TERMS OF REFERENCE (TOR) FOR THE APPOINTMENT OF A FACILITATOR FOR THE INDEPENDENT INFORMAL TRADERS FORUM (ITF).

1. Introduction

The City of Johannesburg Metropolitan Council approved the reviewed Informal Trading Policy on the 26 April 2022. The policy requires that the Department of Economic Development, through Informal Trading Unit to support the facilitation of an Independent Informal Trader Forum (IITF). In recognition of the challenges in organising a sector in which survivalist activities prevail, in which workers are creating their employment and work on an individual basis, and in which part of the activity is still informal. Further, in order to facilitate meaningful engagement with other stakeholders, those who are often more resourced and organized, participating in the Informal Trading Stakeholders Committee as defined by the Social Principles, in The Informal Trading Policy, Clause 7.2 paragraph 1, "it seeks to reduce inequity through the provision of services and through active programmes to support vulnerable populations to access opportunity and dignity through informal trade. This includes the right to human dignity (which is granted to "everyone") also protects foreign nationals' right to participate in informal trade. In essence, municipalities cannot prevent foreign nationals from participating in informal trade (as long as foreign traders follow and comply with the laws of the country)." and to work towards fair and democratic representation of traders in this forum.

The process of establishing the Independent Informal Traders Forum (IITF) must be initiated and completed within THREE MONTHS. The City has identified some gaps in the policy, however the successful bidder will further be required to extensively engage with the traders to ensure organized trading and management of informal trading areas holistically in all seven regions. The service provider must not be biased and must recognize all trader's representation equally.

2. SCOPE OF WORK / KEY OUTCOMES:

- 2.1 Recognition of the challenges in organising a sector in which survivalist activities prevail, in which workers are creating their employment and work on an individual basis, and in which part of the activity is still informal; and
- 2.2 Facilitate meaningful engagement with others, often more resourced and organised, stakeholders in the **Informal Trading Stakeholders Committee (ITSC)** as defined by the Social Principles described in revised policy.
- 2.3 And to work towards fair and democratic representation of traders in this forum.

- 2.4 Endeavour to create and facilitate an **Independent Informal Trader Forum (IITF)**, where informal traders, their organisations and representatives may meet to discuss their issues, select their representatives, and consolidate their policy and strategic positions.
- 2.5 Hold bimonthly or monthly meetings to achieve the above.

3. DELIVERABLES

- 3.1 The appointed service provider will be required to undertake the establishment of the **Independent Informal Traders Forum (IITF)**.
- 3.2 Provide project inception report with schedule of engagements.
- 3.3 To provide a report that states the traders view or idea with regards to the management of street trading and linear markets.
- 3.4 To produce Terms of Reference (ToR) of the Independent Informal Traders Forum.
- 3.5 Feedback report on the engagements with the traders.
- 3.6 Final list and details of trader's representatives in the **Informal Traders Stakeholders** Committee (ITSC).

4. MINIMUM REQUIREMENT

- 4.1 Project team personnel with Business Management qualification with minimum 3 years experience in stakeholder management.
- 4.2 Project team Personnel with stakeholder engagement/community liaison with 3 years experience.
- 4.3 Proof from at least 2 companies/clients for which similar work was undertaken.

5. EVALUATION CRITERIA
