APPOINTMENT OF A SERVICE PROVIDER (INDUSTRIAL PSYCHOLOGIST) TO CONDUCT VIENNA / DOVER TESTS ON AS AND WHEN REQUIRED BASIS

The services of an Industrial Psychologist is required to conduct Vienna/Dover Tests for the recruitment process of Mechanised harvesting driver operator trainees as part of SAFCOL's mechanised harvesting expansion project as and when required.

1. Background Information

Our forestry company is currently in need of recruiting mechanised harvesting driver operator trainees. To ensure that we select the best candidates to undergo further training, we have decided to conduct Vienna/Dover tests to test potential candidates` aptitude to operate in a mechanised harvesting environment.

We require a service provider who is a registered Industrial Psychologist in South Africa who can assist us in administering the Vienna/Dover aptitude tests and providing us with the necessary analysis and recommendations of potential trainees to be trained further.

The driver operators will be required to work in the following conditions:

- Multi shift operation
- In remote areas working at night
- High production environment
- Highly repetitive working environment

Below are the physical attributes required for mechanised harvesting driver operators. Whats very critical will be the following requirements:

- Vision
- Depth perception
- Eye hand coordination

The dover test should include the following criteria tests:

1. DETERMINATION TEST

Measures basic ear-eye-hand-foot coordination, functioning in stressful situations and recovery from stress. These are very generic abilities found in almost all jobs. (Three sub tests)

2. SIGNAL DETECTION

A test of the candidate's ability to perceive small changes in the environment, concentration in unstimulating environments, visual glare recovery, and to identify specific problems in different visual fields.

3. ZBA

The ZBA measures the candidate's ability to estimate the speed, distance and direction of a moving object in space. His accuracy of estimation is presented in terms of his anticipation of time, as well as of direction.

4. TWO-HAND CO-ORDINATION

In addition to the co-ordination abilities measured by this test, a trainability curve is also obtained which relates directly to success and time of training, as well as subsequent on the job success.

5. COGNITRONE

Continuous low-level concentration skills, and speed and accuracy in performing figure analysis are measured using the Cognitrone test. The highly visual nature of the test evaluates non-verbal decision-making and correct reactions.
