1. BACKGROUND

The South African Forestry Company SOC Ltd (SAFCOL) is the custodian of state-owned forests of the Government of South Africa and was established in terms of the Management of State Forests Act No. 128 of 1992. In terms of Section 3 of the Act, an objectives of SAFCOL is to develop the forestry industry according to accepted commercial management practice. All references to SAFCOL in this document include the entire SAFCOL Group of companies.

SAFCOL manages an integrated forestry business operating in South Africa (Limpopo, Mpumalanga and KwaZulu Natal) and Mozambique. Its plantations are vulnerable to criminal activities such as timber theft, illegal mining and malicious damage to property. As part of its integrated security strategy, SAFCOL needs to detect intruders through the use of RPAS surveillance in its plantations in general, and in identified hot spots. As most of the incidents occur at night, undetected RPAS surveillance with thermal cameras are required to allow armed response teams to react timeously to arrest perpetrators and to provide evidence for prosecution.

2. PURPOSE

This document outlines the specifications for the required service at SAFCOL plantations for a period of twelve (12) months.

3. REQUIREMENTS

The required Satelite monitoring **MUST** achieve the following (**CORE REQUIREMENTS**):

- Provide a weekly satelite surveilliance of all SAFCOL plantation.
- Detect changes in harvesting areas to provide progress
- · Report immediately on any and all anomalies found.
- Provide continuous surveillance of fire protection
 - o Fires break monitoring system showing progress and protection status;
 - o Fire patterns in various plantations, this includes wind patterns in local areas;
- Stress detection system to identify areas under stress- pest and disease, drought or other causes.
- Sytem to monitor weed status during the tending phase.

SERVICE PROVIDER MUST:

- Provide progress report on all of the above area of interest
- Data to be available to SAFCOL for future use and to be fully owned by SAFCOL.

- Provide online access to a dashboard of results where reports and data is stored during the period of the contract.
- Images to be 3m resolution 8-band imagery required
- Be available to provide technical advise and interpretation of results and reports.



This Standard Bidding Document (SBD) must form part of all bids invited. It contains general information and serves as a declaration form for local content (local production and local content are used interchangeably).

Before completing this declaration, bidders must study the General Conditions, Definitions, Directives applicable in respect of Local Content as prescribed in the Preferential Procurement Regulations, 2011, the South African Bureau of Standards (SABS) approved technical specification number SATS 1286:2011 (Edition 1) and the Guidance on the Calculation of Local Content together with the Local Content Declaration Templates [Annex C (Local Content Declaration: Supporting Schedule to Annex C) and E (Local Content Declaration: Supporting Schedule to Annex C)].

1. General Conditions

- 1.4. A person awarded a contract in relation to a designated sector, may not sub-contract in such a manner that the local production and content of the overall value of the contract is reduced to below the stipulated minimum threshold.
- 1.5. The local content (LC) expressed as a percentage of the bid price must be calculated in accordance with the SABS approved technical specification number SATS 1286: 2011 as follows:
