- 3 Quotations are to remain open for acceptance for a period of thirty (30) days effective from the date on which they are lodged and shall be accepted at any time within the said period of thirty (30) days.
- 4 Tenderers are requested to furnish the full registered name of the tendering company/supplier on the Form of Quotation and Form of Acceptance, Form B.
- 5 Tenderers are also required to sign each page of the Form of Quotation and Form of Acceptance, Form B, in the space provided at the bottom of each page.
- 6 **In the event of a mistake having been made on the price schedule it shall be crossed out in ink and be accompanied by an initial at each and every price alteration. Corrections in terms of price may not be made by means of a correction fluid such as Tipp- Ex or a similar product. DESCRIPTION: REQUEST FOR QUOTATION (RFQ) FROM SUITABLE QUALIFIED SERVICE PROVIDER(S) FOR COORDINATION OF PANEL DEBATE AND COALITION GOVERNANCE RESEARCH PAPER**SPECIFICATION****OBJECTIVE**

This Request for Quotation (RFQ) aims to appoint a suitable service provider to identify, coordinate and facilitate a panel discussion with key experts in order to develop the study on the viability of coalitions in the governance of the City of Johannesburg (CoJ).

INTRODUCTION AND BACKGROUND

The Group Strategy, Policy Coordination and Relations (GSPCR) Department is mandated to conduct research to inform the City's policymaking, strategy and planning processes. Research topics are informed by the institution's short, medium and long-term needs in order to steer the organisation in the right direction when it comes to decision making. One of the research projects to be undertaken in the 2023/24 financial year will be a study looking into the significance and potential challenges associated with coalition governments in the CoJ.

According to Susan Booysen, 'coalitions concern concrete cooperative actions, especially when political parties collaborate to jointly exercise government power' (Booysen, 2021, p. 3). Coalitions are therefore important in the establishment of a government to cooperatively exercise power. Booysen places emphasis on the narrative of cooperation because it ultimately defines the quality of the relationship between various political parties coming together. However, Jay Gopal Biswas states that 'complications and tensions within the coalition government create problems in governance and administration' (Biswas, 2019, p. 36).

In Johannesburg, the challenges in relation to coalition governing in many instances have been related to a lack of cooperation by the different political parties. This is often not a result of ideological differences as many of the manifestos of the different parties are similar. The coalition agreements break down due to failures to stick to terms agreed upon prior to assuming office. These agreements often have to do with representation in the constitution of the Mayor and Members of the Mayoral Committee and various other political and administrative positions.

The broad research questions are therefore:

- 1) investigate the effects of coalition governments on political stability, governance, and decision-making processes and;
- 2) Assess the effects of coalition governments on service delivery.

Supplementary research questions are provided in the discussion document developed by GSPCR. The panel discussion forms part of the research methods for the purpose of answering these pertinent questions.

SCOPE OF WORK AND CONTENT FOCUS

The appointed service provider should be a subject matter expert and able to coordinate, facilitate and produce a well-organised panel discussion in the form of a closed session. The panel discussion should be comprised of five (5) distinguished thought leaders meticulously selected for their vast experience and profound expertise in the field. The esteemed individuals should embody a diverse range of perspectives, to make the discussion robust, intellectually stimulating and unbiased in order to give informative insights into the topic at hand. The panellists are expected to be informed well in advance to avoid non-attendance.

In summation, the service provider will be expected to:

Host a “Closed Panel Discussion” with key experts.

The service provider should identify individuals within the South African landscape who can provide unique perspectives on the impact of coalition governments – it will be important to have a diversity of perspectives, as well as expertise in specific segments.

Have mechanisms in place for the relationships to ensure participation in the Panel Discussion.

The suggested format provides the following benefits for the Research Paper:

Ensures experts provide thoughts on specific questions rather than broad trends;

Enables nuanced views to be voiced and debated in real time;

Encourages participative engagement by having a select group of individuals rather than a large gathering

There is currently a significant amount of speculative literature and expert opinion on how coalition government will ultimately impact the general public. The service provider is expected to utilise this phase of work to also pose potential scenarios and ascertain the opinion of experts on these scenarios.

Develop a Research Paper:

The service provider should collate the above work and develop a consolidated draft position paper that will be utilised for the purposes of informing the findings on the assessment of coalition governments.

Through this panel discussion, the City of Johannesburg wants to better understand:

The current status quo of the coalition politics across Johannesburg

Anticipated future trajectory, including pertinent trends or spatial shifts;

Implications for the City of Johannesburg, including long-term strategic opportunities and challenges impacting local government

Recommendations for the City of Johannesburg.

PROJECT DELIVERABLES

The recommended service provider will be expected to execute the following deliverables.

Assemble a Diverse Panel:

Contract and compensate select experts, including academics and public intellectuals, representing diverse voices from various institutions.

Facilitate a closed-session panel discussion where these experts can engage in insightful conversations.

Facilitate Interviews and Questionnaires:

Act as a mediator in sharing the interview questionnaire with the experts prior to the panel discussion.

Collate Inputs:

Gather and compile inputs derived from both the panel discussion and the questionnaire/interviews conducted with the experts.

Ensure all insights and perspectives are accurately documented for further analysis.

Draft Research Paper:

Utilise the expert inputs gathered to enhance and enrich the existing discussion document.

Transform the updated content into a consolidated research paper input that reflects the valuable contributions and informed opinions of the experts involved.

The City of Johannesburg will be responsible for:

Provide a draft discussion document for the appointed service provider to consider

Overall management and oversight of the project

Content support i.e., provision of ad hoc relevant background material and strategic documents

Logistical support i.e., assist with i) identifying panellists for the session; ii) venue/ panel session arrangements; and iii) identifying session observers from within the City of Joburg

PROVEN COMPETENCIES OF A SERVICE PROVIDER

The service provider should demonstrate the following competencies and experience:

The lead consultant should have a tertiary qualification in the areas of Communications and Media studies/ Public Administration/ Economics/ Public Relations and Marketing/ Business Management/ Political Studies or considered related to the above at the discretion of the BEC.

The project team should include competencies such as local government knowledge, good report writing skills, presentation skills, networking skills, people interaction skills;

Track record of successfully brokering/negotiating collaborations and joint ventures in highly politicised discussions and debates;

Access to diverse experts within spaces such as NGOs, government, business partners and communities;

Programme/project management;

Experience in policy development and research analysis.

TIME FRAME

In accordance with the Municipal Cost Containment Regulations (2019) the successful bidder will be appointed on a time and cost basis with specific start and end dates;

The start date will be after the Purchase Order (PO) is raised by CoJ.

The anticipated duration of the project is three (3) months.

The final deadline for deliverables is 14 June 2024 and all deliverables must be received by the COJ by this date.

- (d) The CONTRACTOR agrees that any duly authorised officials of the EMPLOYER shall be entitled, although not obliged, to take such steps as may be necessary to ensure that the CONTRACTOR has complied with the undertakings as more fully set out in paragraphs (a) and (b) above, which steps may include, but shall not be limited to, the right to inspect any appropriate site or premises occupied by the CONTRACTOR, or to inspect any appropriate records held by the CONTRACTOR or to take such steps it may deem necessary to remedy the default of the CONTRACTOR at the cost of the CONTRACTOR.

- (e) The CONTRACTOR shall be obliged to report forthwith to the EMPLOYER any investigations, complaint or criminal charge which may arise as a consequence of the provisions of the ACT and Regulations, pursuant to work performed in terms of this agreement, and shall, on written demand, provide full details in writing of such an investigation, complaint or criminal charge as the case may be.

1. GENERAL CONDITIONS

- 1.1 The following preference point systems are applicable to invitations to tender:
 - the 80/20 system for requirements with a Rand value of up to R50 000 000 (all applicable taxes included); and
- 1.2 The applicable preference point system for this tender is the 80/20 preference point system.
- 1.3 Points for this tender (even in the case of a tender for income-generating contracts) shall be awarded for:
 - (a) Price; and
 - (b) Specific Goals.
- 1.4 The maximum points for this tender are allocated as follows:

- (b) “**price**” means an amount of money tendered for goods or services, and includes all applicable taxes less all unconditional discounts;
- (c) “**rand value**” means the total estimated value of a contract in Rand, calculated at the time of bid invitation, and includes all applicable taxes;
- (d) “**tender for income-generating contracts**” means a written offer in the form determined by an organ of state in response to an invitation for the origination of income-generating contracts through any method envisaged in legislation that will result in a legal agreement between the organ of state and a third party that produces revenue for the organ of state, and includes, but is not limited to, leasing and disposal of assets and concession contracts, excluding direct sales and disposal of assets through public auctions; and
- (e) “**the Act**” means the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act, 2000 (Act No. 5 of 2000).

7. POINTS AWARDED FOR SPECIFIC GOALS

- 7.1. In terms of Regulation 4(2); 5(2); 6(2) and 7(2) of the Preferential Procurement Regulations, preference points must be awarded for specific goals stated in the tender. For the purposes of this tender the tenderer will be allocated points based on the goals stated in table 1 below as may be supported by proof/ documentation stated in the conditions of this tender:
- 7.2. In cases where organs of state intend to use Regulation 3(2) of the Regulations, which states that, if it is unclear whether the 80/20 or 90/10 preference point system applies, an organ of state must, in the tender documents, stipulate in the case of—
