PART C3 SCOPE OF WORKS

The scope of work comprises of the Supply, Install and commissioning of New Ups Batteries in the National Lotteries Commission In Pretoria Hatfield

1. Turn off and unplug the UPS

 Before you begin, turn off your UPS and disconnect it from the wall socket to prevent any electrical hazards. Also, disconnect all devices connected to the UPS.

2. Remove the front or top panel

• Depending on the UPS model, you may need to remove screws to open the battery compartment. Some models might have a removable front or top panel that gives you access to the battery.

3. Locate the battery compartment

• Once the panel is removed, locate the batteries. They are usually housed in a compartment with easy access to terminals for replacement.

4. Disconnect the old batteries

- First, note the battery connections—this is important for correctly connecting the new ones.
- Disconnect the negative terminal (typically black) and then the positive terminal (typically red).
- If there are screws holding the battery in place, remove them and take the old battery out carefully.

 Allow the UPS to charge the new batteries for several hours or as recommended by the manufacturer, even if the UPS seems to work fine right after installation.

• To verify everything is in working order, you can test your UPS by unplugging it from the wall to simulate a power outage. The UPS should continue to power your connected devices.
