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#### 1. Introduction and Background

The farmers development program is a program that assist local farmers within WMMLM Jurisdiction in form of financial and non-financial; financial simple means buying equipment, inputs and material and non-financial means skills transfer or capacity building for farmers. The farmers development program was establish in support of the farmers in the area, with the view to improve economic well-being and quality of life of local communities by encouraging creation of jobs and poverty alleviation, The project was establish with a one year time frame, that is to say the identified projects will be funded for a period of one years in order to monitor the project and give the necessary support so that the project would be self-sustainable. The municipality has developed a funding policy acknowledging the challenges of poverty and job creation in our society. The funding framework focuses on economic development projects as the core business of the LED that creates job opportunities and alleviate poverty. In developing funding mechanism, the municipality wanted to ensure fairness in the distribution of limited resources, to standardize funds distribution to the catalyst projects and to ensure that the Municipality directs funds to the project that has the most potential for success and sustainability. The WMMLM Integrated Development Plan (IDP) and Local Economic Development (LED) Strategy clearly identifies agriculture as one of the key potential economic drivers of the municipality resulted from numerous studies conducted in the municipality. The WMMLM, LED within its Vision advocates for the reduction inequality where the poverty must be reduced and household food and nutrition security must receive priority. Furthermore, it is worth noting that Bizana is one of the municipalities in the region with fertile land, favorable climatic conditions and is also highly endowed in land as a natural resource, suitable for the development of the Agricultural Industry.

#### 2. PURPOSE AND OBJECTIVES

Is to increase the level of production within the agricultural sector, to intensify food security where the intended outcome is to reduce high levels of unemployment and stimulate local economic growth and development.

#### 3. SCOPE OF WORK OF THE APPOINTED SERVICE PROVIDER


