#### 1. INTRODUCTION

- 1.1 Trade & Investment KwaZulu-Natal (TIKZN) is a South African trade and inward investment promotion agency, established as a Schedule 3C public entity, to promote the province of KwaZulu-Natal as an investment destination and to facilitate trade by assisting local companies to access international markets. The purpose of the training is to equip the management committee with skills, competencies, tools and mindset necessary to lead with impact and influence.
- 1.2 Trade & Investment KwaZulu-Natal is governed by the KwaZulu-Natal Trade and Investment Agency Act, 2010 (Act No. 05 of 2010). In terms of chapter 2 section 4 (1) of the KwaZulu-Natal Trade and Investment Act, the main functions of the entity are to:
- 1.2.1 Identify, develop, market and promote investment opportunities in the province to international and domestic investors.
  - 1.2.2 Develop the export capacity of the province.
  - 1.2.3 Develop the export market of the province.
  - 1.2.4 Foster trade and investment within the province.
  - 1.2.5 Develop a provincial investment and export plan for the development, promotion and marketing of inward investments and exports from the province.
  - 1.2.6 Keep and maintain a database of investment opportunities within the province in such a manner as to benefit all sectors of the economy.

#### 2. BACKGROUND

TIKZN have staff compliment of between 60 - 70 employees. The provision of a comprehensive employee wellness management services is one of the key deliverables of the Human Resources Management Unit.

Prioritising Employee Wellness programmes demonstrate TIKZN commitment that employee's health, work-life balance, and other key safety aspect of life are important and as caring employer of choice TIKZN is willing to look after them. As part of employee value proposition, the employee wellness programmes aim to attract and retain good employees, reduce turnover and improve productivity, the potential to lower health care costs, decrease absenteeism and raise employee morale.

The employee wellness programme is part of a company benefits, it provides employees with social support, privacy, and strategies to adopt and maintain a healthy life.

#### 3. PURPOSE

The purpose of this Request for Quotation (RFQ) is to invite suitably qualified, legally registered and experienced service providers to submit quotations for the provision of comprehensive employee wellness services to Trade and Investment KwaZulu Natal staff for a period of 3 years.

The comprehensive Employee Wellness Services will provide full spectrum of EWP, which will include but not limited to Physical Wellness, Financial and Socio- Economic Wellness, Physio-Social Wellness, individual/group counselling, injury on duty/disease management programme, pre- and post-employment medical assessments and provide an Occupational Health Doctor services.

#### 4. SCOPE OF WORK
