1. BACKGROUND

There is an annual provision in the departmental budget to procure firefighting equipment. The replacement of obsolete and irreparable equipment, buying additional equipment is a continuous process. It is to sufficiently equip the service with the required equipment to ensure that efficient and effective uninterrupted service delivery is rendered to communities of Cot. The equipment will be utilized at all fire stations throughout the City of Tshwane. The communities of the City of Tshwane will benefit directly and indirectly from this project since the equipment will be used to fight fires and to rescue communities that are in danger. Daily equipment checks lists supervised by company commanders will be done as a control and monitoring measures.

2. PROJECT SCOPE

It is the intent of the City of Tshwane that these specifications cover the supply, delivery and off-loading of emergency services firefighting equipment to the Emergency Services Department.

With a view of obtaining the best results and the most acceptable product for service in the Emergency Services Department, these specifications cover only the general requirements. Minor details of materials where not otherwise specified are left to the discretion of the bidder.

All equipment shall be new and of the highest quality. They shall be protected from damage; any damaged, flawed or defaced materials shall be rejected and replaced at a cost to the service provider. The Supplier shall warrant that the materials shall be of the highest grade, in accordance with the best practices and ready and complete for full operation. The tender will be awarded per section.
