1. BACKGROUND

The SABC in Auckland Park manages Three (3) underground fuel tank and utilise digital fuel dispenser pumps to refuel vehicles and transportable generators. The current fuel pumps have reached their lifespan and are expensive to maintain. The pumps are obsolete due to lack of spares.

a) The 14000-litre diesel tank is situated at OB site to provide fuel for the OB trucks and generators, this tank has one pump that has one nozzle.

b) The two 23000-litre (diesel & petrol) tanks are situated at Transport depot to provide fuel for fleet vehicles and loose generators. The two tanks at Transport share one dispenser that has two nozzles.

4. POINTS AWARDED FOR SPECIFIC GOALS

- 4.1. In terms of Regulation 4(2); 5(2); 6(2) and 7(2) of the Preferential Procurement Regulations, preference points must be awarded for specific goals stated in the tender. For the purposes of this tender the tenderer will be allocated points based on the goals stated in table 1 below as may be supported by proof/ documentation stated in the conditions of this tender:
- 4.2. In cases where organs of state intend to use Regulation 3(2) of the Regulations, which states that, if it is unclear whether the 80/20 or 90/10 preference point system applies, an organ of state must, in the tender documents, stipulate in the case of—

2 SUB-CONTRACTING

- 2.1 A person awarded a contract may only enter into a subcontracting arrangement with the approval of the organ of state.
- 2.2 A person awarded a contract in relation to a designated sector, may not subcontract in such a manner that the local production and content of the overall value of the contract is reduced to below the stipulated minimum threshold.

- 1 This Standard Bidding Document (SBD) must form part of all bids¹ invited.
- 2 Section 4 (1) (b) (iii) of the Competition Act No. 89 of 1998, as amended, prohibits an agreement between, or concerted practice by, firms, or a decision by an association of firms, if it is between parties in a horizontal relationship and if it involves collusive bidding (or bid rigging).² Collusive bidding is a *pe se* prohibition meaning that it cannot be justified under any grounds.
