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## A4. TERMS OF REFERENCE AND SCOPE OF WORK

### 1. INTRODUCTION

#### 1.1. Mandate

The Automotive Industry Development Centre (AIDC) serves to develop the automotive manufacturing sector to globally competitive standards of excellence, through a world-class value proposition that enables effective and sustainable socio-economic growth. The organization was established as a government support centre, to increase the local automotive industry's global competitiveness and to promote Gauteng as the automotive industry investment destination of choice.

The organization is the dedicated developmental agency of the Gauteng Growth and Development Agency (GGDA) in relation to the specific industrial, infrastructure and training needs required by the automotive and allied sector - in particular those based in the Gauteng province.

The AIDC is thus tasked by GGDA with special developmental-oriented projects aimed at retaining and attracting investments in the automotive and allied-related sector with a focus on enterprise development; supporting BBBEE SMME development, skills development and limited logistical infrastructure in line with the Gauteng provincial government's objectives of transformation, modernization and re-industrialization (TMR). The AIDC also undertakes projects related to the transport and energy sectors, as well as the development of the Auto City in the Northern Corridor.

#### 1.2. Vision

To be the automotive industry's thought leader and centre of excellence that promotes industry sustainability and global competitiveness.

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## 2. BACKGROUND TO THE TENDER

### 2.1. INTRODUCTION

The Automotive Supplier Park (ASP) is an industrial park based in Rosslyn, the park houses a pool of tenants comprising mainly of component manufacturers and suppliers to Original Equipment Manufacturers. The AIDC develops factories to tenant specification on a long-term lease basis.

The Ford Incubation Centre (FIC) in Silverton plant has established and mentored 10 BBBEE businesses since its inception in 2011. Black business owners are upskilled, coached, and mentored by AIDC growing their businesses through the supply of commodities to the Ford production line for assembly of the Ranger, Everest, and Raptor models.

The Gauteng Automotive Learning Centre (GALC) in Rosslyn is a state-of -art facility for skills and development training within the automotive sector. It was launched in 2014 as part of the Gauteng Provincial Government's commitment to skills development. The Learning Centre is part of the Nissan SA Investment Support Programme and is the result of a partnership between Nissan SA and the Automotive Industry Development Centre. The Learning Centre offers training in the latest technologies which match the latest vehicle models.

The Winterveld Enterprise Hub (WEH) in Winterveld Due to its location; it serves to upskill the previously disadvantaged community with informal automotive artisans with little or no skills development or training. The Hub serves to up-skill and support the growth of automotive SMMEs in the Winterveld region.

The critical and expensive equipment in the above-mentioned locations necessitates the need to have control on access and the ability to record movement in the various workspaces. It is therefore critical to install equipment which will support the places in straightening the security of the various investments made. The CCTV equipment should be ability to deliver secure and timely information that leads to greater safety and improved situational awareness of security and operational environments.

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## 2.2. BRIEF OF THE CURRENT INSTALLATIONS / ENVIRONMENT

### 2.2.1. The Gauteng Automotive Learning Centre (GALC).

The facility has both HIKVISION and BOSCH cameras installed with respective Network Video Recorder (NVR) recorders.  
 The cameras are installed in the learning labs, inside the offices. There are cameras for the perimeter as well.  
 There is both dome and bullet cameras installed.  
 There is a security control room at the site where the cameras are viewed.

### 2.2.2. Ford Incubation Centre (FIC).

The facility has both HIKVISION cameras installed with respective NVR recorders.  
 The cameras are installed in the workshops, entrances for the workshops, lunch spaces.  
 There are cameras for the perimeter as well.  
 There are bullet cameras installed.  
 There is a security control room at the site where the cameras are viewed by staff.

### 2.2.3. Automotive Supplier Park (ASP).

The facility has both HIKVISION cameras installed with respective NVR recorders.  
 The cameras are installed in the offices (fixed and flexi dome), around the respective buildings, inside the workshops. There are cameras for the perimeter as well.  
 There is bullet, dome (fixed and flexi dome) cameras installed.  
 There is a security control room at the site where the cameras are viewed.

### 2.2.4. Winterveld Enterprise Hub (WEH).

The CCTV at the facility is faulty.  
 The cameras are installed in the offices (bullet), around the respective buildings, inside the workshops. There are cameras for the perimeter as well.  
 There is a security control room at the site where the cameras are viewed.

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## 2.3. TENDER OBJECTIVES

The aim of the tender is to request service providers to provide detailed quotations for supply, install and maintain CCTV cameras for 24 months at the above-mentioned sites. The new equipment is to be of latest technology and compatible with multiple viewing platforms, phone, laptop, and web browser.

The cameras are to be viewed and monitored in the ASP control room located at the central hub within Automotive Supplier Park, AIDC offices, Winterveld Enterprise Hub as well as the Control room located at Gauteng Automotive Learning Centre and Ford Incubation Centre.

## 2.4. SYSTEM OBJECTIVES

The installation of the CCTV cameras is to:

- To deter crime,
- To assist in the detection of crime,
- To reduce the fear of crime,
- To improve safety and security,
- To facilitate the apprehension and prosecution of offenders in criminal offences.

## 2.5. SCOPE OF WORK

- The tender is not for a complete refresh of the CCTV equipment but to replace the faulty equipment and add additional equipment at the identified locations.
- The suppliers are to take into consideration the current installations in the environment for migration, usability, simplicity of the solution, integration, and compatibility purposes.
- The supplier is to ensure that CCTV data can be backed up on the ICT server. So not to overwrite data on the NVR's. The connection and setup will be done in conjunction to the ICT team.
- The appointed service provider will be required to remove the old equipment. The equipment will remain the property of AIDC.
- The installation will not be limited to height, trenching. Suppliers are to bring the necessary equipment.
- The contractors are required to replace faulty CCTV cameras and related equipment such as switching and recording devices. The installations and repairs are required to equipment both inside the premises as well as perimeter CCTV equipment. The other areas require extension of CCTV coverage; thus, the contractors will be required to either dig trenches or mount extension cabling with tubing to extend the coverage.
- The training of AIDC personnel will be required as well as access to the platform from laptops or mobile devices for monitoring.
- The AIDC security control room should be able to view locations such as at FIC and WEH.
- Control room of the system will be on site at the ASP.
- Cable runs and terminates at all points for all CCTV cameras.
- Configure network for IP cameras to run efficiently. Consult and work with AIDC ICT for network rules and permissions.

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- All the required licensing and accessories to be provided for.
- CCTV cameras are required for surveillance by means of weatherproof outdoor cameras (Internet protocol-based cameras) at specified locations around the buildings as identified in the drawings under Annexure A.
- It must be noted that there is already a CCTV system installed in the inner office areas of the AIDC's offices at the ASP Central Hub, Trade test Centre, Automotive supplier park perimeter fence. These cameras must be integrated with the newly to be installed CCTV system.
- All cameras shall have a night vision capability that would allow them to sense the presence/movement of prescribed objects (dogs, cats and large birds excluded) even when the illumination is poor.
- Cameras must be able to pick up and record movement at no less than 70 meters (outdoor conditions being prevalent).
- The moment a camera should pick up a movement in any of the designated areas it must produce an audible alarm in the control room as well as transmitting an alert sms message to at least two designated cell phones.
- Cameras must be connected and feed live scenes to a dual redundancy Digital Video Recorder (DVR). The DVR must have a maximum of 30 (thirty) days storage capacity of disk space for online video storage and access to high-capacity archiving mechanism for the removal of stored video to offline media.
- The DVR units should be able to direct record from all the cameras in real time over a 24-hour period. The resolution of recorded footage should be of a high definition (preferable not less than 3 mega pixels). The system should have the ability to allow a Security operator to choose any given camera for viewing on the monitor.
- Each image/scene must simultaneously be projected on the CCTV monitor/s that should display the camera number, exact location, date and always recording speed visible on the screen. This digital data should be captured on the DVRs' recordings as well and not only be displayed on the monitor/displayed.
- In the event any given camera should be disabled by whatever means and/or by cutting its cable an audible alarm must be sounded in the control room as well as two SMS alerts be transmitted to designated cell phones.
- Housing for outdoors cameras / lens shall be weatherproof complete with a protective sun shield.
- The Bidder needs to provide the switch infrastructure for the CCTV system.
- The AIDC ICT will provide the backbone to the bidder's switches as well as the cabinet to place it in. These switches must be able connect with small form factor (SFP) Gigabit Interface convertor (Single mode).
- In case of any digging work done during laying of cables for the CCTV system and after completion, restoration of the same work shall be in the scope of bidder. The depth of cable with PVC conduit shall be a minimum of 0.5 – 0.7m feet. The laying of these underground cables must be clearly indicated on the site map and cleared in advance with the Facilities Maintenance Manager to prevent damage to existing underground cables and pipes.

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- All external cable connections shall be waterproof.
- The CCTV system shall be fitted with an electric surge and lightning protector.
- Uninterrupted power supply to be installed in the control room.

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## 2.11. SUPPLIER PERFORMANCE REPORTING

Monthly meetings to be scheduled between AIDC and the service provider. The supplier is to prepare the required reporting for the meeting.

## 2.12. WARRANTY

- (a) The service provider warrants that the goods supplied under the contract are new, unused, of the most recent or current models, and that they incorporate all recent improvements in design and materials unless provided otherwise in the contract.
- (b) The service provider further warrants that all goods supplied under this contract shall have no defect, arising from design, materials, or workmanship (except when the design and/or material is required by the purchaser's specifications) or from any act or omission of the supplier, that may develop under normal use of the supplied goods in the conditions prevailing in the country of destination.

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## D1. UNDERTAKINGS BY SERVICE PROVIDER IN RESPECT OF THIS BID

### 1. Definitions:

- 1.1 **“The Board”** means the accounting authority of **AIDC** appointed by the Shareholder, GGDA.
- 1.2 **“Chief Executive Officer”** [“CEO”] means the CEO of **AIDC** or her/his duly authorized representative as appointed by the Board in concurrence with GGDA.
- 1.3 **“Contract”** shall include any schedule, drawings, patterns, samples attached, any agreement entered, and all other schedules attached hereto.
- 1.4 **“Contractor(s)”** means service provider/s whose bid has been accepted by AIDC.
- 1.5 **“Cost of materials”** means, as and when applicable, the cost of components, parts or materials which are intended for the production, manufacturing or assembling of the goods bid for and which are not produced, manufactured or assembled in the factory where the production, manufacture or assembly of such goods occurs, including freight, landing costs, port charges, import duties and other import costs of such components, parts or materials and all costs in connection with the handling and transport thereof prior to delivery at that factory;
