1. TECHNICAL SPECIFICATION

1.1. Brief Description

The RFQ aims to procure a competent specialist to manufacture/ produce and install sculptures at the University of Limpopo as part of the Resistance Liberation and Heritage Route projects. The site has already been identified on the campus.

The 13 sculptures will be a realistic visual representation of **13 Traditional Leaders** that held a lekgotla under the Fig Tree on the **11th of October 1956** where an agreement and pledges were made towards the formation of what is now known as the **University of Limpopo**

1.2. Project Location:

The proposed site is found inside the University of Limpopo near the existing golf course.

The University is about 31 km east - northeast of Polokwane city on the R71,
