These Terms of Reference outline the minimum Scope of Work for which the PSP is responsible. It defines key accountabilities and what the PSP is responsible for delivering i.e. the required outcomes as a result of the civil activities.

2. BACKGOUND

The Winnie Madikizela Mandela local municipality has number of pool cars includes trucks and plant, that must be kept at optimum and clean condition at all times, these are assets utilised by the municipality in rendering quality services to the Winnie Madikizela Mandela LM community and therefore requests that the professional suitable bidders submit their proposal on cleaning, washing of these mobile assets. On receipt of the appointment letter it is expected that the appointed service provider will sign with the municipal manager the service level agreement.

CERTIFICATE OF INDEPENDENT BID DETERMINATION

- 1 This Municipal Bidding Document (MBD) must form part of all bids¹ invited.
- Section 4 (1) (b) (iii) of the Competition Act No. 89 of 1998, as amended, prohibits an agreement between, or concerted practice by, firms, or a decision by an association of firms, if it is between parties in a horizontal relationship and if it involves collusive bidding (or bid rigging).² Collusive bidding is a *pe se* prohibition meaning that it cannot be justified under any grounds.

Bid rigging is, therefore, an agreement between competitors not to compete.

I am aware that, in addition and without prejudice to any other remedy provided to combat any restrictive practices related to bids and contracts, bids that are suspicious will be reported to the Competition Commission for investigation and possible imposition of administrative penalties in terms of section 59 of the Competition Act No 89 of 1998 and or may be reported to the National Prosecuting Authority (NPA) for criminal investigation and or may be restricted from conducting business with the public sector for a period not exceeding ten (10) years in terms of the Prevention and Combating of Corrupt Activities Act No 12 of 2004 or any other applicable legislation.
