#### 3 PROPOSAL SUBMISSION

Transnet has implemented a new electronic tender submission system, the e-Tender Submission Portal, in line with the overall Transnet digitalization strategy where suppliers can view advertised tenders, register their information, log their intent to respond to bids and upload their bid proposals/responses on to the system.

  - Submit bid documents by uploading them into the system against each tender selected.

#### 4 RFP INSTRUCTIONS

- 4.1 Please sign documents [sign, stamp and date the bottom of each page] before uploading them on the system. The person or persons signing the submission must be legally authorised by the respondent to do so.
- 4.2 All returnable documents tabled in the Proposal Form [Section 5] must be returned with proposals.
- 4.3 Unless otherwise expressly stated, all Proposals furnished pursuant to this RFP shall be deemed to be offers. Any exceptions to this statement must be clearly and specifically indicated.
- 4.4 Any additional conditions must be embodied in an accompanying letter. Subject only to [Alterations made by the Respondent to Bid Prices] of the General Bid Conditions, (Legal Review) and Section 6 of the RFP, alterations, additions or deletions must not be made by the Respondent to the actual RFP documents.

#### 5 JOINT VENTURES OR CONSORTIUMS

Respondents who would wish to respond to this RFP as a Joint Venture [JV] or consortium with B-BBEE entities, must state their intention to do so in their RFP submission. Such Respondents must also submit a signed JV or consortium agreement between the parties clearly stating the percentage [%] split of business and the associated responsibilities of each party. If at the time of the bid submission such a JV or consortium agreement has not been concluded, the partners must submit confirmation in writing of their intention to enter into a JV or consortium agreement should they be awarded business by Transnet through this RFP process. This written confirmation must clearly indicate the percentage [%] split of business and the responsibilities of each party. In such cases, award of business will only take place once a signed copy of a JV or consortium agreement is submitted to Transnet.

Respondents are to note that for the purpose of Evaluation:

- a JV will be evaluated based on one consolidated B-BBEE score card as per the B-BBEE Preferential Procurement Regulations, 2017 preference point scoring.
- Experience, qualification or certification of Lead Bidder (JV Partner with higher % split of Business) must have the required Experience, qualification or certification, where the split of business is 50/50, Experience, qualification or certification of either member of the JV will be used for evaluation.

#### **6** COMMUNICATION

- 6.1 Specific queries relating to this RFP before the closing date of the RFP should be submitted to the contact person specified in Section 1 of this RFP before 12:00 pm on 01 October 2022. In the interest of fairness and transparency Transnet's response to such a query will then be made available to other bidders.
- 6.2 It is prohibited for Respondents to attempt, either directly or indirectly, to canvass any officer or employee of Transnet in respect of this RFP between the closing date and the date of the award of the business.

- 6.3 Respondents found to be in collusion with one another will be automatically disqualified and restricted from doing business with organs of state for a specified period.
- 6.4 Respondents may also, at any time after the closing date of the RFP, communicate with the contact person specified in Section 1 of this RFP on any matter relating to its RFP response
- 6.5 Respondents are to note that changes to its submission will not be considered after the closing date.

#### **7 CONFIDENTIALITY**

All information related to this RFP is to be treated with strict confidence. In this regard Respondents are required to certify that they have acquainted themselves with the Non-Disclosure Agreement. All information related to a subsequent contract, both during and after completion thereof, will be treated with strict confidence. Should the need however arise to divulge any information related to this RFP or the subsequent contract, written approval must be obtained from Transnet.

#### 8 COMPLIANCE

The successful Respondent [hereinafter referred to as the **Service provider**] shall be in full and complete compliance with any and all applicable laws and regulations.

#### 9 EMPLOYMENT EQUITY ACT

Respondents must comply with the requirements of the Employment Equity Act 55 of 1998 applicable to it including (but not limited to) Section 53 of the Employment Equity Act.

#### 10 DISCLAIMERS

Respondents are hereby advised that Transnet is not committed to any course of action as a result of its issuance of this RFP and/or its receipt of Proposals. In particular, please note that Transnet reserves the right to:

- 10.1 modify the RFP's Goods/Services and request Respondents to re-bid on any such changes;
- 10.2 reject any Proposal which does not conform to instructions and specifications which are detailed herein;
- 10.3 disqualify Proposals submitted after the stated submission deadline [closing date];
- 10.4 award a contract in connection with this Proposal at any time after the RFP's closing date;
- 10.5 award a contract for only a portion of the proposed Goods/Services which are reflected in the scope of this RFP;
- 10.6 split the award of the contract between more than one Supplier/Service provider, should it at Transnet's discretion be more advantageous in terms of, amongst others, cost or developmental considerations;
- 10.7 cancel the bid process;
- 10.8 validate any information submitted by Respondents in response to this bid. This would include, but is not limited to, requesting the Respondents to provide supporting evidence. By submitting a bid, Respondents hereby irrevocably grant the necessary consent to Transnet to do so;
- 10.9 request audited financial statements or other documentation for the purposes of a due diligence exercise;
- 10.10 not accept any changes or purported changes by the Respondent to the bid rates after the closing date and/or after the award of the business, unless the contract specifically provided for it;
- 10.11 to cancel the contract and/request that National Treasury place the Respondent on its Database of Restricted Suppliers for a period not exceeding 10 years, on the basis that a contract was awarded on the strength of incorrect information furnished by the Respondent or on any other basis recognised in law;

10.12 to award the business to the next ranked bidder, provided that he/she is still prepared to provide the required Goods/Services at the quoted price, should the preferred bidder fail to sign or commence with the contract within a reasonable period after being requested to do so. Under such circumstances, the validity of the bids of the next ranked bidder(s) will be deemed to remain valid, irrespective of whether the next ranked bidder(s) were issued with a Letter of Regret. Bidders may therefore be requested to advise whether they would still be prepared to provide the required Goods/Services at their quoted price, even after they have been issued with a Letter of Regret.

Note that Transnet will not reimburse any Respondent for any preparatory costs or other work performed in connection with its Proposal, whether or not the Respondent is awarded a contract.

#### 11 LEGAL REVIEW

A Proposal submitted by a Respondent will be subjected to review and acceptance or rejection of its proposed contractual terms and conditions by Transnet's Legal Counsel, prior to consideration for an award of business. A material deviation from the Standard terms or conditions could result in disqualification.

#### 12 SECURITY CLEARANCE

Acceptance of this bid could be subject to the condition that the Successful Respondent, its personnel providing the Goods/Services and its subcontractor(s) must obtain security clearance from the appropriate authorities to the level of **CONFIDENTIAL/ SECRET/TOP SECRET**. Obtaining the required clearance is the responsibility of the Successful Respondent. Acceptance of the bid is also subject to the condition that the Successful Respondent will implement all such security measures as the safe performance of the contract may require.

#### 13 NATIONAL TREASURY'S CENTRAL SUPPLIER DATABASE

Respondents are required to self-register on National Treasury's Central Supplier Database (CSD) which has been established to centrally administer supplier information for all organs of state and facilitate the verification of certain key supplier information. Respondents must register on the CSD prior to submitting their bids. Business may not be awarded to a Respondent who has failed to register on the CSD. Only foreign suppliers with no local registered entity need not register on the CSD.

For this purpose, the attached SBD 1 form must be completed and submitted as a mandatory returnable document by the closing date and time of the bid.

#### 14 TAX COMPLIANCE

Respondents must be compliant when submitting a proposal to Transnet and remain compliant for the entire contract term with all applicable tax legislation, including but not limited to the Income Tax Act, 1962 (Act No. 58 of 1962) and Value Added Tax Act, 1991 (Act No. 89 of 1991).

It is a condition of this bid that the tax matters of the successful Respondents be in order, or that satisfactory arrangements have been made with South African Revenue Service (SARS) to meet the Respondents tax obligations.

The Tax Compliance status requirements are also applicable to foreign Respondents/ individuals who wish to submit bids.

Where Consortia / Joint Ventures / Sub-contractors are involved, each party must be registered on the Central Supplier Database and their tax compliance status will be verified through the Central Supplier Database.

#### **SECTION 3: BACKGROUND, OVERVIEW AND SCOPE OF REQUIREMENTS**

#### 1 BACKGROUND

Transnet seeks to appoint a competent and qualified Service Provider to design, develop and deliver the accredited specific programmes to the Port & Terminal Operations and Marine Infrastructure for Transnet for a period of five (5) years.

Transnet identified a skills gap in their port and terminal operations and infrastructure environment.

The current training interventions are not effective in addressing the challenges that port and terminal operations and infrastructure are currently faced with, hence the need to develop accredited Port & Terminal Operations and Marine Infrastructure programmes from NQF 4 to 9 including CPD training programmes.

This intervention seeks to address operational and management level core competencies that are specific to port and terminal operations and infrastructure within Transnet, and matching international standards.

It is required that these programmes will be offered by a South African accredited Service Provider in partnership with international accredited Service providers or Higher Education Service Providers.

#### 2 DETAILED SCOPE OF WORK

#### 2.1. The service provider will be required to:

- Facilitate the roll out of this programme to Transnet employees and as requested by the clients
  of Transnet;
- Offer a formal SAQA qualifications recognised, either QCTO or CHE assurance;
- Offer accredited marine and infrastructure related programmes as required by the recognised quality/regulatory authorities within the maritime industry, like SAMSA, ECSA, SAICE or PIANC;
- Facilitate accredited seafarer training for all applicable ranks (e.g. Ratings, Cadets, Officers, Master, Captains, etc.) within the marine seagoing structures and workshop training, where required;
- Assist on strategic development of outreach programmes, where Transnet has an interest, like youth training and any programme that requires port and terminal operations expertise.
- Conduct a feasibility study and produce a report with recommendations.
- Design and develop learning material for the programmes, as well provide evidence of accreditation.
- The programme delivery should be blended learning approach including action learning project work or Capstone project.
- Include case studies / assignments / exams or workbased project as part of the learning material.
- Deliver excellent training based on the approved learning material developed for a period to be determined by the implementation plan.
- The training to be delivered at recognized and approved campuses and/or other available venues nationally.
- Formative, Practical and Summative assessments should form part of the training delivery.
- Provide Record keeping and feedback on training delivered.
- As part of the proposal the service provider should show examples of similar work done previously with references;

- Expertise and Knowledge of Port/Terminal environment and infrastructure and Port/Terminal facilities and Port/Terminal Management is required, with relevant proof.
- Have and be able to allocate capacity for delivering excellent services (Needs Analysis, Design and Delivery).
- Provide services in compliance with all Transnet company policies (national and international legislation).
- Provide clearly detailed project plan and relevant deliverables for this project.
- Provide scope of relevant services, modules and curriculum on offer.
- The Service Provider must clearly demonstrate a proven track record of not less than three (3) years in developing customized Operations and Technical Management Programmes in the Maritime Industry.
- The Service Provider should be willing to partner with other previously disadvantaged institutions Locally, and also partner with institutions Internationally, where provision of strategy on partnership will be referenced as proof.
- The service provider be willing to share best practices in respect of content and delivery.
- Provide three (3) relevant references where the same work was undertaken, as per item 15 above.
- The programme should be customized according to the business needs and requirements.
- The requirement is that all the qualifications have to be SAQA accredited and portable with other qualifications for credit bearing purposes.
- All programmes must include an immersion with a local company study seminar or tour, to ensure delegates exit with full knowledge of the full supply chain and with focus on Transnet.
- There should be an international study tour, as agreed in a specific programme, for the Masters
   Programme with an Action Learning Project/Capstone Project.
- Accredited international experts should be invited to present some modules either local or abroad, where
  the institution has agreements or contracts.
- Use of best e-Learning software and Learning Management System for online study support.
- Provide coaching and mentoring for earmarked operational programmes, as and when requested.

### 2.2. The Service Provider must ensure compliance and be familiar with the following for the Duration of the contract:

- (a) The successful service provider should be an accredited provider with a SAQA;
- (b) The Programme modules to be aligned to Transnet corporate branding;
- (c) The Programme training modules must include Assessment guides, Learner Workbooks and Facilitator Guides both manual and electronic formats;
- (d) The modules should be designed such that it could be classroom based as well as online Learning platforms, for self-study purposes;
- (e) Proven track record in research and instructional design;
- (f) Proven track record in the Programme training with large corporates in South Africa, international experience would be an added advantage;
- (g) Knowledge of global trends in Outcomes-Based Education and adult learning methodologies;
- (h) Knowledge of legislation: the National Qualifications Framework (NQF), the South African Qualifications Authority (SAQA) and the Skills Development Act, etc.;
- (i) Knowledge of Education, Training and Development Practitioners' (ETDP) environment and registered with the relevant Sector Education and Training Authority (SETA), Council for Higher Education and Quality Council for Trades and Occupations (QCTO);

- (j) Knowledge of both formative and summative assessment methods, using a range of methodologies;
- (k) Extensive experience in learning tools design and development, both manual and electronic learning systems;
- (I) Knowledge of relevant computer systems and appropriate software is desirable for proper learner management and assessment authenticity;
- (m) The ability to apply creativity and innovation when developing learning programmes;
- (n) Expertise and Knowledge of Port environment and Port facilities, Port Infrastructure and Port/Terminal Management will be an advantage;
- (o) Have and be able to allocate capacity for delivering excellent services (Needs Analysis, Design and Delivery);
- (p) Provide services in compliance with all company policies (national and international legislation);



- 4.3 A trust, consortium or joint venture (including unincorporated consortia and joint ventures) must submit a consolidated B-BBEE Status Level verification certificate for every separate bid.
- 4.4 Tertiary Institutions and Public Entities will be required to submit their B-BBEE status level certificates in terms of the specialized scorecard contained in the B-BBEE Codes of Good Practice.
