1. PROJECT BACKGROUND

LNW seeks to appoint a professional service provider to render service on electric motor efficiency tests at various schemes of Lepelle Northern Water. All safety protocols and OHS general construction works shall be adhered to at all times in line with the Departments of Health and Labour of the Republic of South Africa regulations.

2. SCOPE OF WORKS

The scope of works for the appointed contractor includes, but is not limited to the following:

Perform MCE testing for quality assurance, trending, and diagnostic troubleshooting.

Measure the following characteristics:

a) Resistance-to-ground (RTG)

Temperature-corrected RTG tests the ground wall insulation of the motor and circuit cables, indicating the condition of the insulation.

b) Capacitance-to-ground (CTG)

CTG is an indicator of the motor cleanliness, identifying contamination buildup on the insulation.

c) Phase-to-phase resistance

Phase-to-phase resistance tests the circuit and the stator coils for resistance, calculates resistance imbalance, and indicates when these imbalances are unsatisfactory.

High resistance imbalances indicate hot spots, high resistance connections, or coil shorting in the stator.

d) Phase-to-phase inductance

Phase–to–phase inductance tests the circuit, stator coil, iron, and rotor components for inductive imbalances and indicates when these imbalances are unsatisfactory.

High inductive imbalances indicate winding faults and rotor defects.

e) Polarization Index (PI)

A Polarization index (PI) test is performed. A PI ratio is calculated and a profile of RTG vs., time is plotted. The PI test is a more comprehensive test and gives much more information.

The profiles developed can be used to determine the condition of the motors insulation system.

f) Rotor Influence Check (RIC)

The RIC is performed to isolate problems to either the rotor or stator in a motor. As the rotor is turned incrementally by hand, a plot of its influence on the stator coils is developed using inductance.

Motor analysis consists of:

- a) Capacitor Test
- b) Ground Test
- c) Winding Test
- d) Full Pl Test

Service providers are to submit a detailed report with recommendations on each motor tested.

3. MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS

a) Qualification in Electrical Engineering. (Minimum Electrician artisan or BTech electrical engineering).

1.5 Failure on the part of a tenderer to submit proof or documentation required in terms of this tender to claim points for specific goals with the tender, will be interpreted to mean that preference points for specific goals are not claimed.

1.6 The organ of state reserves the right to require of a tenderer, either before a tender is adjudicated or at any time subsequently, to substantiate any claim in regard to preferences, in any manner required by the organ of state.

2. DEFINITIONS

- (a) "tender" means a written offer in the form determined by an organ of state in response to an invitation to provide goods or services through price quotations, competitive tendering process or any other method envisaged in legislation;
- (b) "price" means an amount of money tendered for goods or services, and includes all applicable taxes less all unconditional discounts;
- (c) "rand value" means the total estimated value of a contract in Rand, calculated at the time of bid invitation, and includes all applicable taxes;
- (d) "tender for income-generating contracts" means a written offer in the form determined by an organ of state in response to an invitation for the origination of income-generating contracts through any method envisaged in legislation that will result in a legal agreement between the organ of state and a third party that produces revenue for the organ of state, and includes, but is not limited to, leasing and disposal of assets and concession contracts, excluding direct sales and disposal of assets through public auctions; and
- (e) "the Act" means the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act, 2000 (Act No. 5 of 2000).

4. POINTS AWARDED FOR SPECIFIC GOALS

- 4.1. In terms of Regulation 4(2); 5(2); 6(2) and 7(2) of the Preferential Procurement Regulations, preference points must be awarded for specific goals stated in the tender. For the purposes of this tender the tenderer will be allocated points based on the goals stated in table 1 below as may be supported by proof/ documentation stated in the conditions of this tender:
- 4.2. In cases where organs of state intend to use Regulation 3(2) of the Regulations, which states that, if it is unclear whether the 80/20 or 90/10 preference point system applies, an organ of state must, in the tender documents, stipulate in the case of—
