DESCRIPTION: SUPPLY, DELIVERY AND OFFLOADING OF PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT AND CLOTHING (PPE) FOR CITY OF JOHANNESBURG WATER SAMPLERS.

1. BACKGROUND AND PURPOSE

The city is obliged by national policy and legislation, and by international agreements to manage its water resources in a sustainable, equitable and efficient manner in order to provide for needs of the people, development within the city, and quality of life of city residents.

In particular:

- Section 19 of The National Water Act (no 36 of 1998), assigns responsibility of management of water resources to local authorities
- Agenda 21, to which our country is a signatory, is the international blueprint for sustainable development. Sustainability and equity are key elements of Agenda 21.
- The Constitution of South Africa (Act 108 of 1996) states that everyone has the right to access to sufficient food and water and that everyone has the right to an environment that is not harmful to their health or well-being.

The National Water Act is based on three fundamental principles:

- i. To achieve equity of access to water services, the use of water resources and the benefits from the use of water resources.
- ii. To achieve sustainable use of water by balancing water availability and legitimate water requirements and by implementing measures to protect water resources.
- iii. To achieve efficient and effective water use for optimum social and economic benefit.

In order to achieve the above objectives and principles, water resources must be managed in an integrated, co-ordinated and sustainable basis. Sustainable and integrated management of water resources requires the measurement and knowledge of the status of the resource. To this end, the City of Johannesburg has in place a Surface Water Monitoring Programme which is co-ordinated by the Environment and Infrastructure Services Department (EISD), more specifically the Water and Biodiversity Directorate. The programme is implemented in accordance with a water monitoring and sampling plan which seeks to ensure that the objectives of Integrated Water Resource Management and river health are informed by credible water quality data, considering all aspects that may influence water quality.

This task is undertaken by Environmental Health Practitioners (EHP's) at regional level as outlined in the Municipal Health Functions and co-operative governance arrangement with EISD. The samplers collect water samples in a manner that ensures that the sample taken is representative of the water body/source. EHPs also record aesthetic aspects, such as litter and colour of the water. Biological health aspects are recorded at a few selected sites.

Samples are also taken from time to time by other officials within EISD in relation to pollution incidents and investigations.

Samples are delivered to a designated laboratory for analysis.

There is a health and safety risk attached to carrying out the activity of sampling of the City's surface watercourses and water bodies. The samplers/officials encounter a wide range of hazards while carrying out this activity. Watercourses may be highly contaminated with sewage or chemicals,

access to sampling stations may involve crossing dangerous terrain, and wading in streams inevitably carries the possibility of slipping and personal injury. In addition, there may be a risk of infection from contact with water. It is therefore critical from an occupational health and safety perspective that suitable protective clothing is provided for officials undertaking water sampling within the City's watercourses.

2. OBJECTIVES

Supply Protective clothing/equipment (PPE/C) to Environmental Health Practitioners and EISD officials who undertake water sampling of watercourses and water bodies as part of their responsibilities for the City of Johannesburg (COJ).

3. SCOPE OF PROCUREMENT

The successful service provider will be expected to provide the following PPE/C to the City:
