2. INTRODUCTION

The Free State Development Corporation (FDC) is a public entity established in terms of the FDC Act 6 of 1995. In terms of the Public Finance Management Act, it is classified as a schedule 3D entity.

The mandate of the FDC is to establish and develop sustainable SMMEs in the Free State Province by providing both financial and non-financial support services.

FDC Mission

To provide financial and business support services to SMME's and Cooperatives; to undertake the development and management of properties; and to facilitate and promote investments and exports in the Free State Province.

FDC Vision

To be the development and investment agency of choice in contributing to the economic growth of the Free State Province

3. OVERVIEW

The Free State Development Corporation (FDC) is the official agency responsible for driving economic development in the Free State. Our mandate covers various functions such as enterprise development, property portfolio management, investment promotion and facilitation as well as export promotion. we align ourselves to the National Development Plan Version 2030 calla= for faster economic growth, higher investment and greater labour absorption.

4. BACKGROUND

A plethora of legislative, strategic and policy instruments have propelled skills development to the centre of government's overarching economic development programme. The FDC - as a public entity - is enjoyed by the Medium - Term Strategic Framework to plan collectively with other organs of state and seek development. The FDC has established a fully functional Strategic Business Unit (SBU) to ensure that the objective of closing skills gap is realized.

The National Development Plan 2030 is the country's premier framework for our economic growth aspirations and devotes an entire chapter to education and skills development.

The Human Resources Strategy 2010 - 2030 has four strategic objectives, namely:

- Improving the foundations for human development;
- To improve the supply of high-quality skills which are more responsive to societal and economic needs;
- Increasing employer participation in lifelong learning;
- Supporting employment growth through industrial policies, innovation, research and development.

5. INVITATION TO BID

The FDC hereby invites bids from duly accredited and adequately experienced service providers for the delivery of Short Learning Programmes, Learnerships and Apprenticeships.

The Corporation may choose to appoint one service provider or several service providers for the delivery of the same learning programme at its sole discretion.

FDC seeks technical proposals from suitably qualified and experienced training providers who wish to be appointed as Service Providers for a range of learning programmes for various skills development projects. These projects will be implemented by the FDC across all districts and in various localities of the Free State Province, and in some initiatives – beyond the Free State borders.

The bidders must submit proposals in line with their accreditation in the following sectors and must clearly indicate the learning programmes accredited for:

1. GENERAL CONDITIONS

1.1 The following preference point systems are applicable to invitations to tender:

- the 80/20 system for requirements with a Rand value of up to R50 000 000 (all applicable taxes included); and
- the 90/10 system for requirements with a Rand value above R50 000 000 (all applicable taxes included).

1.2 To be completed by the organ of state

The applicable preference point system for this tender is the 80/20 preference point system.

1.3 Points for this tender (even in the case of a tender for income-generating contracts) shall be awarded for:

1.5 Failure on the part of a tenderer to submit proof or documentation required in terms of this tender to claim points for specific goals with the tender, will be interpreted to mean that preference points for specific goals are not claimed.

1.6 The organ of state reserves the right to require of a tenderer, either before a tender is adjudicated or at any time subsequently, to substantiate any claim in regard to preferences, in any manner required by the organ of state.

2. DEFINITIONS

- (a) **“tender”** means a written offer in the form determined by an organ of state in response to an invitation to provide goods or services through price quotations, competitive tendering process or any other method envisaged in legislation;
- (b) **“price”** means an amount of money tendered for goods or services, and includes all applicable taxes less all unconditional discounts;
- (c) **“rand value”** means the total estimated value of a contract in Rand, calculated at the time of bid invitation, and includes all applicable taxes;
- (d) **“tender for income-generating contracts”** means a written offer in the form determined by an organ of state in response to an invitation for the origination of income-generating contracts through any method envisaged in legislation that will result in a legal agreement between the organ of state and a third party that produces revenue for the organ of state, and includes, but is not limited to, leasing and disposal of assets and concession contracts, excluding direct sales and disposal of assets through public auctions; and

4. POINTS AWARDED FOR SPECIFIC GOALS

- 4.1. In terms of Regulation 4(2); 5(2); 6(2) and 7(2) of the Preferential Procurement Regulations, preference points must be awarded for specific goals stated in the tender. For the purposes of this tender the tenderer will be allocated points based on the goals stated in table 1 below as may be supported by proof/ documentation stated in the conditions of this tender:
- 4.2. In cases where organs of state intend to use Regulation 3(2) of the Regulations, which states that, if it is unclear whether the 80/20 or 90/10 preference point system applies, an organ of state must, in the tender documents, stipulate in the case of—
