Evaluation Process

The evaluation will be conducted in terms of the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act ("PPPFA"). The 90/10 scoring system will apply to this evaluation. The evaluation process and criteria will be as follows:

Price points will be calculated out of 90 for price. A maximum of 10 points will be allocated for the highest B-BBEE level contribution.

The prices and preference points will be added together to, and suppliers will be ranked accordingly with the highest scoring supplier ranked number one down to the lowest ranking tenderer.

Ps = Points scored for comparative price of bid or offer under consideration.

Pt = Comparative price of bid or offer under consideration.

Pmin = Comparative price of lowest acceptable bid or offer.

a) Step 1 - Basic Compliance

The tenderer must submit the tender as a complete original tender, plus one (1) hard copy of the original tender at tender submission deadline.

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Where a Tenderer does not submit 1 hard copy of the original tender at tender submission deadline, the tenderer will be disqualified and will not be evaluated further if they do not meet the requirements of basic compliance.

b) Step 2 - Mandatory Requirements

Tenderers shall submit all the required information or documents to be eligible for threshold evaluation. Only tenderers that are successful through mandatory requirements will proceed to the next phase.

The tenderer must submit the returnables set out hereunder as part of its tender. Returnables that are mandatory for evaluation will result in disqualification if not submitted at tender closing.

c) Step 3 - Functionality: Technical

Functionality will be evaluated on a total weight of 100% with a minimum threshold of 75%. A minimum overall threshold will have to be met before proceeding to the next stage of evaluation, and failure to achieve the minimum threshold will result in disqualification and the supplier will not be evaluated further. Only desktop evaluation of the supplier's submission will be done, and factory assessment will not be performed for the caustic soda tender.

The minimum threshold for the technical evaluation is 75%. Tenderers who do not meet the threshold will be found technically unacceptable and will not be evaluated further.

SCOPE OF WORK

The scope of work is supply, delivery and off-loading of Caustic Soda on an "as and when" required basis to various Eskom stations for a period of 5 years.

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The Suppliers shall provide caustic soda with the following technical specification:

The invitation specifies the actions necessary by the Chemical Services / Chemistry personnel to ensure that the bulk water treatment chemicals delivered to Eskom sites comply with the applicable specification. It also outlines the actions to be taken should these chemicals not conform to the specifications.

- a) The Supplier shall inspect each off-loading facility prior to the first delivery of the chemical in order to confirm tanker access to the off-loading facility and to confirm compatibility with power station connections, including, but not limited to, chemical off-loading and air supply couplings and flange sizes.
- b) Eskom shall inform the Supplier of any modification to the off-loading facility. Where necessary, the Supplier shall inspect the off-loading facility to assess the impact of the modification and to ensure compatibility.
- c) The Supplier shall not use a calf for the delivery of the chemical. Every tanker shall be in possession of the following documentation:
 - Material Safety Data Sheet
 - Product Specification
- d) The Supplier shall arrange for safety induction of all individuals delivering chemicals to power stations.
- e) The Supplier shall ensure that bulk chemical deliveries are made by personnel trained in safety precautions specific for handling the delivered chemical, and that delivery personnel abide by Supplier and the Eskom safety procedures, including the use of required personnel protective equipment.
- f) Deliveries shall only be accepted during the following working hours during the week, namely between 08:00 to 15:00, except for Fridays where deliveries shall only be accepted up to 10:00. During emergencies, after hour deliveries can be accommodated with prior arrangement with the power station.
- g) Eskom shall inform the Supplier in cases where a split delivery is planned. The anticipated off-loading time for a single point of delivery is 3 hours. Eskom shall record the time that documents are delivered to the Water Treatment Plant Control Room.

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- h) The Supplier shall report to the Water Treatment Plant Control Room on arrival, with all documentation required.
- i) The following documentation shall be shown to the Eskom personnel in the Water Treatment Plant Control Room upon arrival at the power station:

Competency declaration for the person responsible for off-loading and sampling of bulk chemical being delivered.

Tanker Inspection Form, confirming:

- Vehicle road worthiness.
- Functionality of air/pump off-loading system.
- > Condition of flexible pipes and connections (cleanliness and wear).
- Date of off-loading pipe pressure test.
- Tanker content cleanliness.
- j) The following documentation shall be submitted to the Eskom personnel in the Water Treatment Plant Control Room upon arrival at the power station:
 - > Weigh bridge certificate.
 - ➤ Certificate of Analysis showing that the chemical in the tanker meets the specification.
 - ➤ Delivery note, which must include the Eskom order number, the name of the power station and the power station address.
- k) The Supplier shall be accompanied to the off-loading facility by the Eskom personnel.
- I) The Supplier shall take a sample from the tanker for analysis by the Eskom personnel.
- m) Connection to the off-loading facility shall only commence after the Eskom personnel has confirmed the quality of the chemical and has given permission for off-loading to proceed.
- A tanker shall be rejected in the event of product quality non-conformance or safety nonconformance. The Contract Manager shall be informed immediately, and no payment shall be made.
- o) The Supplier shall be responsible for connecting the tanker to the off-loading facility.
- p) Where an intermediate transfer pump is required, the tanker shall be fitted with stainless steel pump.
- q) Standing time shall only be claimed if the delay is caused by Eskom. Standing time shall not be claimed where external conditions affect off-loading, such as rain, hail, lighting, etc.
- r) In the event that a tanker is not off-loaded due to an incorrect level indicator, a) the tanker shall be sent back and payment shall be made for transport and product, or b) the tanker shall be redirect to another power station upon arrangement with the power station and upon correcting the delivery note, and Eskom shall pay the additional transport charge.

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- s) The Supplier shall immediately inform the Contract Manager of any transportation and offloading incident. The Supplier shall issue an incident investigation report to the Contract Manager and to all power stations within seven days of the incident.
- t) The following documentation shall be submitted to the power station after delivery:
 - > Return weigh bridge certificate, within two working days, before payment is processed.
 - Original invoice within seven days of delivery.
- u) The Supplier shall perform an inspection of an off-loading event in the presence of power station staff at each site at least once a year and shall issue a report to the Contract Manager.
- v) The Supplier shall provide contingency plans providing assurance of continuity of supply of the product to the power station in the situations where experience unplanned outages, interruptions in production and strikes.
- w) The Supplier shall provide evidence of the Logistics Management / Quality Management System of the Transporter, providing assurance of on-time delivery of the product of the required quality.
- x) The Supplier shall notify the Contract Manager in writing of any request to change the Transporter or Supplier of the product. This shall be assessed after a technical evaluation.

d) Step 4: Price and Preference

Price points will be calculated out of 90/10 for price. A maximum of 10 points on the 90/10 will be allocated to the B-BBEE level contribution. The prices and preference points will be added together to determine the highest scoring tenderer using reverse E-auction.

- Price points and preference points will be added; and
- The tenderers with highest points (Price Points + Preference Points) will be awarded the contracts.
- Tenderers who do not meet the price and preference requirements will be disqualified and will not be evaluated further.
- Note: Negotiation of price and PPPFA ranking will be conducted through Reverse E-Auction process. E-Auction will be conducted after the suppliers have met all contractual requirement set out in this strategy.

e) Step 5: Contractual requirements

Contractual requirements are not evaluation criteria and must be met after the evaluation and ranking of the tenders. In the case that a supplier does not meet the requirement, e.g. Financial viability, mitigating factors may be decide on and made contractual requirements.

If the tenderer does not meet or agree with the mitigating factors or the contract requirements, a tender may be awarded to a supplier who did not score the highest number of points on the 90/10 preference points system.

Failure to submit the outstanding documents within the stipulated time; may result in the tenderer being regarded as non-responsive and ineligible for contract award.

In the event that there are further documents that are required during execution of the contract, these must be made contractual conditions and compliance thereto must be managed in terms of the contract. The SHEQ tender requirements will be communicated in the invitation to tender document and the SHEQ supporting documents will be published in the market. The successful supplier/contractor will be allowed to commence with work once the SHE file is approved by the respective Generation sites.

Eskom reserves the right to negotiate with the tenderer on Eskom's requirements. The outcome of the negotiations will be a contractual obligation. If negotiations are not required, the tenderer's SDL&I undertaking will become a contractual condition. Skills development is designed to benefit the currently unemployed graduates from school: further education and training campuses and universities.

The composition of these candidates must be representative of the population demographics of South Africa. Note that these targets for skills development candidates categorically exclude Eskom employees and registered learners. It is expected that the total of 51 individuals will benefit from caustic soda contract through courses stipulated below (if the budgeted value for this service is utilized) over the period of 5 years. This is how it will be applied:

- Successful tenderer will be obligated to skill one candidate for every R15 Million spend cumulatively through purchase orders/instructions awarded to the supplier; The supplier will be required to implement this requirement a month after the threshold is reached.

One of the following options will apply for SDL&I performance security:

- Suppliers will be required to report progress towards achieving SDL&I's contractual obligations on a quarterly basis regardless of the duration of the task order.

3.19.6 Commercial

Due diligence may also be done by considering previous civil judgements against the preferred tenderer. Eskom may also consider whether the preferred tenderer or any of its directors or senior management employees have been convicted of a serious offence.

Eskom may consider any pending litigation in a court of law or administrative tribunal as part of its risk assessment. If Eskom is likely to suffer substantial reputational harm as a result of doing business with the preferred supplier, it may take this into account as part of its risk assessment.

If it is determined that the risk to Eskom is too great and a clarification with the supplier does not resolve the mitigation of the risks, then the tender will be rejected as commercially unacceptable, and therefore ineligible for contract award.
