1.2. ALL BIDS MUST BE SUBMITTED ON THE OFFICIAL FORMS PROVIDED (NOT TO BE RE-TYPED) OR IN THE MANNER PRESCRIBED IN THE BID DOCUMENT.

TERMS OF REFERENCE FOR THE APPOINTMENT OF A SERVICE PROVIDER TO PROVIDE AN EMPLOYEE WELLNESS PROGRAMME AT THE SOUTH AFRICAN DIAMOND AND PRECIOUS METALS REGULATOR (SADPMR)

1. GENERAL / BACKGROUND

The South African Diamond and Precious Metals Regulator (SADPMR) is a state-owned entity located in Gauteng Province, Kempton Park (Head Quarters). The SADPMR requires an Employee Wellness Programme service provider for 130 employees and their household. For this purpose, household means spouse, children and anyone who is dependent financially and otherwise on the employee. This includes Counselling, Legal, Health and Financial advice among others. This service will be extended to all other provinces.

SCOPE OF SERVICE

2.1 Counselling Services

- Toll free telephonic supportive counselling by fully qualified counsellors (24/7/365) for all employees and their families.
- Eight face to face counselling sessions per employee and family member per issue per year with the option to extend sessions as and when required on a pre-approval basis, by the Human Resources Manager.
- The service provider must have a national footprint and the service should be available in all official languages.
- Trauma debriefing / Group counselling sessions as per the business times of the SADPMR is important 24/7/365.
- Electronic on-line advisory services, Management advisory services and SMS call back system.
- Reports on individual formal referral cases will follow the following format:
 - Formal report after second session.
 - Final report after final session.
 - Regular progress feedback in between to referring Manager / Human Resources Manager.

2.2 Awareness, Education and Training

- These services would consist of briefing sessions, awareness events and education and training sessions.
- Briefing sessions refer to one-hour presentation on the Employee Wellbeing Programme service
- Awareness sessions refer to the conducting of awareness on a variety of relevant topics and events.
- Briefing and training managers and supervisors on wellness related issues.
- Briefing sessions will include employees, managers and relevant stakeholders.

- Training on substance and electronic abuse, HIV/AIDS, trauma management and financial management would be a basic offering of this service.
- Mental Illness interventions
- Dread Disease interventions; e.g. Cancer, Heart diseases etc.

2.3 Health, Wellness, Weight and Risk management

- Personalized health risk assessments which will form part of Wellness Day offering.
- Support and engagement with employees after health risk assessments as part of a follow-up plan.
- HIV, Counselling and Testing (HCT) and Weight management to be conducted as a component of wellness days within and integrated model or as campaigns, as decided by the Human Resources Management.
- Managing Wellness Days will range from project planning, sourcing providers, engagement with Human Resources Management and managing the overall event.
- The overall Wellness Day management fall within this ambit.

2.4 Behavioural Risk Assessments

- Behavioural risk assessments will form part of standard practice.
- Assessments on behavioural risks within the Regulator may also be requested if and where required, e.g. directly after an incident.
- These risk assessments should form the basis for project planning or should be aimed at a deeper understanding of organizational needs and change impacts.
- Recommended interventions based on trend analysis and the outcomes of assessment.

2.5 Health Promotion Campaigns

- Implementation and promotion of the Employee Wellness Programme will consist of customer designed programme to ensure all employees know what services they will receive from the wellness service provider.
- The creation and distribution of promotional material, which must be SADPMR branded in line with the Corporate Identity guidelines.
- Promotional items will among other consist of:
 - Posters, Wallet cards, E-mailers Manager/supervisor user guides (booklets and hand-outs).
- Most importantly the service provider would have to demonstrate a marketing and communication expertise.

2.8 Programme Management

- The provision of an overall Key Accounts Manager for the Service Level Agreement.
- Performance management of provider functionaries is critical.
- A keen ability to self-manage and project management skills will be expected.

- Demonstration of Quality Assurance processes with all projects but in particular in the generation of reports, statistics, and trend analysis for SADPMR.
- Complaints and compliments system, accessible to the SADPMR EWP Practitioner /Manager.
- The service provider should demonstrate a return on investment model which will underpin the quarterly review process of the SLA.
- Reports on relevant projects would be expected.
- Monthly reports, quarterly trend reports, as well as annual reports are basic requirement.
- Employee satisfaction surveys will be expected after 6 months of the commencement of the SLA.
- Implement and promote the Employee Wellness

3. PROJECT OUTPUT AND/OUTCOMES

- Holistically balanced employees who are also empowered to deal with challenges with minimum interruption on performance or service delivery of the SADPMR as well as family.

4. REPORTING REQUIREMENT

- The service provider will report to Human Resource Management Division (HRM)
The service provider will submit brief EWP utilisation reports to HRM on a monthly basis, present comprehensive reports on a quarterly basis and annual presentation to management.

5. DURATION

- The expected duration of the project is twenty-four (24) months from signing of the contract.

6. EVALUATION METHODOLOGY/CRITERIA

6.1 Phase One Evaluation

6.1.1 Mandatory Requirement

- Bidders are required to submit a certified copy of an accreditation / registration certificate /s with the Employee Assistance Professionals Association of South Africa (EAPA-SA).

N.B. Failure to provide proof of registration with a professional body will result in a bidder being disqualified for further evaluation.

6.1.2 Company Experience

- Bidders should have a minimum of six years' experience in rendering Employee Wellness Programme, by providing three signed reference letters on a letter head of the respective companies with verifiable contact details.

6.1.3 Accounts Manager

- The team leader should have a minimum of five years' experience in Employee Wellness Programme account management and support.
A detailed CV must be attached on the technical proposal.

6.1.4 Project Plan / Methodology

- Service providers are required to provide a comprehensive project plan indicating awareness / campaigns to be offered with final outputs and identified timeframes.

6.1.5 Infrastructure

- Bidders are required to indicate basic facilities, which include a telephone line, functional company website, and email.
