The objective of the Non-Grid Electrification program is to complement grid electrification with an additional Solar Home System to achieve universal access to energy.

- a. Diagnose problem with solar system and submit or diagnostic for approval and work instruction by project manager.
- b. Upon approval of diagnostic report proceed to carry out maintenance or repairs as per the approved diagnostic report and issuing of work instruction
- c. Issue a maintenance /repair completion certificate with six months guarantee on the maintenance /repaired part.
- d. Where parts are to be replaced, the service provider is to dispose of the parts in line with all environmental and other applicable regulations.
