#### 1. PURPOSE

The purpose of this Request for Quotation (RFQ) is to invite suitable, qualified and registered service providers to assist with training the National Arts Council officials in preparation of interim Annual Financial Statements (AFS) as at 31 December 2022 and AFS on Caseware for the financial year end 31 March 2023.

# 2. BACKGROUND

The National Arts Council of South Africa, an Agency of the Department of Arts and Culture, is the defacto successor in title to the Foundation for the Creative Arts, originally established in 1989. NACSA's mandate as set out in the National Arts Council Act, Act 56 of 1997, specifies its Objects as:

- To provide, and encourage the provision of, opportunities for persons to practice the arts
- To promote the appreciation, understanding and enjoyment of the arts
- To promote the general application of the arts in the community
- To foster the expression of a national identity and consciousness by means of the arts
- To uphold and promote the right of any person to freedom in the practice of the arts
- To give the historically disadvantaged such additional help and resources as are required to give them greater access to the arts
- To address historical imbalances in providing infrastructure for the promotion of the arts
- To promote and facilitate national and international liaison between individuals

# 3. SCOPE OF WORK

The National Arts Council of South Africa (NAC) hereby invites service providers from suitably Professional, qualified and experienced Finance Consultants and Caseware Trainers. The contract period will be for nine (09) months. The ideal service provider must be registered with the relevant statutory body, experienced and with sound-track record in rendering finance consulting services and traing staff on Caseware for public entities or municipalities and government institutions. In addition, they should be able to support the NAC with updated GRAP standards.

- 3.1 The scope of work includes and addresses the following:
- 3.1.1 The preparation of Annual Financial Statements of Caseware and ensure that they are in line with GRAP standards.
- 3.1.2 The service provider shall be required to submit the first draft Annual Financial Statements on or before 25 February 2023. The first draft AFS will be required The report must entail:
- 3.1.2.1 The full financial information as state on the NAC's Trial Balance.
- 3.1.2.2 The service provider shall be fully responsible to support NAC officials during the execution of the project.
- 3.1.2.3 The service provider shall be fully responsible to train NAC officials in preparing AFS on Caseware.

Training should cover but not limited to the following:

- Mapping of the Trial Balance to AFS
- Include and preparation of Working papers
- Complete current year disclosure (Notes to the AFS)
- Amendments
- Cash flow statements
- Roll over to next year
- Assist on reviewing the AFS and providing input on GRAP standards
- Complete year-end process on a previous CaseWare file.
- Ensure prior year on current AFS agrees to prior year audited AFS.
- Import trial balance for the year ending 31 March from Pastel/Sage, Excel.
- Balance Annual Financial Statements.
- Update CaseWare file to the latest version of the template from CaseWare.
- Ensure the AFS still balances.
- Review disclosure changes for a current year and update current set of Financial Statements.
- Print draft set of AFS.

- 3.1.3 During audits by the Auditor General, service providers, upon request, might be required to avail themselves when required afterhours/weekends to provide support in terms of any updates that may be required by the NAC.
- 3.1.4 The training and consulting service is expected to run for a period of nine (09) months and additional ad-hoc services may be required during the contract period on 30 September 2023.
