

EPMLM Ward 1 Councillor presented to the community

Regional Acting Chairperson of the African National Congress (ANC) in Sekhukhune, Minah Bahula, has on Sunday 10 December, led the party's Regional Executive Committee (REC) structure to officially present the newly elected councillor of Ephraim Mogale Local Municipality (EPMLM) Ward 1, Solly Rabalao, who was elected ward councillor in Malebitsa and Driefontein Villages respectively.

Rabalao was elected councillor in the recent bi-election after the ward became vacant following the passing of then councillor Maesela Frans Mello who died this year in August.

In the bi-election, ANC won the polls with 62%, followed by the Economic Freedom Fighters (EFF) with 36% and the Bolsheviks Party of South Africa (BPSA) got 2% votes.

During Rabalao's presentation, Bahula was joined by Zenani Branch Executive Committee (BEC) and the community of both Malibitsa as well as Driefontein Villages who were attending to celebrate the following decisive victory of the ANC in the recent in the ward.

Bahula took the platform to officially introduced and hand over the newly elected ward councillor to the community.

She furthered advised the community to work closely with the councillor to better their lives by delivering services to the community.

Meanwhile the ANC in the

region has continued with its visits to traditional healers by paying homage to Ngaka Reggie Tsiane on Friday 8 December at Kgobokwane Village in Moutse, Elias Motsoaledi Local Municipality (EMLM).

This was a follow-up visit by the political party after Tala Mathope; ANC Secretary in the region paid homage to the traditional healer's residence a few months ago and promised to come back.

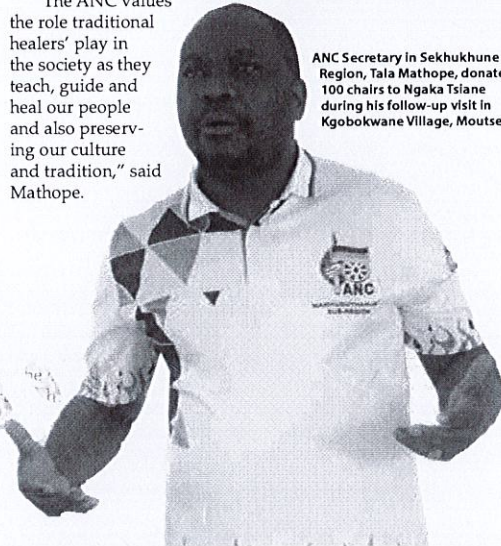

The community hall was handed-over in line with the local municipality's fulfilled promise in championing service delivery to the communities.

During the hand-over, Moimana was accompanied by the Council Speaker, Cllr Rebecca Lentsoane, local Tra-

ditional Leader Chief Kekana, together with EXCO members Cllr Lebo Tshiguvho, Cllr Mary Rampela, Cllr Frederick Sedibane, EPMLM Ward 3 Councillor Tebogo Kutu, as well as government sector departments such as the Correctional Services and the Independent Electoral Commission officials.

And we should report any form of violence to our law enforcement agencies. Let us be responsible people, let us stop harassing beloved women and children, let us stop hurting them," he said.
