1m to be used, unless otherwise specified by the engineer.
4. An additional 10% must be added to the embankment height, to make provision for settlement.

5. Sediment in the dam basin, may not be used as building material for dam wall. The core of the dam wall must be built with well graded soils, with a clay contents between 15 and 35 %. The sediment may only be used as a filler on the outer layers of the wall.
6. Material with the highest clay content, which are the least impermeable must be used in the core of the wall, while the material with lower clay content can be used on outer layer.
7. Embankment slopes of 3:1 upstream, and 2:1 downstream must be maintained, with a crest width of at least 2m.

Framework Rules

1. The Framework

- 1.1 The Employer

The Department of AGRICULTURE – represented by the Head of Department or his delegated official.
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has established a framework for the procurement of construction work in relation to

1. **Construction of sheep shearing sheds** – The construction of shearing sheds on agricultural land at various locations in the Eastern Cape Province.
2. **Construction of multipurpose sheds** - Supply and Delivery of materials for multipurpose shed and the Construction of the facility in line with the Drawings and Specifications.
3. **Construction of plunge dip facilities for cattle** - Supply and Delivery of materials for plunge dip facility and the Construction of the facility in line with the Drawings and Specifications.
4. **Construction of spray dip facilities for cattle** - Supply and Delivery of materials for spray dip facility and the Construction of the facility in line with the Drawings and Specifications.
5. **Construction of large stock handling facilities for cattle** - Supply and Delivery of materials for large stock handling facility and the Construction of the facility in line with the Drawings and Specifications.
6. **Construction of small stock handling facilities for sheep** - Supply and Delivery of materials for small stock handling facility and the Construction of the facility in line with the Drawings and Specifications.
7. **STOCK WATER RETICULATION SYSTEM** - Supply and Delivery of materials for the equipping of water source (borehole, river or dams) and installing water reticulation system for stock water and the Construction of the facility in line with the Drawings and Specifications.
8. **Rehabilitation of earth dams for stock water** – The de-silting, repairing, and upgrading of existing small earth dams on agricultural land at various locations in the Eastern Cape Province.

The framework consists of a **Framework Agreement** between the Employer and each of the **Participants** listed in Annexure A. Each Framework Agreement incorporate these rules.

1.2 If, during the period

starting on	1 April 2026
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and ending on	31 March 2028

(the **Framework Period**), the Employer needs construction work as described in rule 1.1 above, the Employer may procure it by awarding **Works Contracts** according to the rules. The Employer may also procure the work in other ways, and does not guarantee that any work will be procure under these rules.

2. Participants

2.1 The Participants in the Framework are listed in alphabetical order in Annexure A.

2.2 A Participant whose Framework Agreement has been terminated will no longer be considered a Participant under these rules.

3. Call off Work Contracts by competition

3.1 When the Employer decides to procure work under these rules, the Employer will send a minimum of five Participant's selected on a random rotational basis a written invitation to tender. The invitation will be send by email to each Participant's current email address as given in or notified under its Framework Agreement. The invitation will include a Works Contract in the form of an infrastructure tender, based on the CIDB infrastructure tender document format, with the specifications, drawings, Bill of Quantities and details of the required Works. The invitation will fix the time limit for Participants to send in tenders taking account of such factors as the complexity of the subject-matter of the Works Contract and the time needed to send in tenders.

3.2 The award process for Works Contracts tendered under this rule 3 will be conducted in accordance with these rules and any procedures stated in the invitation to tender.

3.3 Participants wishing to be considered for a Works Contract must submit a tender complying with the invitation to tender. Tenders must propose resources (including key persons) that are consistent with the Participant's tender proposal for its Framework Agreement.

3.4 The award criteria for Works Contracts awarded under a procedure initiated under this Rule 3 will be as follows (with the range of weighting in brackets):

Total Cost – (80%)
Specific goals Points – (20%)
Total – (100%)

4. Performance Review, Termination and Promotion

4.1 The Contractor's performance will be monitored and evaluated on a continued basis during the implementation of Works Packages in line with the GCC 2015. At the completion of the Work Package a formal evaluation of the Contractor's performance will **be** done which will determine whether the Contractor will remain in the Framework Agreement Contract.

SCHEDULE 1 – GENERAL SPECIFICATION DOCUMENT

1.1 General

1.1.1 This specification is compiled for the purposes of establishing a Multi-Party Framework for the Construction of various categories of infrastructure as listed item 1.1 of the Framework Rules.

1.1.2 The technical requirements set out in this general specification are non-specific. All Materials and Workmanship procured through this Framework shall be in compliance with the technical standards as detailed and any further requirements as set out in the Mini-Competition Requests for Tenders.

1.2 Technical Standards

1.2.1 All construction work shall comply with the specific drawings and specifications as set out in the Department of AGRICULTURE “SPECIFICATION OF CONSTRUCTION MATERIALS AND METHODS TO BE USED” ECAGRICULTURE SCMM001. **Both the specifications and drawings are available on the ECAGRICULTURE website and can be obtained through the links below:**

1.2.5 In relation to any South African National Standard Specification that is referred to in the tender document it shall be taken as meaning the latest edition/year of that Standard Specification together with all amendments relating thereto.

1.2.6 Contractors will be fully liable for all products supplied and placed by them through the course of any Mini-Competition Contract.



1. Framework

- 1.1 The Contractor and other Participants named in the attached Framework Rules are part of a framework for the Contractor and those other Participants to do construction work for the Employer.
- 1.2 If, during the **Framework Period** defined in the attached Framework Rules, the Employer needs construction work as described in the Framework Rules, the Employer may procure the work awarding contracts (**Works Contracts**) according to the attached Framework Rules. The Employer may also procure the work in other ways, and does not guarantee that any work will be procured under this agreement.

2. Works Contracts

- 2.1 If the Contractor is selected for any work according to the attached Framework Rules, the Employer and Contractor agree to enter into a Works Contract in the terms established under this agreement.

2.2 Works Contracts will be on the terms of the CIDB Form of Contract as completed by the Employer and the Contractor according to the attached Framework Rules.

2.3 Works Contracts awarded within the Framework Period may be for work that continues after that period.

3. Communications

7.2 Termination of this agreement does not affect any Works Contract already entered.

7.3 The Contractor is not entitled to any payment because this agreement has been terminated.

8. Limitation of liability

Neither the Contractor nor the Employer have any liability to the other or in connection with this agreement for breach of contract, negligence, breach of duty or anything else. This does not affect their liability under the Works Contract.

9. This Agreement

9.1 Neither party may assign rights under this agreement.

9.2 This, and any Works Contracts, are the entire agreement between the Employer and the Contractor about its subject matter. Neither the Employer nor the Contractor has relied on any agreement, understanding, or statement that is not written or referred to in this agreement.

9.3 This agreement can only be changed in writing, signed by authorised representatives of the Employer and the Contractor.

9.4 This agreement is governed and to be construed according to the South African law.
