BACKGROUND

The Department of Public Enterprises is the shareholder representative for Government with oversight responsibility over seven State Owned Companies (SOCs) that operate in core sectors of the economy such as mining, defence, energy, logistics, aviation, and forestry.

The SOC's in DPE's portfolio are: Eskom, Transnet, Denel, South African Airways (SAA), South African Forestry Company Limited (SAFCOL), Alexkor, and SA Express.

These SOC's play a key role in enabling economic growth, creating jobs and promoting the industrialisation and the transformation of the economy. The Department is the primary interface between Government and the SOC's concerned and, in addition to oversight, provides input to the formulation of policy, legislation and regulation.

OUR VISION

To create an enabling environment in which SOC's add real economic value by focusing on operational excellence, commercial viability, and fiscal prudence. This will drive developmental objectives, industrialisation, job creation, and skills development.

1. TERMS OF REFERENCE / SCOPE OF WORK

The Department of Public Enterprise is hereby requesting experienced and reputable bidders to submit proposals to assist the Department of Public Enterprises to subscribe to a professional economic data and insights publisher for a period of three (3) years.

1.1. Services required from the service providers:

- Historical data (economic, financial and industry specific).
- Economic Forecasts.
- Key macro-economic indicators. Industry specific information (e.g., manufacturing industry, energy sector, etc.).
- Access to economic experts as and when needed.
- Daily, weekly, monthly, and quarterly economic updates.

1.2. Deliverables

- The service provider should provide the Research and Economic Modelling (REM) Unit with a broad range of research offerings.
- The service provider should have an industry-leading customer service team that is always available in South Africa. This will help the REM Unit leverage the deep information, analytics, and data.
- The service provider should give the REM Unit access to economic data from multiple sources, with organisation and context, including data transformation, frequency and seasonality that support our analytical requirements.
- The service provider should provide an economic platform that allows data transformations to economic data series to perform detailed analysis, which is most relevant to our needs.
- The service provider will be expected to provide, up-to-the-minute access to a world-wide economic and industry specific updates on a weekly, monthly, and quarterly basis.

2. PROJECT DURATION

- 2.1.** The project will be for the duration of three (3) years and the Department reserves the right to assess and review performance biannual.

3. EVALUATION CRITERIA

- 3.1.** In order to facilitate a transparent selection process that allows equal opportunity to all bidders, DPE has a Supply Chain Management policy that will be adhered to. Proposals will be evaluated in terms of the prevailing Supply Chain Management Request for Quotations policy applicable to DPE and it should be noted that proposals will be evaluated in two (2) phases namely, Mandatory evaluation, Presentation Evaluation and Price and B-BBEE using the 80/20 formula (preference points system) as per the PPPF regulations 2017.

The successful bidder will be required to sign confidentiality and indemnity agreements.

- a) DPE reserves the right not to enter any relationship and no correspondence pertaining to submissions will be entered into.
- b) If DPE does not accept any proposal, it will declare this RFQ/ RFP call process closed and may then elect to:
 - Proceed on a completely different basis; and
 - Not to appoint any respondent in the event it deems proposals not appropriate.
- c) DPE will not accept any responsibility for costs incurred by bidders in preparing and submitting proposals.
- d) DPE reserves the right to engage in processes to validate all claims made in the proposal.
- e) DPE reserves the right to cancel the award if it is determined that the supplier/service provider recommended for award, has engaged in corrupt or fraudulent activities in competing for the contract in question. For the purposes of this RFQ/ RFP, "fraudulent practice" means a misrepresentation of facts in order to influence a selection process or the execution of a contract to the detriment of the accounting officer/authority and includes collusive practices among bidders/contractors (prior to or after submission of proposals) designed to establish prices at artificial, non-competitive levels and to deprive the accounting officer/authority of the benefits of free and open competition.
