1. Terms and conditions of Request for Quotation (RFQ)

- 1.1 This document may contain confidential information that is the property of the Marine Living Resources Fund [MLRF].
- 1.2 No part of the contents may be used, copied, disclosed, or conveyed in whole or in part to any party in any manner whatsoever other than for preparing a proposal in response to this RFQ without prior written permission from MLRF.
- 1.3 All copyright and intellectual property herein vests with MLRF.
- 1.4 Late and incomplete submissions will not be considered. Submissions received after closing time and date will be classified as LATE and WILL NOT be considered.
- 1.5 No services must be rendered, or goods delivered, before an official MLRF Purchase Order form has been issued by a duly authorised official from the MLRF and received by the bidder. Please note that this is not an instruction to proceed with the supply of any goods or service unless the quotation is approved, and a Purchase Order is supplied to you.
- 1.6 Please note that if you receive the Purchase Order, delivery of goods or rendering of services must be done **within 60 days** of receiving the Purchase Order. Failing to deliver on agreed-upon times may result in your Purchase Order being cancelled.
- 1.7 This RFQ will be evaluated in terms of the 80/20 preference point system if it is equal to or below R50 million.
- 1.8 Bidders are required to register on the Central Supplier Database (CSD) at www.csd.gov.za if they are not registered on the CSD.
- 1.9 All quotations must be forwarded to MLRFQUOTATIONS@dffe.gov.za within the prescribed closing date and time.
- 1.10 All questions regarding this RFQ must be forwarded MLRFQUOTATIONS@dffe.gov.za within 24 hours after the RFQ has been issued.
- 1.11 Any bidder who has reasons to believe that the RFQ specification is based on a specific brand must inform MLRF within two (2) days before the RFQ closing date.
- 1.12 Where quotations/proposals submitted are equal to or below R50 million, bidders are required to submit the original and valid proof for preference points claimed or certified copies thereof, to substantiate their preference points claims. SBD 6.1 must also be duly completed, signed, and submitted alongside the bid to claim preference points. Failure to do so will result in preference points being forfeited.

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- 1.13 As per section 4(1) of the Preferential Procurement Regulations of 2022, the maximum 20 points may be awarded based on specific goals. The 20 points will be allocated as follows:

- 1.14 Bidders are required to duly complete, sign and submit the new SBD 4 together with their quotations/proposals. Failure to do so may result in your quotation/proposal **not** being accepted.
- 1.15 All quotations/proposals submitted must be inclusive of Value Added Tax (VAT) if you are VAT registered and must be quoted in South African Rands (ZAR) and the price must be firm.
- 1.16 The full costs must be disclosed as there will be no variances that will be entertained, and no price adjustment will be entertained after the Purchase Order has been issued.
- 1.17 These terms and conditions supersede any terms and conditions that may be issued by the service provider/supplier on their quotations or any other document similar to that.
- 1.18 A full and updated CSD report must be submitted with the quotation and MLRF will only contract with suppliers/service providers whose tax matters are in order.
- 1.19 The winning bidder must be registered on the MLRF Oracle ERP system in order for a Purchase Order to be generated. The bidder is required to complete the Oracle Registration Form and submit all relevant supporting documents **within seven (7) days** of receiving the form from MLRF. Failure to complete the registration process within the stipulated timeframe may result in the bidder's proposal being deemed non-responsive
- 1.20 The MLRF pays within 30 (thirty) days after receipt of a valid tax invoice and after approval of the relevant invoice and reports and does not make upfront payments or deposits.
- 1.21 It is the responsibility of prospective bidders to ensure that all bid documents are submitted before the closing date and time of the RFQ.
- 1.22 All the conditions specified in the General Conditions of Contract (GCC) will apply, and where the conditions in the Special Conditions of Contract (SCC) contradict the conditions in the General Conditions of Contract, the Special Conditions of Contract will prevail.
- 1.23 The winning bidder will be required to complete and sign the following
- 1.23.1 Vetted agreement and/or
- 1.23.2 An official contract form SDB7.1 for the purchase of goods/works
- 1.23.3 An official contract form SDB7.2 for rendering of services

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1.23.4 An official contract form SDB7.3 for the sale of goods/works

1.25 The MLRF reserves the right not to award the RFQ.

1.26.2 If there is no longer a requirement for the items or services to be procured,

1.26.3 If no acceptable tender has been received,

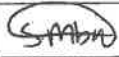
1.26.4 If irregularities have occurred in the procurement process.

TERMS OF REFERENCE

TO APPOINT A CONTRACTOR (SP) TO PROVIDE THE DEPARTMENT OF FORESTRY, FISHERIES AND THE ENVIRONMENT (DFFE) / MARINE LIVING RESOURCES FUND (MLRF) FOR THE DECOMMISSIONING OF THE OLD AIRCOOLING SYSTEM IN THE SERVER ROOM AND SUPPLY, DELIVERY, INSTALLATION AND MAINTENANCE OF AIRCONDITIONERS FOR A PERIOD OF THIRTY-SIX MONTHS.

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1. PURPOSE

The Department of Forestry, Fisheries and the Environment ("DFFE") / MLRF requires the services of a Contractor to decommission the old cooling system, supply, deliver, install and maintenance of air conditioners in the server room on the seventh floor at Foretrust Building for a period of thirty-six months.

2. SPECIFICATIONS

PART A DECOMMISSIONING SERVICES

OBJECTIVE

THE PURPOSE OF THIS DECOMMISSIONING IS TO SAFELY AND EFFICIENTLY REMOVE THE EXISTING AIR-CONDITIONING UNITS WHILE ENSURING MINIMAL DISRUPTION TO INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY (IT) OPERATIONS AND COMPLIANCE WITH ENVIRONMENTAL REGULATIONS.

Detailed description of the goods and services:

- Decommissioning of the air-cooling system in the server room with a total of two (2) air conditioners units.
- Supplier to deliver and install four (4) Alliance or similar 60000 BTU 16 KW inverter air-conditioning system and to include a three (3) year maintenance plan.
- The service provider must specify the expected noise levels during the installation process to ensure that operations on the affected floor are not disrupted.
- The air conditioning area requiring assessment is approximately 20 m² in size.
- The service provider is required to provide a detailed method statement outlining the procedures for the safe and compliant disposal of all waste and decommissioned equipment.

PART B Power Isolation & System Shutdown

- Confirm alternative cooling system is operational.
- Disconnect unit from the power supply at the distribution board.
- Follow Lockout/Tagout (LOTO) procedures to prevent accidental reactivation.

Refrigerant Recovery

- Connect the refrigerant recovery unit to the system.
- Extract refrigerant into an approved storage cylinder.
- Weigh and document the recovered refrigerant for disposal.
- Seal refrigerant lines to prevent leaks.

Dismantling & Removal

- Disconnect electrical wiring and label components.
- Unmount the indoor unit (evaporator) and secure refrigerant lines.
- Remove the outdoor unit (compressor/condenser) using lifting equipment if necessary.
- Ensure proper handling to prevent coil and component damage.

Refrigerant Disposal

- Transport recovered refrigerant to a certified hazardous waste facility.
- Obtain disposal certificate for compliance records.

Installation Requirements

- The installation should be carried out in accordance with the following guidelines:
Electrical & Power Requirements:
 - Installation of dedicated electrical circuits for each unit, as per manufacturer requirements
 - Connection to an isolated power supply with surge protection
 - Provision of a Certificate of Compliance (COC) by a licensed electrician
- The appointed contractor must maintain records and documentation demonstrating compliance with **SANS 10142** for all electrical work conducted under this contract. Records must be available for inspection by DFFE or appointed auditors at any time.

Mounting & Positioning:

- Indoor units must be securely mounted on the ceiling using approved mounting brackets
- Outdoor units must be installed on a concrete base or vibration-isolated mounting brackets
- Adequate spacing and clearance for airflow must be maintained as per manufacturer guidelines

Refrigerant Piping & Insulation:

- Installation of copper piping with appropriate insulation for efficiency and condensation prevention
- Pressure testing of refrigerant lines before system startup
- Leak detection and proper sealing of all joints

Drainage System:

- Proper installation of condensate drainage pipes to prevent water accumulation
- Ensuring proper gradient for smooth water flow

Ventilation & Airflow Considerations:

- Placement of indoor units to allow uniform air distribution
- No obstruction to airflow around outdoor units

Warranty and Maintenance

Warranty Period: Minimum 12-month warranty on installation and workmanship

Preventative Maintenance Schedule/Services

- Provide a three-year maintenance plan with warranty/ guarantee, describing what is covered.
- Quarterly Servicing consisting of:
 - Two (2) Major and,
 - Two (2) Minor services
- In the event of a breakdown the response time should be clearly defined. Recommended response based on urgency.
- The service provider must clearly specify the applicable call-out fee rate as part of their proposal.

2.2. PHASE 2: TECHNICAL AND FUNCTIONALITY REQUIREMENTS

2.2.1. Only bid proposals that meets pre-qualification will be evaluated on functionality and technical criteria,

2.2.2. The contractor must score a minimum average of 70% during Phase 2 (functionality / technical) of the evaluation to qualify for Phase 3 of the evaluation will be considered. Should a contractor score less than 70% on functionality criteria, the contractor will be disqualified.

2.3. PHASE 3: Preferential Points (80/20 system)

- 2.3.1. An evaluation of Price and Specific Goals Preference points on the suppliers, that successful qualified to this stage of evaluation.
- 2.3.2. **Calculation of points for price** - The Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act (PPPFA) prescribes that the lowest acceptable bid will score 80 points (for tenders under R50m) or 90 points (for tenders above R50m) for price. Suppliers that quoted higher prices will score lower points for price on a pro-rata basis. Where functionality is set as criteria, only bid proposals that meets functionality requirements will be considered for evaluation on price and specific goals preference points.
- 2.3.3. The 80/20 as an appropriate preference point system will be used in the evaluation and adjudication of this quote. However, it must be extended that the lowest acceptable quote will be used to determine the applicable preference point system as per regulation (Section 3(2)(b) of the Preferential Procurement Regulations (PPR) 2022, which states: "If it is unclear which preference point system will be applicable, that either the 80/20 or 90/10 preference point system will apply and that the lowest acceptable proposal will be used to determine the applicable preference point system". Therefore, either 80 or 90 points, depending on the rand value of the proposal, will be awarded to the suppliers who offers the lowest price, and proportionately fewer points are awarded to those with higher prices. Either 20 or 10 points are then available as preference points for Specific Goals, as applicable. The contract will be awarded to the suppliers that scores the highest total number of adjudication points per category.

Calculating of points for Specific Goals

- 2.3.4. Points will be awarded to a supplier for specific goals. Contractors are required to submit the original and valid proof for preference points claimed or certified copies thereof; to substantiate their preference points claims. SBD 6.1 must also be duly completed, signed, and submitted alongside the bid to claim preference points. Failure to do so will result in Specific Goals preference points being forfeited.
- 2.3.5. The 80/20 as an appropriate preference point system will be used in the evaluation and adjudication of this quotation. However, it must be extended that the lowest acceptable supplier will be used to determine the applicable preference point system as per regulation (Section 3(2)(b) of the Preferential Procurement Regulations (PPR) 2022, which states: "If it is unclear which preference

point system will be applicable, that either the 80/20 or 90/10 preference point system will apply and that the lowest acceptable supplier will be used to determine the applicable preference point system". Therefore, either 80 or 90 points, depending on the rand value of the quotation, will be awarded to the suppliers who offers the lowest price, and proportionately fewer points are awarded to those with higher prices. Either 20 or 10 points are then available as preference points for specific goals, as applicable. The contract will be awarded to the suppliers that scores the highest total number of adjudication points per category.

2.3.6. Points will be awarded to a supplier for specific goals in accordance with the table below:

- 2.3.7. The SCM unit of the DFFE / MLRF will allocate preferential points (Specific Goals) to each company for its contribution towards empowerment of the black designated groups as prescribed in the Preferential Procurement Regulations of 2022, women, people with disabilities, youth as well as local economic development.
- 2.3.8. A supplier will not be disqualified from the quotation process if the suppliers does not submit supporting documents substantiating the specific goals preference points claimed or is a non-compliant contributor. Such some suppliers will score 0 for Specific Goals.
- 2.3.9. Suppliers will be subject to SCM conditions of the Department – MLRF and the Preferential Procurement Regulations, 2022 issued in terms of section 5 of the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act (Act No 5 of 2000) (PPPFA).
- 2.3.10. The PPPFA prescribes that the lowest acceptable bid will score 80 or 90 points for price (as explained above, depending on whether the bid prices is more or less than R50million). Suppliers that quoted higher prices will score lower points for price on a pro-rata basis. Where functionality is set as a criterion, only bid proposals that meets functionality requirements will be considered to be evaluated on price and Specific Goals.

2.3.11. The contract will be awarded to the supplier scoring the highest points subject to section 2(1) (f) of the PPPFA, 2000.

4. SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS

4.1 Suppliers should ensure that the following submission requirements, which will be needed for evaluation purposes are included in their bid proposal and are as follows:

4.1.1 The SP must draft a table of content which will indicate where each document is located in the proposal.

4.1.2 The proposal shall consist of two parts, namely the technical bid and the pricing bid (master and copies).

4.1.3 Add documents that are required to be submitted with the bids. These documents include those included in phase one (1) and two (2) of evaluation criteria.

4.1.4 Standard bidding documents (SBD1, 2, 3.1/3.3, 4, 6.1) completed and signed.
