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#### 1. PURPOSE

The purpose of these terms of reference (ToR) is to invite or request bidders to submit a quotation for establishment of a community nursery for local communities in the core area of the new Grasslands National Park.

#### 2. BACKGROUND

South African National Parks (SANParks) is a public entity functioning under National Environmental Management: Protected Areas Act 57 of 2003 (Act 57 of 2003); with the mandate to conserve; protect; control; and manage national parks and other defined protected areas and their biological diversity (Biodiversity). As a public entity, SANParks is also governed by the Public Finance Management Act, Act 1 of 1999 (as amended by Act 29 of 1999), and it is listed as Schedule 3 Part A: public entities.

SANParks' operations are totally guided by its vision statement and mission statement. As a public entity, the organisation is committed to act in pursuance of transformation of South Africa's society in support of entrenching South Africa's democracy. In this regard, the organisation has adopted a transformation mission to guide its efforts accordingly.

#### 3. INTRODUCTION

Greening initiatives: Healthy ecosystems deliver critical goods and services, such as food and raw materials. People depend on these goods and services for their well-being and livelihoods. According to the findings of the Millennium Ecosystem Assessment, over the past 50 years, humans have changed ecosystems more rapidly and extensively than in any comparable period in human history, largely to meet rapidly growing demands for food, fresh water, timber, fibre and fuel. This has resulted in a substantial and largely irreversible loss in the diversity of life on Earth. While the changes made to ecosystems have contributed to substantial net gains in human well-being and economic development, these gains have been achieved at growing costs in the form of the degradation of many ecosystem services, accelerated change and the exacerbation of poverty for some groups of people. These problems, unless addressed, will substantially diminish the benefits that future generations obtain from ecosystems, which threaten the achievement of the Sustainable Development Goals.

The proposed Grasslands National Park (GNP) is referred to as the park with a difference because it is being established through stewardship with private and communal landowners. The process of getting the communal landowners contracted into the park is long and requires very specific benefits for the identified communities. This process requires partnering with the local communities. The selected communities are within the Elundini Local Municipality, which has over 62% of its population living in poverty. This calls for action from SANParks and landscape partners working in these areas, to not only focus on the conservation targets but also try to address social ills such as poverty. This is very much in line with SANParks Vision 2040 and the Mega Living Landscapes approach that call for inclusive, flexible and collaborative conservation. One way of doing this is the introduction of community projects such as Agro-ecology Garden project, which has unlocked an opportunity for the establishment of an organic community nursery. These will seek to address environmental challenges as well as the high rates of poverty, high unemployment and the high dependency on social grants.

#### The community nursery will serve as:

- A learning hub for traditional healers, schools and broader local communities, providing mentorship in the sustainable use of medicinal plants for all users.
- Space to facilitate the propagation of new garden vegetables and fruit trees for agro-processing, supporting local food security.
- Local supplier for seedlings to local communities, promoting sustainable agriculture practices.
- A vehicle for business development and training support for business development in local communities and, ultimately, an operational community owned SMME.

#### 4. OBJECTIVES

To engage a qualified service provider to design, establish/ build, and manage the initial operations of a community nursery that focuses on medicinal plants, the cultivation of fruit trees and vegetables for sale to local communities, and the capacitation of local communities.

#### 5. SCOPE OF WORK

The service provider will be responsible for the following:

- Site Selection and Preparation: Select and prepare a suitable area in the identified site for the nursery, ensuring it meets all necessary environmental, logistical, and community requirements.
- Nursery Construction: Construct the nursery infrastructure, including:
  - 3 tunnels a 5mx5m plastic tunnel, a 12mx8m shade cloth tunnel for vegetables and a 10mx5m shade cloth tunnel.
  - Storage facilities 3mx3m brick room,
  - Composting and waste management area outside unshaded plot with shade net walls.
  - o Office space for record-keeping, planning and convening.
  - 2mx2m corrugated iron pump house

#### 6. TIMELINE

The project in its entirety is expected to take 36 months, with the construction taking 3 to 6 months, with the following milestones:

- Preparation Phase: Conduct feasibility study, develop business plan and site selection and preparation (Week 1-2)
- Planning Phase: workshop nursery objectives, design nursery, procurement of materials and establishment of partnerships (Week 2-3)
- Construction and operationalisation Phase: Construction and development of standard operating procedures. Recruit and train nursery personnel from the 3 representative Traditional Authorities. (Week 4-10)
- Launch and Marketing Phase: promote nursery, begin sales and operations to pilot for refinement and host a launch event. (Week 10-12)

- Monitoring and evaluation: Continuously assess the nursery's performance, gather feedback, and make improvements. (Continuous with specific targets at the end of each phase and once every 3 months postlaunch)
- Post Launch Phase: Refine processes, expand services and explore new opportunities for community involvement, such as hosting events and promoting environmental awareness. Review and adjust the business plan. (Quarterly meetings and reviews post month 12).
- Handover Phase: Community workshops and final handover (Month

The service provider is not expected to stay the duration of the process as it is expected that at month 12, the community representatives should be able to run things without constant monitoring but with occasional oversight.

#### 7. BUDGET

The service provider should submit a detailed budget proposal that includes costs for all materials, labour, training, and other expenses related to the successful completion of the project.

#### 8. SELECTION CRITERIA

The service provider will be selected based on the following:

- Proven experience in similar projects.
- Understanding of organic farming and local biodiversity.
- Ability to engage with and train local communities.
- Cost-effectiveness and value for money.

#### Jigs, Tools, and Templates, where applicable

Unless otherwise agreed, all jigs, tools, templates, and similar equipment necessary for the execution of this contract is property of SANParks, if SANParks has paid for these. On completion or cancellation of the contract, the contractor delivers all SANParks property to SANParks premises, properly marked with the contract and the relevant code number as supplied by SANParks.

#### **Copyright and Intellectual Property**

All background intellectual property (existing prior to this contract) invests in and remains the sole property of the contributing party to this contract and/or the contracted discloses the same to SANParks at the commencement of this contract.

The contracted supplier grants SANParks a fully paid up, irrevocable, non-exclusive, and transferable licence to use its background intellectual property including the right to sub-licence to third parties in perpetuity and to the extent that SANParks requires for the exploitation of the contract intellectual

property and to enable SANParks to obtain the full benefit of the contract intellectual property.

The parties agree that all right, title, and interest in the contract intellectual property rightly invests in SANParks and to give effect to the foregoing:

- (a) The contracted supplier hereby assigns all rights, titles, and interests in and to the contract intellectual property that it may own to SANParks and SANParks hereby accepts such assignment, and
- (b) The contracted supplier undertakes to assign in writing to SANParks all contract intellectual property and which may invest in the contracted supplier.

The contracted supplier shall keep the contract intellectual property confidential and shall fulfil its confidentiality obligations as set out in this document.

The contracted supplier shall assist SANParks in obtaining statutory protection for the contract intellectual property at the expense of SANParks wherever SANParks may choose to obtain such protection. The contracted party shall procure where necessary the signatures of its personnel for the assignment of the contract intellectual property to SANParks, or as SANParks may direct, and to support SANParks, or its nominee, in the prosecution and enforcement thereof in any country in the world.

The contracted supplier hereby irrevocably appoints SANParks to be its true and lawful agent in its own name, to do such acts, deeds, and things and to execute deeds, documents, and forms that SANParks, in its absolute discretion, requires in order to give effect to the terms of this clause.

The rights and obligations set out in this clause shall service termination of this contract indefinitely.

#### Confidentiality

The recipient of confidential information shall be careful and diligent as not to cause any unauthorised disclosure or use of the confidential information, in particular, during its involvement with SANParks and after termination of its involvement with SANParks, the recipient shall not:

- (a) Disclose the confidential information, directly or indirectly, to any person or entity, without SANParks' prior written consent.
- (b) Use, exploit or in any other manner whatsoever apply the confidential information for any other purpose whatsoever, other than for the execution of the contract and the delivery of the deliverables or
- (c) Copy, reproduce, or otherwise publish confidentiality information except as strictly required for the execution of the contract.

The recipient shall ensure that any employees, agents, directors, contractors, service providers, and associates which may gain access to the confidential information are bound by agreement with the recipient both during the term of their associations with the recipient and after termination of their respective associations with the recipient, not to

- (a) Disclose the confidential information to any third party, or
- (b) Use the confidential information otherwise than as may be strictly necessary for the execution of the contract,

The recipient shall take all such steps as may be reasonably necessary to prevent the confidential information from falling into the hands of any unauthorised third party.

The undertakings set out in this clause shall not apply to confidential information, which the recipient is able to prove:

- (a) Was independently developed by the recipient prior to its involvement with SANParks or in the possession of the recipient prior to its involvement with SANParks;
- (b) Is now or hereafter comes into the public domain other than by breach of this contract by the recipient;
- (c) Was lawfully received by the recipient from a third party acting in good faith having a right of further disclosure and who do not derive the same directly or indirectly from SANParks, or
- (d) Is required by law to be disclosed by the recipient, but only to the extent of such order and the recipient shall inform SANParks of such requirement prior to any disclosure.

The recipient shall within one (1) month of receipt of a written request from SANParks to do so, return to SANParks all material embodiments, whether in documentary or electronic form, of the confidential information including but not limited to:

- (a) All written disclosures received from SANParks;
- (b) All written transcripts of confidential information disclosed verbally by the SANParks; and
- (c) All material embodiments of the contract intellectual property.

The recipient acknowledges that the confidential information made available solely for the execution of the contract and for no other purpose whatsoever and that the confidential information would not have been made available to the recipient, but for the obligations of confidentiality agreed to herein.

Except as expressly herein provided, this contract shall not be construed as granting or confirming, either expressly or impliedly any rights, licences or relationships by furnishing of confidential information by either party pursuant to this contract.
