1	With reference to the "Annexure C Pricing Schedule" document: VM Configuration Lines 11, 12 & 13 has blocks which are greyed out under the VM configuration section. Will you provide information on what the values are for these greyed-out blocks?	The intention of line 11,12 and 13 is to provide pricing at a single unit level, e.g., 1 vcore, 1 gig RAM etc. No further details will be provided.
2	With reference to the "Annexure C Pricing Schedule" document: Please confirm for VM configuration are we allowed to do like for like match with the specified resources, under VM configuration section, and the AWS instance types?	Yes, this will be allowed.
	VM Configuration - Operating System (OS) is not specified (e.g. Windows/Linux). Please confirm on the OS type per line item in this section.	Operating systems will be provided in the list of VM's to be migrated (Annexure D) on addendum to the RFP.
3	With reference to the "Annexure D List of VM's to be migrated" document: Reference is made to 90 workloads to be migrated however, the list provided only included 29 workloads. Please provide visibility of the remaining 71 workloads and its configuration.	Updated list of VM's will be provided as an addendum to the RFP.
4	Please provide more detail about each workload: Workload type (e.g. application/database etc.)	Updated list of VM's will be provided as an addendum to the RFP.
5	Please provide number of staff to be trained as users, super users and as system administrators	50 people, all to be trained as users on the system.
6	a)What type of training support is needed. Is it for technical training or maybe just some knowledge share of limited training to a few system administrators? b)What is meant with the support? Should the Service Provider (SP) train their staff to support? c)Please provide a breakdown of the staff location/number of staff to be trained in the different regions. d)Will the training for the 50 staff need to be done onsite or can this be delivered as online training?	a) Training support is for technical purposes. b) Technical support should Transnet staff need assistance with the creation of services on the CSP's cloud platform. c) Training can be provided from a centralised location – Johannesburg. d) Yes, online training is also an acceptable manner to deliver technical training.
7	What is the current public cloud that Transnet is using? What is the reason for trying to migrate from this public cloud to another one.	Transnet is using Azure as a service. Transnet as a stated owned entity are required to go out on open tender when contract periods are about to expire for services that Transnet is using.
8	There are 29 VMs hosting 90 workloads and all are mentioned as production workloads. Are they all in-house developed applications or package applications. SAP is one package application what about Non-SAP applications whether they are inhouse developed or package application. What about non-production environments. Are they also on Cloud but not in the current scope of migration right now or they are on-premise?	Transnet is using Cloud at the moment and if we transition to another service provider then we need to re-host or re-platform the services that are currently in use. The migration section deals specifically with the re-platform of the services that are there. Transnet will then continue consuming and grow the platform. These are all infrastructure as a service. So this is virtual computing and all our local applications that we have to re-platform on the new portal. Going forward, the services will grow. So there is re-platforming (what Transnet is calling migration) and then an operational aspect and in the operational aspect, Transnet will grow this footprint. Bidders must note that we are currently using Cloud so when Transnet have a list of machines, we need to look at how do we re-platform or re-host these machines but over the next three years, Transnet will continue to move applications onto the Cloud platform. The 90 machines are not the machines that we will use for the next three years. The list of 90 workloads is just the re-platforming of Transnet's current environment and beyond that we need to deal with migrations to Cloud.

11	The CSP referred to in the RFP - is this a CSP Agreement	This is an agreement for the provision of public cloud services.
12	The Current ROE is R17.27, the ROE will change on Monthly billing based on usage, will Transnet consider a ROE Fluctuation scenario to accommodate partners with this risk, be including a variance clause to the agreement based on a static Dollar cost, and a sliding scale on the ROE	Bidders are required to keep their prices quoted firm and fixed in US dollar terms for the contract duration. The future prevailing exchange rate will be applied at the time of invoicing, where applicable. The RFP has been updated in this regard.
13	In terms of reference letters, please can you confirm that we can submit a combination of partner and CSP (Hyperscaler) customer reference	The criteria focus specifically on reference letters from CSP's and not letters from both CSP's and Partners.
14	Regarding the migration of current workloads from Azure, please confirm if the pricing provided can be indicative pending an assessment?	The pricing provided for the migration of workloads must be based on the list provided outlining the number of current workloads and its configuration (Annexure D). A technical assessment will be undertaken with the successful service provider before any transition to CSP cloud platform can commence
15	Will all cloud resource pricing be based on production workloads?	Yes, all workloads in this tender are regarded as production workloads
16	Will we need to provide project management for the migration phase?	No, Transnet will provide a project manager and a technical team to assist with the migration.
17	With regards to the breakdown of the different workloads to be migrated which has been provided, can you indicate the quantities per workload?	Quantities will be provided as part of an addendum to the RFP.
18	Please confirm that no workloads from on-premise will need to be migrated at this point in time and falls out of the scope of this RFP?	Migration of on-premise workloads will form part of the execution of work as per the scope of work of the RFP, however, does not form part of the once-off migration of the 90 workloads.
19	Does the 'CSP'(Cloud service Provider) refer to Public Cloud OEM or Respondent or both in this tender?	The tender focuses specifically on service providers that can provide public cloud computing services. The CSP is regarded as the respondent with the capabilities in place to provide a public cloud computing platform.
20	Please clarify line 11 and 12 of price schedule, cloud providers do not quote based on vCPU only or memory only, and some hyperscalers do not support either, only both. This is because a VM size in the cloud is based on vCPU, RAM and Disk combined.	The focus of line 11,12 and 13 is to look at unit costs for comparative purposes. The remaining part of the pricing sheet focuses on the combinations of VM, RAM and storage.
21	Regarding the 28GB memory requirement description of price schedule, line 20. If this specific VM size is not available, can we provide pricing on the closet equivalent size and indicate the VM size priced in the comments section?	Yes, bidders can provide pricing on the closest equivalent size and indicate the VM size price in the comments section.
22	Regarding the 437.5GB memory requirement description of price schedule, line 25. If this specific VM size is not available, can we provide pricing on the closet equivalent size and indicate the VM size priced in the comments section?	Yes, bidders can provide pricing on the closest equivalent size and indicate the VM size price in the comments section.
23	What is the monthly and annual Azure consumption cost of the current workloads if you are able to disclose (This will ensure cost optimization consideration as part of the assessment & migration).	Transnet will not be able to disclose current costs due to service provider confidentiality agreements in place.
24	The pricing schedule tab "Tech support Training Migration", refers to 2000 hours for technical support for cloud configurations, we understand that Transnet IT works standard business hours, so support should align to that type of SLA?	Transnet operations run 24/7/365 so there will be instances where calls are placed outside of business hours. Most of the technical support will be required during business hours.
25	Palo Alto Firewalls is on-prem currently as we understand, which firewall services are used in Azure, or is Palo Alto covering the entire Hybrid Cloud environment?	Palo Alto covers both on premise and cloud.
26	Which Azure Region/s is the current 90 workloads currently deployed at?	Combination of South Africa and Europe.
27	Does Transnet currently use Azure AD, or AD on prem, and is SSO currently a requirement?	AD has been deployed across on prem and cloud and yes SSO is a requirement

28	We assume Transnet IT and System team will handle the Application Integration and this is not in scope for this RFP?	Correct.
29	Transnet uses VPN connection from on-prem to Cloud, has an express route/direct connect been considered and why was this not implemented for Azure?	This is part of a future requirement.
30	Does VPN fulfill the bandwidth requirement for data transfer between on premise and Cloud?	VPN connectivity is a separate and VPN fulfils its requirement. So connectivity is not included in this transaction.
31	Commercial – The RFP refers to a SLA requirements penalty clause which is applied quarterly as a discount at 1.5%, how can this be handled as the RFP does not specify SLA's, Response Times, Incident Priority, uptime required (e.g. 99,99%, etc), RTO & RPO. What is the SLA penalty clause being referred to (refer to 5.6, page 25)?	An SLA will be discussed with the awarded bidder as part of the contract. The service levels as per paragraph 5, page 25 are expected to be part of the SLA. Paragraph 5, F, is a statement that Transnet will not incur any penalties should Transnet cancel the contract due to the service providers non-compliance with the service levels as per paragraph 5, a-e.
32	Regarding the tender requirements which indicate that the pricing would need to be kept firm and fixed. Please can you confirm that this is in reference to the US dollar price that the cloud providers charge for consumption and not the rand value. The rand value would be affected by rate of exchange at the time of billing.	Correct. The pricing is required to be fixed and firm in terms of US dollars. The rand value would be affected by the rate of exchange at the time of invoicing. The RFP notes to pricing and Annexure C have been updated to clarify this.
33	In terms of the reference letters and in the case of a reference letter that is not signed by the customer, can we provide a contactable person at the customers organization to validate the work done? Will this be acceptable?	Signed reference letters are required as per the technical criteria provided.
34	Page 13 of the RFP doesn't provide more details around IaaS. What services are available now in Transnet? Which service need to migrate to the cloud?	Virtual computing services are the core requirement in this RFP as is described in the technical requirements and the supporting pricing schedule. This includes services for IaaS and PaaS workloads.
35	Page 13 of the RFP doesn't provide more detail around PaaS. What specific PaaS services are to be provided? Such as CCE, database, IOT, etc	Same as above.
36	Page 14 of the RFP doesn't clarify "Integration between On Premise & Cloud. Does it specifically refer to cloud management platform? Unified management of on-premise and public cloud resources? What are the specific systems offline? Such as vmware, private cloud, pure hardware etc.?"	Bullet 3.1 of Annexure B describes the technical requirements for integration between on-premise and cloud.
37	Page 16 of the RFP "Workload Migration" doesn't provide more details. Which applications will be migrated? What is the corresponding database?	Annexure A of technical requirements provides further details on migration. Annexure D provides a list of VM's to be migrated.
38	Page 22 of the RFP doesn't clarify or provide more details. What are the quotation evaluation criteria?	Refer to Annexure C for the pricing schedule (as stated in Section 4, page 22 of the RFP.
39	The operating system of each virtual machine is it Windows or Linux?	Yes, combination of Windows and Linux machines
40	Some items pricing (the requirement is based on hourly) is lower than two decimal places. Is it possible for the hourly quotation to be made with 8 decimal places?	Yes, the pricing schedule has been updated to allow for 10 decimal points. Transnet will round off to 2 decimal points on final pricing scores for price evaluation.
41	Due to the December brake and/or year-end shutdown for most companies, there was some valuable time that was lost which has adversely impacted the number of days available to respond thoroughly to this bid, and so we would like to hereby request for a two-week extension from the current tender deadline, to 13/02/2023; so that we may have a little more time to prepare a more solid bid proposal and response.	The RFP closing date and time has been extended to 13 February 2023 at 17h00 as per Addendum published on the NT e-portal and Transnet website.  <b>Further extended date: 24 February 2023 at 17h00.</b>
42	As a follow-on question from the briefing session regarding the fixed Dollar/USD rate of exchange (ROE = R17.27 per USD 1) used in the pricing for this tender: - Please remember to respond to bidders with your formal clarification around this very important and contentious point raised in the briefing, as past experiences for many have resulted in too great a risk for higher priced bids that contain an element of transactions where foreign goods and/or service acquisitions like for the international cloud hosting, Microsoft active directory services, etc. are all priced in USD; and therefore subject to extremely volatile exchange rate fluctuations.	The quoted prices are required to be fixed and firm in terms of US dollars. The future prevailing rate of exchange to be applied at the time of invoicing (where applicable). The RFP notes to pricing and Annexure C guidance notes have been updated to clarify this and will be published as an addendum to the RFP on the NT e-portal and Transnet website.

45	Do we price cloud IaaS as per VM list in Annexure D?	Yes, per line item of the pricing schedule
46	Can you please explain the meaning of "bring your own license is enabled" in Annexure D?	Transnet will bring its own licenses to the cloud environment.
47	Can you please confirm if the migration scope include applications and databases? Only VMs with their OS will be migrated by CSP?	Transnet IT will be responsible for the spinning up of its applications including databases on the CSP's platform.
48	What technology are deployed on each VM?	An updated list of VM's will be provided to service providers.
49	Do you have the detail on the Ingress and Egress volumes of data and must that be part of the price	Pricing schedule focuses on costs per gigabyte Ingress and Egress.
50	What VM technology is being used	Updated list of VM's will be provided.
51	Would Transnet accept international references	Yes.
52	From tender briefing we understand that PaaS services are not part of current RFP scope, though CSP should support PaaS services. Please confirm our understanding	PaaS services are part of RFP scope as per the technical requirements. No PaaS workloads in the current list of VM's to be migrated.
53	From tender briefing we understand that currently VPN is being used to connect on-premise and public cloud environments and Express Route/Interconnect/Direct Connect like dedicated connection is not required as part of this RFP scope. Please confirm	No.
54	It requires to fill two columns: column E "RSA hrly Rate [ZAR] Inclusive of VAT" and column "Int hrly rate [ZAR] Inclusive of VAT". What if any CSP is not having Data Center (public cloud Region) in SA so there will not be values available for "RSA hrly Rate [ZAR] Inclusive of VAT". Please suggest what value we should put in column E in such cases.	Please see comments in pricing schedule (Where there is no difference between RSA hrly rates and International rates then both rate columns must be completed with the applicable rate). 61	From tender briefing we understand that Azure is the current public cloud hosting all these workloads. What is the current Azure Region hosting all these workloads?	South Africa and Western Europe.
62	Please provide details about all the databases (DB) being used as part of 90 workloads. Information like DB type, version, OS, data size, etc. will help	Updated list of VM's will be provided. Transnet will take responsibility for databases configurations for the 90 VM's.
63	From tender briefing we also understand that all DBs are IaaS based hosted on VMs, and there is no DB from Azure PaaS based managed DB. Please confirm if our understanding is correct.	Correct.
64	Can we also get the ticket dumps related to these 90 workloads just to understand the overall stability factors of workloads?	Not required to price the services and will not be provided at this time.
65	From tender briefing we understand that these workloads are not having Disaster Recovery (DR) configured, please confirm.	No.
66	Please your backup and recovery strategy for these workloads including app and databases.	Every workload has its own back-up and recovery requirements and is not a requirement to price for the migration services.
67	Pricing: Please clarify if Transnet will accommodate annual CPI increases for technical support for cloud configuration and technical training?	No provision made for CPI increases for technical support. This will be managed on a time and material basis (as and when basis)
68	Pricing Point 14 Annexure C Pricing schedule: with respect to public cloud services, can Transnet give an indication as to how the OEM increases of which we have no control be dealt with?	Responsibility of the service provider. Transnet may not have a relationship with the OEM in question and cannot advise in this regard.
69	Pricing Point 14 in Annexure C- Pricing Schedule: with respect to public cloud services, can Transnet give an indication as to how the monthly invoice ROE fluctuation should be dealt with?	The currency rate of exchange as per the RFP must be applied for the purposes of tendering. The future prevailing exchange rate at the time of invoicing may be applied.
70	Please clarify the Transnet expectations as to "Fixed Pricing", with particular reference to the Exchange Rate discussion during the Briefing Session. Quoting on a fixed, Transnet stipulated, exchange USD:ZAR exchange rate will not be a problem.	The quoted price is required to be firm and fixed in terms of US dollars. 79	The bidders proposed pricing needs to be valid for 180 days. How will significant changes in exchange rates during that time be accommodated?	Changes in exchange rates will only be accommodated at the time of billing with the awarded bidder. The prices quoted by bidders are required to be kept at currency rate at the date of advertising of the tender, as stipulated in the RFP, for the validity period.
80	How was the ROE of 17.27 established?	As per the RFP, Section 4, Page 22, paragraph L, the currency's rate is as published by the South African Reserve Bank on the date of the advertisement of the bid.
81	Can you confirm the current disk size and disk type per server instance of all 90 workloads	List of VMs to be updated with disk size and disk type as part of the addendum to the RFP.
82	When will the Demonstration be done. Not sure whether the demonstration must be done before the submission or during and how?	Respondents that have met or exceeded the minimum threshold for Step Three: Technical Criteria – Desktop be required to present a live demonstration of their Cloud Computing Platform. Respondents do not need to provide any documents for Step Four: Technical Demonstration, when they submit the RFP by the closing date. Transnet will advise the Bidder if they have proceeded to Step Four: Technical Demonstration and will give the Bidder sufficient notice for the demonstration ( <i>Please refer to Evaluation Methodology, page 19 of the RFP document.</i> )
83	Is Transnet currently on an Enterprise agreement or MCA agreement?	Transnet currently has an Enterprise agreement related to licenses and then a separate Cloud agreement.

84	In terms of support hours versus platform service. Who will manage the Infrastructure platform itself this specifically talks to patch management, monitoring, alerting or security around landing zones?	Transnet will be managing the application. Service provider to provide the infrastructure services. The management if the infrastructure is the responsibility for the service provider.
85	The current Azure contract Transnet has with Microsoft, is it on an EA or is it CSP related?	The agreement is a CSP subscription.
86	Are the current firewalls that Transnet has deployed licensed and does Transnet need any new Palo Alto firewalls inside the Cloud instance?	Yes they are licensed. Licensing will not be part of this agreement so bidders do not need to cater for that. Service providers will have to demonstrate that they can use Transnet licenses and deploy them across their platforms.
87	Are the VMs that are currently running in the Cloud, are they not already federated to Transnets AD?	They are and service providers will have to prove that they can do that as well.
88	Transnet is not looking at PaaS at this point? Just looking at a like for like, whatever is in Cloud, Transnet wants to move to another Cloud or just make whatever hyperscaler proposed can handle the workloads	The list of workloads to be migrated are all IaaS workloads. There are no PaaS workloads on the list. In the tender Transnet asks for PaaS capabilities as well. PaaS is a future requirement.
89	Where did 3 month timeline come from?	The 3 months is just an estimate. It could be done sooner. There is post contract, assessment and training that needs to take place. Transnets footprint is not a sizable workload. There are a few production workloads but its not sizeable.
90	List of VMs already in Azure?	Yes, the the list of VMs is the current Azure environment at the moment.
91	Are service providers responsible for migrating and providing the infrastructure as a service and Transnet will do the migration of those VMs the service provider created or are the service providers also responsible for migrating the entire workload to the newly created workloads?	SP will be responsible for providing the infrastructure and Transnet will platform its applications on the infrastructure. Transnets technical people will spin up the application once the SP has provisioned the infrastructure.
92	Are SPs expected to spin up something similar to what Transnet has today and Transnet will be doing a backup and restore and a copy on that side or is Transnet expecting a three month migration which migrates from A to B?	Transnet will require SP to provide the machine specifications and provide the machines taking the SAP environment into account. Then the Transnet SAP team will provision the environment on SP platform. So Transnet will work with SP. Transnet does not know SP platform so in the 3 months the SP will need to guide Transnet but Transnet will put applications on SP platform. Hand in hand with that is the training aspect where Transnet engineers get trained. Post the 3 months, Transnet expects to create our own VMs and be self sufficient. Transnet needs a platform where we can dynamically switch on and switch off infrastructure. The 3 months is a hand-holding period. On support and maintenance, only where Transnet is constraint will Transnet call on the hours for these.
93	Are security considerations included in the RFP?	Transnet has its own security protocol and systems. It follows the same model as bring your own licence so Transnet will bring security tools and security elements we have to the platform. In this RFP those component are not included and don't form part of this RFP.

On the migration, SP's are required to just quote on the provisioning of the infrastructure. Operationalising it will require Transnet to work closely with the SP to deal with tagging, policies and procedures etc.
109	the VM list now includes Dev, however, the pricing is only required for Prod. Do you also require that we provide pricing for the Dev VM's?	The list of VM's provided is only for migration purposes and does not impact the VM configurations provided for pricing which is for Production.
110	We have reviewed the addendums that were added and we need further detail on the what version details of the operating systems on both Linux and windows are? E.g with Linux (is it Suse, OpenSUSE, Debian, Ubuntu, CentOS, Arch, Fedora, RHEL?).	Transnet has provided information on what the applicable operating systems are which is sufficient for the migration activities. Transnet has also stated that it will use its own licences to provision these platforms.
